- Great Horned Owl 1 Large fledgling, downy but w/
feathered wings, Black Hawk Lake S.P., July 12.
- Burrowing Owl - 1 July 12 Seen by Ann Bunker at
the location ~~to~~ west of Payne Junction, Fremont Co.
- Willow Flycatcher - At least one song at Willow Slough this year
- Barn Swallow - I shall have to review nest records from
previous years but I think first clutches were very small
this year (3; some 4 eggs, vs. 5 ~~to~~ in ~~to~~ previous years).
Fly population in our lots & house noticeably low this
year only - no doubt related to low egg #s. Second
clutch more normal. Fly population unfortunately normal
too. Cause of ~~the~~ low fly population may be weather;
it isn't fly spray, that's certain.

Chickadee, Titmouse, E. Kingbird, Robin, Purple Martin, Cardinal,
