BURROWING OWL

Fremont County Iowa near Payne Junction

Description:

(Of one seen June 18)

A smallish owl. Generally buffy colored with no ears and long gray legs. Yellow eyes. Underparts whitish barred with buffy brown. Back and wings also tan with white splotches. The crown was buffy with white speckling. White "eyebrows" and a black area under the chin.

Behavior: Stood by burrow in soy bean field. Flew up and circled field twice. On July 1 two were seen approximately one mile from the original soy bean field. At this time, one was sitting on powerline and the other on a road sign.

Distance: To one near road: 25'
 To one in soy bean field: 200'
