Once again Fall is upon us. As the temperature begins to cool down and the days grow shorter millions of migrating birds start their annual migration south for the long winter. Lately I've been seeing alot of migratory birds at both Slip Bluff and Little River Lake. Large flocks of blackbirds, geese and ducks are a common sight. Our goose population at Slip Bluff has swollen to about 40-50 birds. I suspect most of these birds are ones that we've raised

Last week I saw an interesting sight while at Little River Lake. I noticed a large number of birds circling over a field near our maintenance building. At first glance I thought they were Turkey Vultures, but when I looked through the binoculars I saw that they were Broad-winged Hawks. Broad-winged hawks are common residents of Decatur County and Iowa. They are very secretive birds that live in wooded areas. Broad-winged hawks are generally solitary birds except during migration when they form large flocks. Many times these flocks may contain several hundred birds. The flock I saw had about 35-40 birds in it. Although the flock I saw was small in comparison to these larger flocks, none the less it was interesting to watch.
