A Rush letter and Field Reports - didn't have time to do before vacation - hence the handwritten copy and strange post-mark

Also, just figured out I left the Canada Warbler documentation in Keeleek - will send as soon as I get back circa the 15th. Will give basics now -

1st spotted by James Huntington about 9:30 AM on June 28, 1987. Distance about 25 Ft. Viewing conditions excellent. Bird silent.

Bird had blue-gray (almost steel) gray back, eye-ring, indistinct spectacles. Most notable were the gray vertical streaks on breast - the neck ^{yellow} - necklace. These were apparent and obvious, but not as black and heavy as on breeding ♂ - presumably ~~this~~ this was a well-marked female. Peterson (1980) perfectly perfectly described habitat bird was in - forest undergrowth - shady thicket.

Not seen again, although I looked.
