

ALL REPORTS FROM CUSF --BANDED BY JOHNSON'S

- #465 Acadian Flycatcher: 1st on May 12, peak of 3 May 20. Total of 9 banded
- #749 R.C. Kinglet: Last banded May 13.
- #704 Gray Catbird: 76 banded between May 4 and May 17. Total of 81 banded.
- #631 White-eyed Vireo: 1st Ap. 26, Peak of 3 May 5. Total of 10 banded.
- #641 Blue-winged Warbler: 1st Ap. 20 (already reported); Peaks of 4 on May 6 and 9; total of 35 banded. I should add that all but four of these were caught in is a single area of prime habitat that makes up perhaps 25% of the prime habitat at CUSF.
- #642 Golden-winged Warbler: 1st Ap. 28; 10 caught May 7, 8, 9. Total of 20 banded.
- #647 Tennessee Warbler: 90 caught from May 7 to May 13. Total of 106 banded.
- #645 Nashville Warbler: First 2 on Ap. 20. Peak of 16 May 7. Total 107 banded.
- #659 Chestnut-sided Warbler: Peak of 6 on May 20. Total of 23 banded.
- #657 Magnolia Warbler: First 2 on May 4. Peaks of 4 on May 8, 10. Total of 23 banded.
- #658 Cerulean Wabler: Three banded May 13 -- that's all. See Iowa Birds
- #639 Worm-eating Warb.: One and only on May 9.
- #677 Kentucky Warbler: First May 6. Eight caught May 9 thru 12. Total of 15 banded.
- #679 Mourning Warbler: 11 banded on May 20. Total of 19 banded.
- #681 Common Yellowthroat: Total of 45 banded.
- #684 Hooded Warbler: Only one--May 18 (a female)
- #686 Canada Warbler: Peak of 5 on May 20.
- #683 Yellow-breasted Chat: Total of 7 banded.
- #598 Indigo Bunting: 58 caught May 10 thru 15. Total of 90 banded.
- #563 Field Sparrow: 25 banded in April, 47 in May, for a total of 72.
- #583 Lincoln's Sparrow: 10 banded during May.
- #558 White-throated Sparrow: Peak of 11 Ap. 27. Total of 61 banded.
- #507 Northern Oriole: Peak of 6 on May 11.
