Our neighborhood has received almost no significant rainfall during June and July, our two rainiest months in normal times. We have experienced perhaps the worst drought in recorded history with above normal temperatures.

Habitat Report:

More upland habitat available due to theagricultural Conservation Reserve Program. Many intermittent streams in our area have been dry during the Summer period with shallow ponds also nearly dry. The old gravel pit in Tama is providing some excellent mud flat habitat at this time. Iowa River has many exposed sand bars. The Otter Creek Marsh has lower than normal levels.
