- ③ Include Alleman - it doesn't refer to An Birds. I don't believe it even fits into a 15 mi diameter circle! Perhaps the Sayville center will cause Mosmans to discontinue.
- ④ Participant lists Trustate + Lost Nation attached.
- ⑤ Originals of documentation attached - sorry I goofed.
- ⑥ Comments on species doc/acceptance -
 - (a) Trumpeter - little or no doc (attached) - perhaps Recs Comm should look at treatment of unmarked birds migrating away from + back to Minnesota breeding area.
