Weather.

March. temperature 10 degrees below the noomals. 8.8 in snow & 2.3 in of rain for total 5.35 with snow on ground most of the month.

The winter-like March delayed arrivals of early migrants until the end of the month, with the first big duck flight Mch.31 (5000 mallards, 1000 pintail, 40 canvasback, and others). On April 2 still more ducks showed up but the pintails soon moved on and the later ducks moved through without much of a build-up. The usual arrivals of March did not show up until the first of April

April, too, was slow with only the common blackbirds and meadow larks in numbers.

May 1 produced the first large flocks of yellow-legs and pectorals, while no peeps were seen until May 18 (mostly least and semiplamated)

A mild wave of warblers on May 4 with variety but not numbers and again on May 8. Again only one or two of each species and there was a noticeable lack of numbers of myrtle warblers. But not of Tennessee warblers. Must have been ten times as many as all other warblers together.

More of ----Flickers, red-heads, redwings, goldfinches, and in town of robins.

Fewer of -- Shrikes, kingbirds, myrtle warblers, and all warblers, and migrating hawks.
