Dec. about average temperature but lows were 2.6 below . 6 days below zero with Pecipitation -. 82 in. - 20 on Dec. 26 Jan. weather records not available until Feb. 2 but guess yours will do. A bit cold.

The bird population of the winter was about a normal expectation but for the large (huge) population at a roost area of evergreens just west of the haspitals. The bulk of the birds were starlings and sparrows but for a marked group of Grackles and Cowbirds which have persisted all winter. (See Xmas Count- 1.C.) During Dec. there were a number of Browers Blackbirds, but these have not been seen recently. The Museum staff have been making collections from this concentration and have collected 2 Red-wings. Local paper carried an article about farmers complaining about numbers of starlings.

There seem to be more Tree Sparrows this year (1000 last Sat.) more Flickers (3 or 4 per trip) fewer Neadowlarks (only twice this winter and then only 2) Hawks and Owls about normal. Maybe fewer Long-ears but a half a dozen Short-ears where there were none last winter. An occasional Purple Finch.

Townspeople complain a fewer birds at feeders (maybe too many feederss?)
