Magnificent Frigatebird-one seen at Clear Lake on 25 Sept (see documentation)

Black-bellied Plover--2 at Big Creek Lake on 19 November. Birds were flushed and black armpits were seen. (with M and B Proescholdt) record late date

Lesser Yellowlegs—one at Big Creek Lake on 19 November (with M and B Froescholdt) record late date Bird seen well and long yellow legs, thin, straight bill, active feeding behavior, and size all noted

Dunlin--two at Big Creek Lake on 19 November (with M and B Proescholdt). size; long, heavy slightly curved bill noted

Red Phalarope--one seen at Saylorville on 3 October (documentation)

Pomarine Jaeger--one seen at Saylorville on 27 Sept. I didn't see bird well enough to document.

American Crow—the roost on ISU campus was well formed by mid November and probably had 3000 to 5000 birds. Seemed to be larger than normal.

Gray Catbird--one was seen well on 6 November in Ames. Gray body, black crown, and rusty under tail all noted.
