

1989 Spring Field Report - Robert K. Myers

Details of observations:

Yellow rail - (20 May) - I saw the white patches on the inner trailing edge of the wings.

King rail - (6 + 8 May) - This was a very large reddish-brown rail much much too large to be a Virginia Rail. It was about teal size.

Marbled Godwit (29 Apr) - The main mark was the tan (not white) rumps on these godwits.

Western Sandpiper - (4 May) - On at least 3 birds we could see reddish ear and shoulder patches. Breasts were white with fine dark streaks on upper breast. Legs were dark. Did not have white rumps.

Common Tern - (4 May) - These birds showed very dark (blackish) primaries both top and bottom.

Alder Flycatcher - <sup>(21 May)</sup> fee-bee-o song

Sharp-tailed Sparrow - (22 May) -

Main ID marks I saw were orangish upper breast and sides of head. Breast with fine streaks. Face with dark ear patch. Dark & crown with gray (not white) stripe thru center. Grayish collar. White streaks on back. Overall they appear bigger and darker than LeConte's.
