It was an interesting summer; wet then dry. Moesby Prairie was the interesting spot with the lake so high. That is until about 7/7 when it went bone dry. But it makes me wonder what a central Iowa wetland would be like.

P. B. Grouse - one present on 6/11 at Moesby

Cormorant - 1 at Sycamore 6/2

Heron, GB - I counted 45 nests on 7/14, after the water receded. At least 3 large cottonwoods were nearly denuded this year. Most nests were empty by then.

Egret, Great - As early as 6/2 I noted Egrets going in & out of the colony. Six were seen on 6/11. See Steve's report for confirmed nesting activity. I found no nests by 7/14

Tern, B.W - On 6/2 8 male & 2 female tail were seen at various perches locations. On 6/27, 6 male & 2 female were still at Moesby.

Tern, GW - 2 (1M, 1F) at Moesby on 6/27

Shoveler - At least 4 M & 2 F were at Moesby until 6/11

Ruddy Duck - A female at Moesby on 6/27

Coot - 1 at Moesby on 6/27

Upland Sandpiper - At least 1 pair at Moesby throughout the period

Laughing Gull - see attached

Black Tern - 1 at Moesby on 6/11

Pileated Woodpecker - 1 at Sycamore Creek on 6/2

Phoebe - 2 pairs along Sycamore Creek on 7/21

Cliff Swallow - colony size seemed down at several Sycamore locations

Bell's Vireo - 9 (nine) in the Shellebelle at Big Creek on 6/2

V.T. Vireo - 2 at Sycamore across 6/2

Yellow Warbler - 12 on 6/2 in the Shellebelle

Yellow-throated Warbler - 2 singing at Sycamore on 6/2

Chat, Y.B - 1 on 6/2 at Big Creek

Because of high water, I did not get to the areas
I usually find Cooper's Hawk, Lincoln Warbler, Prothonotary
Warbler, and Scott, Vireo, Wood Thrush, Scarlet Tanager,
Dawnbird.
