Dear Tom,

A cool, late spring. Soyborilla broke up so late, that the ducks seemed to come & go in one week. Shorebirds were almost non-existent, & others were a three week trickle with no "waves". Reports are from the Soyborilla area unless otherwise noted.

- ✓ G. Loon: Max of 7 on 4/10
 - ✓ Eared Grebe: 3 on the IPTV pond on 3/30
 - ✓ Pelican: Max. of 2742 on 4/17, at Big Creek
 - ✓ P.C. Cormorant: Max of 514 on 4/27
 - ✓ A. Egret: first on 4/3
 - ✓ Cattle Egret: 14 at Moesly Prairie on 5/18; at least 3 still present on 5/29
 - ✓ Shoveler: Max. of 255 on 4/16
Greater Scaup: 12 on IPTV on 3/26
 - ✓ Bufflehead: Max of 61 on 4/1
 - ✓ R.B. Merganser: Max of 148 on 4/3
 - ✓ Osprey: one on 3/20 was a bit early
 - ✓ S. Eagle: High water prevented good access to the lake, so I had a high count of only 28 on 3/13
 - ✓ Broad-winged Hawk - Max of 9 on 4/27
 - ✓ Swainson's Hawk - one was chasing (and caught) a Killdeer in flooded land below Soyborilla on 5/2
 - ✓ Merlin - one on 3/13
- Piping Plover - flooded beaches at Sandpiper & Oak Grove precluded my finding this regular
- Avocet - 12 at Big Creek on 4/17

- ✓ Willet - 1 on 4/27
- ✓ Upland Sandpiper - back at Moesly (3) by 5/8
- ✓ Hudsonian Godwit - only 1 on 5/15
- ✓ Laughing Gull - one was with Franklin's on 4/24. Adult plumage, white tail, no white on wing tips, small eye ring, large bill in side-by-side comparison, reddish/black bill. appeared injured = drooping leg, though did fly. for flooded bottom land below the dam.
- ✓ Bonaparte's Gull - Max of 45 on 4/30, in some areas
- ✓ Caspian Tern - one was a bit early on 5/1
- ✓ Long-eared Owl - one was still present on 4/3
Carolina Wren - one that had been singing vigorously in our yard, abruptly disappeared the end of March.
- ✓ Fox Sparrow - Max of 42 on 4/3
