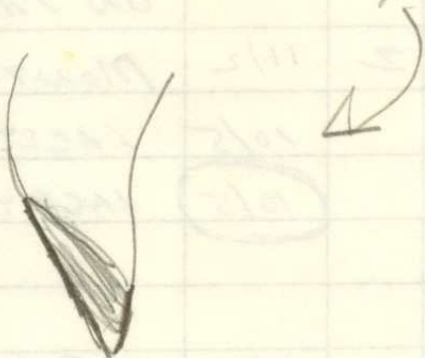

standing - tucked in wing tips (primary) -  
extended part tail. ent.  
dark  
to black

upper wing on flying - outer primary black  
forming a ledge shape to leading  
edge and trailing edge dark.



under wing - leading and trailing  
edge of primary quite pronounced.

(adult plumage?)
