Dear Jim,

Obviously, a strange summer. The water kept me out of many Saylorville areas. It could have been a great year for Moistly Prairie, but there was a brief period when most of it dried up in June, then it refilled. All notes from Saylorville, unless otherwise noted.

Grebe, P.b.: 2 adults seen on Moistly 7/18 on. I have seen young one here in past years

Pelican, W: 44 on 6/14, 62 on 7/31

Cormorant, DC: 1 on 6/14 and 7/25

Heron, GB: the colony was active. I counted only 28 active nests on 6/14, but I saw no increase in the summer.

Egret, G: present throughout the period just East & South of the heron colony. For example, 13 on July 5. I could not find any nests, however, on 6/14. Up to 26 on 7/31.

Egret, cattle: present throughout at Moistly. Lowest number 7 on 7/18, up to 62 by 7/31. Again, I could find no nesting.

Goose, Snow - the Blue phase goose seems to be a permanent resident at IPTU ponds

Teal, bw - 2 males at Moistly on 6/5

Teal, BW - at least 4 pairs and one brood of 8 at Moistly on 7/5

Merganser, Hooded - 2 females passed briefly at Moistly on 7/5

Hawk, B-W - I was carrying a snake near the Heron colony on 6/14. I have seen this species occasionally, but not consistently in June near Saylorville

Hawk, Coopers — a new nesting site NW of Foster Park.

The old site near Lebecnia seems abandoned.

Plover, L. Gull — one north of Mocobly on 6/5 was still in winter plumage

Yellow-leg, ♂ - 3 were calling repeatedly on 7/25 at Mocobly

Sandpiper, Upland — regular at Mocobly

Gull, Ring-bill — a few present throughout, usually around flood-waters

Gull, Franklin's — one on 6/14

Tern, Caspian — 3 adults in floodwaters below town on 7/5

Tern, Black — 15 at Mocobly on 6/14, 11 on 7/25

Cuckoos — yellow-bills seem common, black-bills absent

Hummingbird — 2 in woods west of the lake on 6/14

Wren, Carolina — the one present in our yard last $1\frac{1}{2}$ yrs, abruptly disappeared in the spring & did not return

Wren, Marsh — 2 at Mocobly on 7/31

Wren, Sedge — abundant throughout the area

Thrush, Wood — I did find one this year on the wet side of the lake, plus I sang all summer just south of our house

Batcatcher — seem common now (3 pairs on 6/14)

Shrike, L — 1 pair N. of the lake, a pair with at least 1 juvenile N. of Mocobly

Vireo, Bell's — harder to find this year in Shellebills (2 on 6/14)

Vireo, Yellow-th — 1 in our yard off & on throughout

Vireo, Warbling — 2 on 6/15 west of lake

Warbler, Pr. Throatery — could not find on my one trip to heron colony

Warbler, Cerulean — 2 singing in colony W. side of lake

Warbler, Hooded — 1 was singing in our neighborhood on 6/7, 6/20 and finally I glimpsed a male on 6/27. This is only a few miles up a tributary of the Roanoke river from Brown's Woods where they have been found before.

Ovenbird — 5 on 6/14
