Dear Tom,

I haven't contributed much to field reports in recent years, partly because I haven't been out much but partly because I keep forgetting at the apropriate time. Therefore, I've decided to write up the current sightings, few though they are, plus som earlier sightings I never sent, and mail them off to you now. You'll get another note if something more shows up that's interesting.

Fall was unseasonably warm until the ice storm of Oct. 31. I measured some very thin twigs encased in 1.5" of ice (diameter of a cylinder of ice) but a bit less was more common; 5/8" built up on one side of s branch. Siberian Elms, a brittle species anyway, still had leaves. They broke up so badly our windbreak looks like it's been shelled. While other species (except Silver Maples) withstood the ice better, all species suffered some losses of limbs. An open-growth Bur Oak in our neighborhood split right to the ground. Immediate losses of birds may not have been high, but ice encased food sources, so birds had to visit dangerous places -- see Longspurs in the report.

Loss of tree cavities may have long-term consequences. I know a dazed squirrel in our yard survived its thick branch splitting right through its cavity home, and many other branches probably broke right at such weakened spots. Of course, brush piles are now abundant, a partial compensation at least as far as winter roosting goes.
