October weather, temperatures below normal

The weather in Iowa this month was just a bit cooler and just a bit dryer than the norm, according to state climatologist Harry Hillaker.

Hillaker said temperatures throughout the state averaged 1 to 1½ degrees below normal, making October the seventh straight month with below-average temperatures.

Most of the state also received below-normal rainfall, although heavy rains in western Iowa brought the statewide average up.

Rainfall in eastern and central parts of the state was well below normal, Hillaker said, which was helpfultto farmers harvesting their fall crops.

In Des Moines, there had only been 1.59 inches of rain as of Friday afternoon, while the monthly average for October is 2.30 inches, Hillaker said.

But Hillaker also said precipitation patterns for the year as a whole have been extremely close to normal.

He estimated temperatures this month will average around 51 degrees. The average for October is usually around 52 degrees. But Hillaker said the average temperature so far this year of 52.1 degrees is slightly above the norm of 51.7 degrees, largely because of the extremely mild first three months of the year.
