Note: In a conversation with Barry Christiansen, refuge manager at Union Slough NWR, he indicated that the storm on 24-25 March caused considerable mortality of birds in his area. That storm involved only a few inches of snow but high winds (40 mph+) and temp in the 10 degree range, led to mortality of waterfowl that had moved north and then the ponds they occupied refroze as well as small birds. He especially noted lots of dead coots, diving ducks such as Lesser Scaup, and robins. He thought the mortality could easily run into thousands of birds. Note: There was a big wave of warblers and other migrants that appeared in Ames the night of 15-16 May. I got a number of reports of many birds in yards and birds seemed to be all over. There was also a small kill of birds at a low tower west of Ames (Pat Schlarbaum) The following are observations by Gordon Brown (Raleigh, NC) and George Brown (Ames). Both are good birders and have reported sightings before. Gordon was visiting this week and the two of them did a lot of birding in the time.
