I HEARD THERE WERE DOZENS - HUNDREDS, EVEN, AT SPRINGBROOK AND A LITTLE PARK CALLED ROBINSON'S ACRES NEAR MAXWELL, AND MARK AND BETH HAD THOUSANDS? AT GRAMMER GROVE. GROSBEAKS AND ORIOLES SEEMED DESPERATE FOR FOOD WHEN THEY FINALLY GOT HERE.

ONE FEMALE GROSBEAK WAS QUITE BUFFY ORANGE AND ONE HAD A CLEAR CENTER BREAST WITH FINE STREAKS ON THE SIDES. MALES WERE ALL OBVIOUSLY ROSE-BREASTED, BUT IN SEVERAL PLUMAGES.
