The spring started dry but cool, then wet and cool at the time the warblers normally come through. This appears to that delayed the migration through Iowa. The first and last sitings were later than usual.

The Carolina Wren again suscessfully overwintered in Lamb's Grove.

I received reports of 20 Black-billed Magpies at the Whitebreast unit of Stephens forrest on May 19. They accurately described the bird in size and markings i.e. Large, bold black and white pattern. Larger than a dove and smaller than a crow. Were in a large meadow area of the unit. Said, dos nately not a Bobaluk much larger.
