Since this species is on the Blue List I have two reports of interest: Jim Malkowski, Director of Fontenelle Forest Nature Center was driving north on I-29 Sept. 29; at about 9:30 a.m. wave after wave of White Pelican flew over migrating. south. The birds were flying fairly low in their "V" formation and he was able to count 600.

(100+) Seen at Forney's Lake, Mills Co. on Sept. 9 by Ruth Green

An uncommon migrant. (3) DeSoto Bend Refuge Nov. 13 MM, CN

(2) Nov. 14 DeSoto Bend Refuge MW,MH Occasionally appearing in the area.

Uncommon winter visitant. (1) Nov. 14 DeSoto Bend Refuge MW,MH

An occasional winter visitor (1) seen several times during the week of Nov. 5. RS

Occasional migrant and winter visitor in Missouri River Valley Region. (12) 7males, 5 fémales Nov. 3 DeSoto Bend Refuge MW, RG

Uncommon in this area (3) Nov.13 DeSoto Bend Refuge MM, CN

(40) Counted at the DeSoto Bend Refuge while on a field trip with an Omaha nature club. Nov.17 RG

Considered an uncommon spring migrant on the Missouri River. (15) Lake Manawa Oct. 16 MP Barn Swallow

Thousands were seen at Lake Manawa Octl6 where they must have stopped to rest and feed during their migration.

Kentucky Warbler

Area around Bellevue, Nebr. and Council Bluffs considered the northern limit for this species. (1) Council Bluffs Aug. 30 JG

Vesper Sparrow

Early Fall sighting (15) Council Bluffs Aug. 30 JG
