SPRING MIGRATION REPORT

MIDDLEWESTERN PRAIRE REGION

Council Bluffs, Iowa Area

(Part of the Omaha Metropolitan Area)

The Council Bluffs area covered by this report centers on Council Bluffs, Iowa and extends north and south along the Missouri River Valley approximately twenty miles. This area from the Missouri River is flat bottom land and extends east to the high bluffs that overlook the river valley. Outside of the Council Bluffs, urban area, most of the land is cultivated. Several lakes in the area were formed years ago by the meandering Missouri River. These ox-bow lakes are located close to the river which has now been stabilized by government river projects.

The largest lake in the area is Lake Mannawa. This lake covers about 1100 acres. The Northwest, North, and Eastern shores are developed with residential and commercial buildings.

An interesting area that has developed over the few years is a small marsh located southwest of the Council Bluffs residential district. The marsh is located next to a beef packers parking lot.

Before this packing company was built the land was a low wet area.

"Fill dirt" from this area was used in building the plant. Over the

last few years with average or above rainfall this depression has

grown into a fine marsh, and an excellent feeding and rest place for birds.

The weather in the Omaha, Nebraska/Council Bluffs, Iowa metropolitan area from April 1, 1972 to April 30, 1972 was cooler than average by -0.5°. Blowing snow on April third amounted to 1.5". Fourteen days morning fog was reported. Five clear days, eight partly cloudy days, and seventeen cloudy days were reported for the month. From April fifthteenth through April thirtieth, five thunderstorms moved through the area.

May was cooler than normal with average temperature of 62.7..; a departure of -0.06. from the normal. Precipitation for the month was 5.13". This was 1.65" above normal. The greatest amount for a twenty-four hour period occurred during the first week. There eight clear days, five partly cloudy days, and eighteen cloudy days. The month was the second wettest in the past seven years.
