I have 2 items to report that may be of interest
to you.

On August 20, 1994, 2 young Turkey Vultures
left their nest in the hay now of our older farm and
that day began walking, hopping, climbing, and
trying their wings. My son James GillSpey got
several very good pictures of them in different activities.

We are wondering how many pairs of nesting
Vultures there are in the state of Iowa. Can any one
make a good guess? During June and July on many
days we would see a small flock of 2 to 6 Vultures
soaring and soaring over our farm lot. We suspected
there might be a nest in the Barn lot
~~they~~ hay now, but
never went up to explore.

My second bird note - On July 28 Carl Green, of Hamme,
reported he saw - 2 white ~~egret~~ type wading birds in
Iowa Pond Lake at Hamme. Carl is care taker of the
Cemetery adjoining the lake. He said they were the size
and shape of Great Blue Heron, but all white in color, and
~~what they called~~ they made loud calls he could plainly
hear 100 feet away. He looked thru the bird guide
and decided they were probably Whooping cranes. The only
other large all white bird Great Egret much lower calling notes.
This is an observation we can only wonder about.
