DATE General information, weather, etc: Autumn in NW Iowa was very extended and generally warm, making for drawn-out migrations and lower condentrations of species than normally seen. No significant "winter" weather until Nov. 27th. My observations were rather minimal again this season, but a few worth noting are listed below. Tundra Swan 10/25 Kettleson Hogsback WMA, Dickinson Co. Osprey 1 8/7/94 Klondike, western Lyon Co. (Big Sioux River); was early (or possibly a resident nester somewhere on river?). Osprey 1 9/2 Marble Lake, Dickinson Co .-- this bird was more in the normal migration season, but for 2 years there have been public reports (undocumented) of osprey being seen around Marble Lake throughout summer. Again, could be nesting somewhere in area. Upland Sandpiper 4 8/14 6 mi. SW of Sioux Center, Sioux County. Yellow Rail 1 10/5 3 mi. SE of Lake Park, Dickinson Co. (see documentation attached). Bluebird 1 10/19 Adult male was late; 4 mi. NW Inwood, Lyon Co. N. Cardinal Larchwood; for past two years cadinals seem to 4+ Aug-Nov be increasing in this prairie town (reports also from other residents who never recall seeing them previously, in several parts of city). Suspect they are spreading out from Big Sioux River (7 mi. west), where they have apparently been increasing quite a bit in last decade.
