Bird Report: Summer 1996

Screech Owl (red phase)

Seen all work days June 6th - 20th (June 6,7;10-14;17-20) in the same silver maple tree on I.S.U. campus in Ames. It had a favorite perch, possibly 15 feet up, over a white-washed area on the sidewalk, but sometimes was perched on other branches in the tree.

On June 6th the owl was first seen on the sidewalk with its wings half spread. When it saw me it flew up into the tree and a 3/4's grown chipmunk escaped - seemingly somewhat the worst for the experience. This was just after 3 pm on a gloomy overcast day. On June 7th a pellet which contained a small rodent skull was found near the biggest white-washed patch on the sidewalk.

8 June black male; Brookside Park; singing 40 to 60 feet up in trees; observed about 20 minutes

3 June 1 singing male; I.S.U. campus, Ames (in yew bushes between Beardshear Hall and Carver Hall); last

Pine Siskin pair?; were seen together on June 10, 13, 14; had seen and heard Pine Siskins thruout April and May Jalso Early on I.S.U. campus, usually in the area between the

Beardshear Hall
