CYCLONE SCOUTING REPORT

Don't plan to watch a quiet defensive battle today. Neither Brigham Young nor Iowa State will fail to cross the goal line on more than one occasion during the after-

Brigham Young might well have the most explosive attack to be seen on Clyde Williams Field this year. Coach Tommy Hudspeth runs the pro-type offense with lots of throwing. Marc Lyons, the Cougar quarterback and passer, holds the Brigham Young record for accuracy, hitting better than half his passes as a sophomore. Of equal importance, he has only had slightly more than four of each hundred tosses intercepted.

He will throw often but has two fine running backs—or set backs. Kip Jackson, tailback, and Ed Nichols, fullback, furnish the running power for the versatile attack built

under Coach Hudspeth.

Jackson averaged 4.2 yards against the Cyclones last year. Lyons completed 16 of 33 passes for 189 yards in the 28-20 Iowa State

Hudspeth flip-flops his line so there is no right or left designation for the players up front. He uses "strong" and "tight" designations,

with the "strong" going to the placing of the flanker or wing back. Hudspeth also uses interchangeable players at split end and flanker back. That way fans, and often the players, never know just where men like Bill Glatch, Larry Heaps. Neil Bingham, and one or two others will line up.

The Pro-4-3 defense is favored by the Cougars. The front four, though, are often joined by the "mikes"—the BYU designation for middle guard to make it a 5-2.

Brigham Young has three excellent kickers. Dick Adams has the punting chores and does a great job. But it is the work of defensive end Joe Liljenquist that can be the most dangerous. Liljenquist kicked five field goals in the 22-20 opening victory over Colorado State last Saturday night. Cougar backers think Scott Lounsbury is just as good a kicker. It is not likely that BYU will give Jeff Allen much chance to run the ball back on kickoff since either man booms the ball ou of the end zone most of the time.

Brigham Young does not possess blinding speed over all but has enough individual "swift" to be dangerous every time Lyons puts

the ball into play.

IOWA STATE FOOTBALL COACHING STAFF

Johnny Majors heads as fine a young football staff as there is in the nation today. He has blended youth and experience in perfect balance in his program that is destined to bring football excel-

lence to Iowa State University.

Majors is one of the all-time Tennessee greats. He earned All-American honors in leading Tennessee to an unbeaten season in 1956. He was selected as the outstanding player in the nation that year. A great high school star, Majors was a winner then, in college, and as an assistant coach at Tennessee, Mississippi State, and Arkansas before coming to Iowa State following the 1967 season.

King Block was a great prep star in his native Idaho and a top fullback at the University of Idaho. His coaching talents have boosted football fortunes at Idaho, Arkansas State, Nebraska, and Washing-

ton State.

Jim Johnson was one of the finest nose guards ever to play for Arkansas following a great prep career in Port Arthur, Tex. He coached at Louisiana Tech, Arkansas, and Witchita State.

Joe Madden never played college football but has been a top assistant at Mississippi State and Arkansas before re-joining his old friend Johnny

Majors.

Gordon Smith was no stranger to Iowa State, having played two years as an end for Missouri. He played for the Minnesota Vikings five years and was on the Arkansas Staff when Majors brought him to Iowa State.

Jackie Sherill captained one of Alabama's national champions, later coached at his Alma Mater and then at Arkansas before moving north with

Majors.

Ollie Keller was an outstanding player for Memphis State and then coached prep teams there until he joined Majors at Iowa State.

Joe Avezzano played for Florida State after a four-sport career in Miami. He coached both at


the high school level and at Florida State.

Ray Greene, a triple threat star at Akron South, with the University of Akron captain as a senior. Coached all sports in high school and was on the University of Miami staff when he came to Iowa State

Arch Steele doubles as one of Majors' assistants and as academic counselor for the athletic department. A great player at Bowling Green, Steele joined the Iowa State staff in 1954. He had a long career as a prep and college coach before becoming

a Cyclone.

Phil Callicutt, the head trainer for the Cyclones, has been a top flight trainer for 11 years and is still only 25. He is an Iowa Stater who worked the football Cardinals, East Carolina State, Florida State and was head football trainer at West Virginia when he returned to Iowa State after the 1969 football season.






CAMPUS CHEST 1969



Dangerous Foe Faces Cyclones



Danger is written all over the invading Brigham Young football team - from its booming kicks to its lethal aerial attack.

Iowa State came close to upsetting powerful Syracuse last Saturday but the pride in that near miss won't mean a thing today when Tommy Hudspeth unleashes his Cougars here on Clyde Williams Field. While the Cyclones were being edged in the east, the Cougars were kicking Colorado State right out of the football game in the west.

Five times in that 22-20 victory, Hudspeth called on defensive end Joe Liljenquist for his specialty — spinning the ball through the uprights for three points. All told the husky sophomore accounted for 16 of the 22 points scored by the Cougars.

Iowa State will have no illusions about this game. All too well do the Cyclones remember the heroics they needed last year to gain a 28-20 upset at Provo. They recall that beautiful 84 yard punt return just before the


half ended when Tom Elliott got nine blocks from his teammates to rack up a six-pointer. They remember again that he deflected a 2-point pass that kept the Cougars from taking a 22-21 lead late in the fourth period. They remember, too, that they marched for an insurance score later to get win no. 2 for the year—a year that saw them upset three teams and scare six others before bowing.


Marc Lyons is the key man for the Cougars with his passing and fine execution of the option play. His top runners are Kip Jackson and Ed Nichols. On defense the leaders are end Jeff Slipp, a 230pound defensive monster; Gerald Meyer, a real All-American candidate; and Paul Sutorius, top man in the secondary.

Iowa State looked like a promising club against powerful Syracuse last week. The defensive line was improved over 1968, the offensive line blocked well. But it was on the pass that the Cyclones had trouble. A few dropped aerials and a couple overthrown robbed the Cyclones of the consistency they needed. On defense the secondary didn't always get in the way of the ball.

All-in-all the Cyclones gave promise of being a fine team this year.

Today, in the opening game, facing another tough foe, the Cyclones are ready to fire things up again. One thing is certain—there are going to be mightly few dull moments when the Cyclones play this fall!






About Brigham Young University

In 1875, twenty years before Utah became a state, Brigham Young, the great Mormon colonizer of the West, signed a deed of trust to set up an academy of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latterday Saints in Provo, Utah, and called Dr. Karl G. Maeser, an immigrant German schoolmaster to head the school. His charge was brief: "I want you to remember that you ought not to teach even the alphabet or the multiplication tables without the Spirit of God. That is all. God Bless you. Goodbye." Through the years Dr. Maeser followed the advice to become the great spiritual architect of the school, and later administrators have followed in his footsteps.

With more than 23,000 students Brigham Young University is the largest church-related university in the United States from the standpoint of full-time students. They come from every state in the nation and 60 foreign countries. Since 1950 enrollment has increased 400 percent. To accommodate this great influx, the campus and faculty have been enlarged. The faculty of 1,000 includes some of the world's most distinguished authorities in

science and letters.

The campus includes more than 100 major, permanent, beautiful buildings covering 500 acres at the foot of the majestic Wasatch Mountains. More than 6000 students live in the comfortable new campus residence halls.

Membership in the Church is not required for admission to the University, although at present about 95 percent of the students are members of the Church. Some 30 other denominations also are represented. Everyone, including nonmembers, is required to observe the high standards of the University. Strong language, loose living, liquor and tobacco are not tolerated. More than 5,600 students are former missionaries who have served their Church in missions throughout the world. The students are organized for Sunday church activity into 74 congregations.

BYU is organized into 84 subject areas of 13 colleges and offers the associate, bachelor's master's, and doctor's degrees. Incoming students score 20 percent higher than the national average, and BYU Honors Program students rank in the 99th percentile

on national tests.

The BYU assembly program is likely unmatched anywhere in the world. The gigantic fieldhouse is crowded with 5.000 to 11,000 students twice a week for devotional and forum assemblies. which present the world's top leaders in religion, arts, letters, science, education and government.

BYU is a member of the Western Athletic Conference and is consistently a powerful contender in both conference and national intercollegiate sports.
