



# Cyclones Seek Hope to Pad Opening Game Record

This is the day that lowa State hopes to make it No. 61 - that is 61 opening day victories. Right now the record stands at 60 wins, 17 losses, and 4 ties when a new season has been kicked off.

Despite a much stronger Idaho team than the one that fought the Cyclones to a 24-7 final in 1971, the Cardinal and Gold is favored to get the Earle Bruce era off on a winning note

The Vandals are an explosive team and have scored 86 points and averaged 455 yards of total offense a game so far this year. They blasted the University of Texas at El Paso by a resounding 62-14 score in the opening game two weeks ago. Then, in one of those bitter intra-state rivalries, bowed to Boise State last week by a 24-47 count.

Earle Bruce, his staff, and his players are ready, yes, eager to play. They have spent a month now getting ready for this one and need to play.

Bruce admits to a certain amount of satisfaction with the way drills have gone for the past four weeks. No coach is ever completely satisfied and Bruce is certainly no exception. He wants to see what his Cyclones will look like when in full action.

What will the fan see here today? Actually he will need the difference in jersey colors to tell the difference in the teams - as far as the style of offense and defense is concerned. Both teams use the veer offense, both use basically a fourman front defensively.

This fact has permitted both teams to do a better job of scouting each other since they simply have to learn the play against their own offense and defense. This must be especially helpful to the Vandals who have not had a chance to see the Cyclones in action. Since this is the opening game of the year for lowa State the last time Idaho saw the Cyclones in action was at the spring game played in Marshalltown on May 12.

That is not always a good thing to watch since Bruce split up his talent that day rather than sending his best units against each other.

On the other hand the Cyclones have had a chance to see both of the early games played by Idaho. The fact that the Cyclones will be in action for the first time and Idaho for the third time could cause some problems for lowa State. The Vandals will have had a chance to iron out the early season bugs by now and ought to be ready for some mid-season poise.

Bruce had indicated he'll play a game that just about splits the run-

ning and passing equally. He points out that with receivers like Willie Jones, Ike Harris, and Keith Krepfle you have to utilize the pass. Then he'll turn right around and point out that with runners like Mike Strachan, Jerry Moses, Moses Moore, and Phil Danowsky you have to take full advantage of the run.

Keep an eye out for J. C. Chadband and Marshall Brantley, as well as Mark Fredback. Between them these men have picked up 382 yards in the two games. Veteran quarterback Rick Seefried is one of the better passers to come out of the Big Sky conference in many years.

Defensively keep an eye on Ross Nelson. Against Boise State he intercepted one pass to bring his career total to a record-tying 12. It was another Vandal, Mark Barker, who ran one back 84 yards here two years ago for the only Idaho score. Nelson, incidentally, got two of his 12 interceptions in that game, too.

If today's crowd has passed the 27,064 mark then it marks a record for a Cyclone home opener. That figure, incidentally, was the number of fans the Cyclones and Vandals drew here two years ago.

The next home action will be Oct. 6 when the Cyclones open the Big Eight season against Colorado.

Joe Bugel - coaches defensive tackles. Coached four years each at his alma mater - Western Kentucky - and at the Naval Academy.

Ray Greene - coaches the receivers. Veteran of the staff at lowa State, coached in Akron high schools, also at Miami before coming to Iowa State in 1969.

Randy Hart - freshman coach. Holds football, wrestling letters from Ohio State. Coached with Earle Bruce at Tampa.

Keith Kephart - heads Cyclone football recruiting. Coached in Illinois high schools, came to Cyclones in 1970. Coached frosh one year.

Charlie Lyle - coaches defensive backfield. Football, baseball letterman at Tampa. Coached there two years after career in Florida high school coaching circles.

Jim Shreve - coaches offensive backs. Football, basketball letterman at Syracuse. Coached at Moravian, Lehigh, George Washington before returning to develop great Syracuse backs.



## LEDGES IN JEOPARDY

Ledges State Park near Boone, Iowa is one of central Iowa's most popular parks. Named for the unusual sandstone rock formations in the heart of the park, Ledges Park attracts nearly 500, 000 visitors a year.

But the unique beauty of the Ledges may soon be changed. Current plans for the park will damage the Ledges and alter present park use. Concerned citizens are working to change these plans.

#### IT'S NOT TOO LATE

The Army Corps of Engineers Saylorville Dam Project lies at the heart of the controversy. The dam will periodically flood the main recreational area of the Ledges for up to months longer than under normal flood conditions.

According to the Corps' Draft Environmental Impact Statement on the project, a reservoir flood would now devastate the park by standing in the Ledges for long periods of time. Trees and vegetation unaccustomed to such prolonged inundation would be killed. Mud and debris would be deposited in the park.

#### THERE IS A WAY

Alternatives available to protect the pakr include building a barrier dike around the park, changing the operating procedures of the Saylorville Dam, or stopping the project completely.

Technically, the barrier dike would work. It would cost \$6 million of the Army Corps' money. THE TOTAL COST OF THE SAYLOR-VILLE PROJECT, WHEN COMPLETED IN 1975, WILL BE \$70 MILLION, \$76 MILLION WITH A LEDGES BARRIER DIKE. OUT OF EVERY TAX DOLLAR FOR SAYLORVILLE, 8 CENTS WOULD PROTECT THE LEDGES. WHAT'S IT WORTH TO YOU?

Changing the operating procedures of the Dam is an alternative that also needs further exploration. Computer runs on the effects of changes in the operating procedures on flood pool levels done by scientists at Iowa State University have shown that this may be a viable alternative to protect the park from flooding.

# About the University of IDAHO


Located in Moscow, Idaho, the University of Idaho is surrounded by rolling hills and beautiful mountains. Upon visiting the campus, the casual visitor gets the impression of being close to nature as well as being in the midst of a bustling modern urban environment.

The University of Idaho was established in 1889 by the Idaho Territorial Legislature. The establishment of the University in such a manner makes it unique in the nation. As the State of Idaho came into being, so did the University of Idaho by the actions of this legislature. The growth of the University has been steady from those early days of the 1890's when it had only 6 students to 1973 when it has over 7,000 registered students. The number of students on the campus is only partly indicative of what the University has to offer. There are nine colleges making up the academic environment, including: Letters and Science, Agriculture, Law, Mines, Engineering, Forestry, Education, Business and Economics, and the Graduate School.

For the student coming to the University there is an opportunity to meet people from most of the other states in the United States, as well as people from nearly 30 foreign countries. This vast mixture of students gives the campus a truly cosmopolitan atmosphere, which most students find beneficial in receiving a well rounded college experience.

Of special pride to the University is the recently completed married-student housing located on the periphery of the campus. Finished in the fall of 1970 and now completely landscaped, the complex is one of the most attractive units for married students in the area. Future plans call for more such areas on or near the campus.

Academically, all the colleges coordinate their programs sufficiently to assure the emergence of well qualified professional competence in any of 130 areas. Idaho's Graduate School offers master's degrees in 63 majors listed by undergrad-

uate colleges, as well as doctorate programs in 20 areas within six of the colleges.

The main part of the campus is growing almost as fast as the ever increasing numbers of new students. Within the past few years, facilities finished to meet the need of this increased enrollment include: a new 11 story dormitory, "Theophilus Tower" completed and fully occupied, the College of Education

building, the Women's Physical Education building, the Swimming Complex an 18-hole golf course, a new nine-lane track facility, the new College of Forestry building and the new 18,000 seat football stadium. Two new construction projects, which will be completed during the summer of 1973, include the new College of Law building and the Colege of Agricultural Sciences addition.

Quarterback Rick Seefried led Idaho to a 8-3 record as a sophomore but missed last year with an injury. He likes to throw but is a dangerous runner on the keeper off the veer options.

With good receiver speed, more quality and depth, the offense is


bound to be more troublesome


