Seniors Lead Cyclones in Pursuit of Winning Season Today

When the Iowa State football team started the 1988 season 10 weeks ago, head coach Jim Walden set a goal for his team. He wanted it to climb one notch from last season's sixth-place Big Eight 1987 finish. Iowa State reached that goal with last weekend's 16-7 victory at Kansas State. Now, in this, the last week of the season, Iowa State has a chance to do something that no one thought was possible. Something that has only been accomplished by two Cyclone football teams in this decade. A victory today would give ISU a winning season in Walden's second year as head coach. Standing between Iowa State and six victories are the Oklahoma State Cowboys, including a young man named Barry Sanders.

Iowa State, coming off its third conference win of the season, will have its hands full against Oklahoma State. Sanders, OSU's Heisman Trophy candidate, has been nothing short of unstoppable this season, racking up 2,003 yards and scoring 31 touchdowns. Sanders, who rushed for 312 yards in last week's 63-24 win over Kansas, is averaging 222 yards per game and needs only 340 yards to pass Marcus Allen as the all-time singleseason rushing leader in NCAA history. He has two games left to reach that plateau. OSU takes on Texas Tech December 4 in Tokyo, Japan.

Sanders is not the only weapon in head coach Pat Jones' arsenal. When he decides to throw the football, he has the luxury of using one of the most potent passing combinations in the country. Quarterback Mike Gundy has thrown for 1,903 yards this season with more than half of that total belonging to split end Hart Lee Dykes. Gundy, while averaging 211 yards passing per game this season, has completed 127 passes in 195 attempts. The 5-11 junior has also thrown 15 touchdown passes in 1988, to bring his three-year career total to 37.

Dykes, a two-time all-Big Eight selection, has hauled in 59 passes this year for 1,084 yards. While scoring 10 touchdowns, he has averaged over 18 yards per catch. Dykes has 199 career catches for 3,153 yards and 26 touchdowns. In last week's 63-24 victory over Kansas, the 220-pound senior turned in another stellar performance, catching nine passes for

152 yards and three second-half touchdowns.

lowa State brings a 5-5 record into today's game; the final game in an lowa State uniform for 14 seniors. Several of those seniors could have a great influence on the outcome of this ballgame.

All-Big Eight running back Joe Henderson is just 64 yards short of his second consecutive 1,000-yard season. Henderson, after his season-high 156-yard performance last week against Kansas State, now has 936 yards this season, and 2,611 yards for his career. This makes Henderson the 23rd player in Big Eight history to rush for over 2,500 yards. The Chicago native has been a key to the ISU offense, rushing for over 100 yards in four of his last six games.

Another Cyclone playing in his final lowa State game is wide receiver Dennis Ross. Ross has been a consistent standout all season for ISU, pulling in 32 balls for 417 yards and three touchdowns. An all-Big Eight selection in 1987, Ross has been a favorite target of quarterback Bret Oberg. Last week against Kansas State, Ross caught two passes for 48 yards, pushing his career total to 111 catches for 1,600 yards.

Defensively, Iowa State has been led by defensive back Jeff Dole. After an outstanding 12-tackle performance last week, Dole is the leading tackler among all Big Eight defensive backs with 126 tackles. The senior has also recovered three fumbles this season, and returned an interception for a touchdown. A veteran of 37 games, Dole is a member of a Cyclone secondary that ranks second against the pass in the Big Eight Conference.

Oklahoma State leads the series, which dates back to 1926, 17-11-1. Iowa State's last victory was a 15-10 decision at Cyclone Stadium in 1985. Last year, the Cowboys scored 15 fourth-quarter points to pull away from ISU in a wide open offensive show in Stillwater.



THIS IS IOWA STATE



Since the first students enrolled at Iowa State, the institution has been committed to academic excellence. Iowa State's reputation for scholarship is internationally known and Iowa State's students are respected nationwide as serious scholars.

Iowa State University was founded in 1868 under terms of the Land Grant College Act signed by President Abraham Lincoln during the Civil War. Since the beginning, Iowa State has been a co-educational "people's college". As years passed, the University developed a reputation as an outstanding broad-based institution with academic emphasis in the humanities and the arts while maintaining its position in the scientific and technical fields. Recently, Iowa State has become known as a leading research center, renowned in the fields of engineering and agriculture.

One of the largest institutions governed by the State Board of Regents, Iowa State is a major Midwestern center of learning for 25,578 students, from all 50 states and 100 other nations. One of the highlights of the year occurs in spring as the campus blooms with tulips and apple blossoms just in time for the Veishea celebration. "Veishea" is ISU's annual open house and the largest student-run festival in the nation, complete with parade, exhibits and thousands of alumni. The

campus is also a breathtaking sight in the fall, when autumn colors and leaves make it a cardinal and gold showplace.

Sports are a vital part of the life at lowa State as the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics offers 21 men's and women's sports and the extensive intramural program boasts one of the highest student participation rates in the country. A number of Cyclone intercollegiate teams have been nationally ranked in recent years and several have brought home national titles. Iowa State has also produced 24 Olympians, three of whom captured gold medals. While athletics remain in the spotlight, the academic side shares equal time.

The opportunities that Iowa State offers stretch beyond the lengths of academics and athletics. There are ample opportunities for students to participate in theater, music, dance and intramural sports as well as numerous academic and campus organizations. The Greek system is strong, as are the residence halls. Both have been nationally recognized along with the top-notch academic advising program.


ISU HEAD COACH JIM WALDEN

Nearly two years ago, Iowa State University President Dr. Qordon Eaton and Athletic Director Max Urick began a search for a new Cyclone football coach. The search was not only for a football coach, but for a new direction, a new personality and a new attitude for the Iowa State program. Eaton and Urick found all of those ingredients in 50-year-old Jim Walden, and on December 16, 1986, the former Washington State mentor became Iowa State's 28th head football coach.

The personable native of Aberdeen, Mississippi arrived at ISU with "no magic formulas," just a promise to "come in here and do the best I can to work as hard as I know how." A glance at Walden's coaching record shows that his best has led to success at previous coaching stops.

His first ISU team finished 3-8-0 and demonstrated consistent improvement throughout the season. The Cyclone offense gained almost 4,000 yards and the ISU attack featured several trick plays.

As the head coach at Washington State for nine years, Walden compiled a 44-52-4 record against tough Pacific-10 Conference competition. During that time, Walden guided the team to three winning seasons and four first-division finishes in the conference. He was one of only two WSU coaches to record more than one winning campaign, and only one other coach in Cougar history won more games or served longer as

head coach than Walden.

Walden's Washington State teams became known for the upset victory. No opponent took a WSU team lightly, as the Cougars upset Pac-10 conference powerhouses USC, UCLA and Washington during his years at the school. In fact, Washington State had great success against intra-state rival Washington, knocking the Huskies off in three of Walden's last five years.

Offense was another trademark of Walden-coached teams at WSU, and his

exciting, wide-open option attack had the Cougar offense ranked at the top of the conference. Washington State won three team rushing titles in the last five years, along with two consecutive total offense titles in 1984 and 1985. The Cougar defense also showed improvement under Walden, rising from the lower echelons of the league to as high as third in 1981.

Walden was actually at Washington State for ten years, first serving as an assistant to Warren Powers. When Powers left WSU following the 1977 season, Cougar officials tabbed Walden as his replacement and Walden began building the Washington State program. The culmination of a four-year plan came when Walden took the Cougars to the 1981 Holiday Bowl, WSU's first bowl appearance since the 1931 Rose Bowl. WSU finished the season with an 8-3-1 mark, needing only a win in the regularseason finale to go to the Rose Bowl. In 1983, the Cougars were also within one game, a mid-season loss to UCLA, of winning the Pac-10 title and earning the Rose Bowl berth.

His success did not go unnoticed by his peers. Walden earned Pac-10 Coach-of-the-Year honors in 1981 and 1983. In 1981, he was the UPI West Coast and AFCA/Kodak District IX Coach-of-the-Year. Following the 1981 season, he was asked to be an assistant coach for the West squad in the Japan Bowl and at the East-West Shrine game that year. He was the head coach of the victorious West squad in the 1985 East-West Shrine Game, and was an assistant at the 1986 Hula Bowl.

Walden also brought stability to the WSU program. One of the keys to his success at Washington State was continuity on his staff over the years. Prior to the start of the 1986 season, all of his assistant coaches had remained with him for at least five years, and several had been on the job since he became head coach at Washington State in 1977. When he accepted the job at Iowa State, Walden invited all nine of his assistant coaches to join him and seven of them did.

Despite spending the past 10 years in the Pac-10, Walden is familiar with Big Eight Conference football. He started his collegiate coaching career in 1969 at Nebraska under his former college coach, Bob Devaney. For the next four seasons, Walden was a defensive coach for the Cornhuskers. During those years Nebraska won two national championships.

From Nebraska, Walden moved to Miami (Fla.) in 1973 as an offensive backfield coach for Pete Elliott, and was later named defensive coordinator under Carl Selmer. Walden joined

Warren Powers' Washington State staff as backfield coach for the 1977 season, and took over the head coaching job in 1978.



As a college quarterback at Wyoming. Walden guided the Cowboys to a pair of Skyline Conference titles. He was named both the conference and team Most Valuable Player in 1959, and played in the 1960 East-West Shrine Game. Following his college career, Walden signed with the British Columbia Lions of the Canadian Football League and played two seasons each with the Lions and Calgary. He coached Amory High School in his native Mississippi for five years before taking his first college job at Nebraska.

Introducing the 1988-89 Student Alumni Association Executive Committee

As part of the Alumni and Development offices, the Student Alumni Association works to enhance relations between alumni, students, and prospective students of Iowa State.

The 120 members of the Student Alumni Association are responsible for planning and conducting the events on and off campus involving students and alumni of ISU. Campus tours, Career Preview Days, high school ambassador trips, Parents Weekend and opening week activities are a few of the activities the SAA sponsors to promote ISU.

The SAA Executive Committee consists of 13 students who are selected for their leadership abilities and service to the university. The Executive Committee provides leadership to the individual committees of the SAA.

SCOUTING REPORT

The Series: Oklahoma State leads the series, which dates back to 1926, 17-11-1. Iowa State's last victory in the series was a $15 ext{-}10$ decision in 1985 in Ames. Thurman Thomas gained 293 yards on 30 carries and scored four touchdowns to lead OSU to a 48-27 victory over the Cyclones last season in Stillwater. Barry Sanders added 112 yards in 12 attempts as Oklahoma State racked up 413 yards rushing, and 530 total yards. Fifteen fourth-quarter points put the game away for the Cowboys, after they led 33-27 through three quarters. Bret Sadek completed 19 passes in 36 attempts for 265 yards and scored two touchdowns. Joe Henderson rushed 25 times for 125 yards to lead the Cyclone rushing attack.

For the Record: Tailback Barry Sanders rushed for 312 yards on 37 carries to lead Oklahoma State to a 63-24 rout of Kansas last weekend in Stillwater. Sanders had 217 yards and four touchdowns in the first half, as the Cowboys led 28-17 at halftime. Hart Lee Dykes caught nine passes for 152 yards and scored 3 touchdowns to complement Sanders, and help the Cowboys to 717 total yards. Oklahoma State, now ranked 13th nationally, rolled up 586 yards rushing against Kansas, the nation's worst rushing defense. OSU, which is currently in third place in the conference, travels to Tokyo, Japan to take on Texas Tech, in its final regular season game on Dec. 4th.

Offensively: Oklahoma State's potent offense, led by Helsman Trophy candidate Barry Sanders, is averaging over 515 yards of total offense per game. Sanders has rushed for 2,003 yards this season, while averaging over 515 yards of total offense per game. Sanders has rushed for 2,003 yards this season, while averaging over 222 yards per game. He now holds NCAA records for most touchdowns and points in a single season, with 31 touchdowns and 188 points. Sanders leads the nation in rushing, scoring and all-purpose running. OSU's passing combination of quarterback Mike Gundy and wide receiver Hart Lee Dykes provides another dimension to the Cowboy offense. Gundy has completed 127 passes in 195 attempts for 1,903 yards and 15 touchdowns, while Dykes, an All-America candidate, has caught 59 passes for 1,084 yards and 10 touchdowns.

Defensively: The Cowboys are allowing 447 yards per game of total offense, and their opponents are averaging 28 points per game. Linebacker Sim Drain leads OSU with 76 tackles and two fumble recoveries. Free safety Rod Smith has 71 tackles with two interceptions and a touchdown, while cornerback Melvin Gilliam leads the Cowboys in interceptions and tackles for loss, with three of each.

Kicking: Placekicker Gary Blanchard has hit on all 54 of his extra point attempts this season, including eight PAT's last weekend against Kansas. He has also connected on ten-of-eleven field goal tries to give him 84 points scored for the season. Blanchard also punts for the Cowboys, and on 31 kicks is averaging 37.4 yards. Sanders has returned nine punts for a 10 yard average. Sanders has also returned 16 kickoffs for a 21.8 yard average, including a 100- vard return for a touchdown.

The Coach: Oklahoma State head coach Pat Jones is in his fifth season as head coach with an overall mark of 41-15-0. He owns a 3-1 mark against lowa State. He served on Frank Broyle's staff in 1974 and 1975 as a graduate assistant. He then served as defensive end coach for SMU in 1976 and 1977, and Pittsburgh in 1978, before coming to OSU. From 1979 to 1983 he worked under Jimmy Johnson as defensive end coach and defensive coordinator, before being named head coach of the Cowboys in 1984.

STADIUM INFORMATION

First Aid Station

Emergency medical treatment is available for spectators in special first aid quarters located under both the east and west stands. Contact the nearest usher to request medical assistance.

Ambulance Service

An ambulance is parked at the first aid quarters on the west side of the stadium.

Pass Out Checks

Persons leaving the stadium will be stamped for re-admission to the stadium. In addition, they must have a ticket stub for re-admission. No pass outs will be allowed between 12:30 and 1:00 p.m. or ½ hour before kickoff.

Service for Physicians

Doctors anticipating calls during the game are urged to register at the first aid quarters under the west stands, leaving their exact seat location. The management will see that all calls are delivered without delay.

Lost and Found

A lost and found service is maintained in the Athletic Ticket Office in the Olsen Building at the north end of the stadium. Articles found should be turned over to an usher or left at the Athletic Ticket Office.

Public Telephone

Pay telephones are located behind the east and west stands.

Refreshments

Refreshments are served in the stands and at locations around the stadium.

Iowa State Souvenirs

An attractive array of Iowa State souvenirs is available at conveniently located novelty sales booths throughout the stadium and from vendors in the parking areas.

Radios, Stadium Chairs, Umbrellas

As a courtesy to neighboring ticket holders, spectators are asked not to bring radios, stadium chairs, and umbrellas into the stands.

Rest Rooms

Rest rooms are located throughout the stadium behind each concession stand.


Public Address System

No appeals will be made over the public address system except under exceptional circumstances. The public is asked not to request this service.

Wheelchairs

Special areas in sections 18 and 19 are available for spectators in wheelchairs. In addition, wheelchair seating is available on the field level behind the goalposts.

No coolers of any size will be permitted in the stadium.



Carry-in Packages & Articles

Please do not bring into the stadium, bottles, cans, apples, oranges, toilet tissue, etc. Items thrown on the field can result in a penalty for the home team.

The State of Iowa code prohibits the use of alcohol in the Stadium. The Athletic Department asks our patrons to behave responsibly and in compliance with the State code.

Parking Lot Facilities

The ISU Athletic Department is one of the very few athletic facilities to provide portable toilets for their patrons in the parking lots. These are located in strategic spots throughout the stadium parking area.

Stadium Sign Policy

Iowa State promotes and encourages the display of signs. All signs must be in good taste and supportive of Iowa State University. Signs are to be displayed on the south end of the Olsen Building and on the walls of the stands, both upper and lower decks. In no case may the sign obstruct vision or endanger fans. Signs must be stationary. All signs must be approved by Iowa State's athletic department. For sign approval, see Jim Overturf, Room 137 Olsen Building. before noon on Friday prior to home games. The athletic department reserves the right to move or remove any signs not meeting these

specifications.

Emergency Road Service

Iowa State University and Iowa AAA Motor Club will provide an Emergency Road Service for persons attending home football games. This service will be in effect during and within two hours after the game throughout the season. The phone number for the service is 292-2303. Proof of game attendance (i.e., ticket stub) may be requested.

Distractions

We want to make football Saturday a totally enjoyable experience and want to encourage you to be respectful of those around you in the stadium. This attitude of cooperation can help to insure pleasant, enthusiastic game atmosphere. In the event you feel there is unreasonable distraction in your seating area, we ask you to take the following steps to help us control undesirable behavior:

-Note the seating section, row and seat number(s), and inform the usher in your section of the disturbance. The usher will observe the conduct and request it to stop, if appropriate.

-If the conduct continues, the usher will get assistance from a uniformed policeman to request improvement of behavior or to remove the fan(s) from the stadium

 -An additional occurrence is cause for removal from the stadium and could be grounds for relocation in next season's ticket assignment.

ISU PRESIDENT GORDON EATON

Gordon Eaton's leadership has already made an impact on every department and segment of the campus community as Iowa State improves its facilities, academic programs and student services.

The former vice president for academic affairs at Texas A&M, Eaton took office July 1, 1986 as Iowa State's 12th president.

Eaton received his bachelor of arts from Wesleyan University at Middletown, Conn., in 1951. He graduated "With High Honors and High Distinction" with degrees in geology and mathematics. He earned his masters of science degree in geology (1953) and his Ph.D. in geophysics and geology (1957) from the California Institute of Technology.

He served on the faculty of Wesleyan University (1955-59) and the faculty of the University of California-Riverside (1959-63) before a two-year stint as the project chief for the U.S. Geological Survey in Denver, Colorado. Eaton then returned to California-Riverside where he was the chairperson of the department of geological sciences.



DR. GORDON EATON

From 1967-81 Eaton was with the U.S. Geological Survey, serving in a number of capacities. He was the project chief for the Southwestern Project, scientistin-charge of the Hawaiian Volcano Observatory, and associate chief geologist at the national headquarters in Reston, Va.

In 1981, he was appointed the dean of the College of Geosciences at Texas A&M, which includes the departments of geology, geophysics, oceanography, meteorology and geography. Eaton was named provost and vice president for academic affairs in 1983, a post he held until coming to lowa State.

An established scholar and scientist, Eaton is the author and co-author of more than 40 publications covering such subjects as mineral resources throughout the United States, volcanic ash deposits, and mining geophysics in the Soviet Union. He has worked on the "Journal of Volcanology and Geothermal Resources" as an associate editor, and was the co-editor of the Geological Society of America's "Memoir 152".

Cyclone Hall-of-Famers Back Home This Afternoon

It was 1978, the year that capped off a trio of 8-3 regular seasons and ended with Iowa State's fourth bowl appearance in eight years. The Iowa State University Athletic Department today welcomes back this group of distinguished Cyclones.

Virtually every pre-season poll included Iowa State in its elite rankings, making the 1978 team the only football team in Cyclone history to be rated in pre-season polls.

Headliners for Iowa State included runningback Dexter Green, who would be named to the 1978 All-American team and end his career as ISU's all-time leading rusher with 3,437 yards. Another All-American, Mike Stensrud, would anchor the Cyclone defense from his tackle position. With plenty of offensive firepower and Coach Bruce's cornerstone - a rugged defense - the Cyclones were ready to be successful.

Iowa State started its season
September 9 at Rice in a game that was
plagued by a torrential downpour. The
visiting Cyclones needed 13 fourthquarter points to defeat the stubborn
Owls, 23-19. Despite the bad weather
conditions, All-America candidate
Green churned out 165 yards and three
touchdowns. Spearheading the
defensive charge were linebackers John
Less and Tom Boskey, who combined
for 34 tackles.

Following their opening game triumph, the Cyclones edged San Diego State, 14-13, in the ISU home opener the following Saturday. Green was again the key, rushing for 129 yards.

Next it was a September 23 showdown with intrastate rival Iowa in Iowa City. The Cyclones were still smarting from a 12-10 upset at the hands of the Hawkeyes the year before. After a scoreless first quarter, ISU exploded for 17 second-quarter points. Quarterback Walter Grant hit Stan Hixon for a 47-yard touchdown pass and found Ray Hardee for a six-yard scoring toss two minutes later. Grant and Hixon teamed up for another score, this one for 20 yards, in the fourth quarter. The performance produced a sweet 31-0 victory. Tight end Rick White was the defensive leader with 11 tackles, including four for 25 yards in losses.

Drake was the final opponent on the non-conference slate, and the upset-minded Bulldogs trailed by only a touchdown, 7-0, going into the locker room at halftime. This day it was Terry

Rubley's turn to shine at quarterback, passing for three touchdowns. Rubley found Green for an eight-yard touchdown toss in the first quarter and then fired 23 and six-yard touchdown aerials to Hardee and Guy Preston, respectively, in the third quarter as Iowa State prevailed 35–7.

Next up was an October 7 date with powerhouse Nebraska for the now 12th-ranked Cyclones. The Cornhuskers were still stinging from two consecutive losses to Iowa State and they were not to be denied that Saturday in Ames, claiming a 23-0 win. Tom Boskey had 19 tackles and brother Chris, 23 for ISI

The Cyclones were plagued by five turnovers the following weekend and dropped a heartbreaking 26-13 decision at Missouri. Green was a Cyclone bright spot, rushing for 134 yards.

Iowa State's tailspin continued the next weekend against No. 1 Oklahoma. The Sooner attack, led by quarterback Thomas Lott and runningback Billy Sims, scored a 34-6 win at Cyclone Stadium. Iowa State was now 4-3 overall, but stood 0-3 in the Big Eight race. A bowl game seemed far away. But the Cyclones reared back and came out punching.

ISU got back on the winning track on October 28, spoiling homecoming for Kansas, 13-7.

The Cyclones followed that win with a 24-0 Nov. 4 victory over Kansas State before a sellout Homecoming crowd. The ISU offense had its best day of the season, totaling 439 yards. tight end Steve Weidemann totaled 17 tackles for lowa State.

With a chance to even their Big Eight record, the Cyclones took control early at Oklahoma State the following weekend, marching to a 14-7 halftime lead and a 28-7 advantage after three quarters. The final result was a 28-15 Cyclone triumph. Green rushed for 102 yards, his sixth 100-yard game that season and the 18th of his career. He scored two of ISU's touchdowns on a pair of one-yard runs, while Grant added two short scoring drives himself. Reserve cornerback Joe Brown had a brilliant 43-yard punt return and also blocked an OSU field goal attempt. Chris Boskey also played tough on defense, garnering 16 tackles.

Then, on Nov. 18, before a regionallytelevised audience, Iowa State ended a 16-year Folsom Field jinx by defeating Colorado 20-16. Grant, named the outstanding offensive player of the game by ABC-TV, threw for 159 yards and one touchdown and ran for 78 yards and a tally. Steve Johnson added field goals of 24 and 34 yards. It also was a big day for Iowa State's defense. Stensrud had 14 tackles, including six for 23 yards in losses, and caused a fumble. Chris Boskey, who was named the contest's most valuable defensive player, had 15 stops. John Less had 16 tackles and Tom Perticone also was credited with 15. The win improved the Cyclones' overall record to 8-3 and assured ISU a third-place finish in the tough Big Eight Conference with a 4-3

Iowa State reached its goal of post season play, accepting a Hall of Fame Bowl invitation to play Texas A&M. The Cyclones lost the game 28-12, but vindicated their fans' preseason optimism. Remarked ISU head coach Earle Bruce after the game, "This group of seniors has been outstanding. They've worked hard and always kept coming back."

Cyclone Close-Up: Slimmer Sims Ready For Battle in 1988

Cyclone junior offensive lineman Keith Sims, a native of Watchung, N.J., is entering his third season at Iowa State and looks to see a lot of action in this season.

The third-year veteran was inserted into the starting lineup against Kansas in 1985 and helped the Cyclones pull off a 22-21 victory as a freshman. Since then he has started in 19 consecutive games, including two contests last season.

A medical hardship redshirt in 1987, Sims sat out most of the season with a turf toe injury. However, he is listed as the starting left offensive guard this year, and rates among the best in the Big Eight.

Sims is one of the Cyclones' best performers in the weight room. He holds team bests in the bench press (405 pounds) and also in the hip sled (920 pounds).

One thing that Sims won't miss from the 1987 season is the amount of weight that he has lost. Sims ended last season weighing in at 309 pounds, but by the time Spring football drills rolled around, he was a slim 289.

"I feel my ideal playing weight will be 280 to 285," said the Cyclone lineman. "I once weighed 320 here, but I now avoid greasy foods, sweets and lift weights a lot."

Second-year head coach Jim Walden is very excited about Sims' healthy new look.

"Sims is making our eyes twinkle," Walden said. "He's starting to look like the Sims I heard about when I first came to Iowa State. I didn't get a good look at him last year because of his injury, but I feel Keith can be an awesome player."

Sims will play guard this season, instead of his normal position at tackle. He says there isn't much difference between playing the two, and Walden doesn't see any problems with the switch.

"Because he didn't play much last fall, it was easy for him to make the transition from tackle to guard," Walden said.

When the better competition rolls around, Sims puts forth an extra effort when he hits the field.

"I get pumped up playing Iowa, Oklahoma, and teams like that," Sims said. "My philosophy is that I'm just as good as they are. I might not get the publicity, but I'm going to show them I'm as good. When it comes down to the fourth quarter, it's just a dog fight at that point," he said. "You have to know what you're doing, and you have to be a thinker."

Offensive line coach Steve Morton also has high hopes for Sims this season.

"Keith is very gifted. He has strength, leaping ability and speed for his size," Morton said. "If Keith keeps his intensity up, he'll get better with repetitions. You can be better and bigger than somebody, but if you don't go out and hit hard, it doesn't do anything for you."

Morton also believes that Sims' experience will really help the Cyclones this season.

"When you get a kid who has as much experience as Keith going into his junior year, and who is the type of athlete that he is, you expect a lot of good things," Morton said. "I think he's been in almost every type of situation possible in Division I football. He gives us experience, and that calming effect that we need in an otherwise inexperienced offensive line."

Sims was highly recruited out of high

school by Maryland, Iowa, Missouri and Penn State, but his mind was made up after visiting Ames.

"I came out to visit and it was 100 below," he said. "But I liked the engineering school and the people were really great. I went home and told my coach that this was where I was going to go."


He played well in his first game and was able to get all of the jitters out of his system.

"It helped me an awful lot getting that first game under my belt," he said. "I was nervous and I had to think a lot about my assignments."

But football isn't everything in Sims' life. Education is a big part of Sims' life. He comes from a family where schooling takes high priority.

"My parents are both graduates of Morgan State (Md.), and my sister got her degree from Maryland last May," he said. "I'm majoring in industrial technology, and thinking about getting a minor in computer science. Computers have been a hobby of mine since I was a sophomore in high school. I own my own IBM computer and love working with it."

Almost as much as the Cyclones love having him on their offensive line.

Dennis Ross: A Welcome Menace to the ISU Offense

Everyone remembers Dennis the Menace. He was that cute little boy with the sling shot in his back pocket, who spent more time standing in the corner than most kids did in the ice cream line at the end of the block.

To the delight of Iowa State fans, that little boy has grown into a 6-3, 190-pound wide receiver who spends more time in the end zone than most opposing defenses care to admit.

Over the last four years, senior Dennis Ross has been a continual pest to many ISU opponents, and has only gotten worse with age. Now ready to take the field for his final collegiate game, Ross hopes to be the Cyclone troublemaker just one more time.

"I want to go out a winner," Ross said. "And do as much as I can to win the last game. It will be somewhat sad, because I'll never play in front of Iowa State fans again – and they are good people."

An honorable mention All-America selection in 1987, Ross was the second leading receiver in the Big Eight Conference as a junior. In what was one of the most exciting games of the year, he posted 174 receiving yards against Northern Iowa – the fifth highest singlegame total in ISU history.

But breaking records has never been one of his immediate concerns.

"When I first came here, my intention was to be the best possible football player I could be. If I strived for this, the records would take care of themselves. I came wanting to play, because football is fun and exciting," Ross said.

And the records have taken care of themselves.

Following the Kansas State game, Ross' career reception total stood at 111, making him only the third player in Cyclone history to catch 100 or more passes. With 1,440 receiving yards, he ranks fourth on the ISU career chart and 18th on the all-time Big Eight Conference list. He also leads the Cyclone receiving corps with three touchdowns on the year, one of which came against Nebraska with one second remaining in the game.

But to Ross, his most important gift can't be measured in numbers.

"I think my biggest contribution is that I've worked hard to obtain a winning season and a winning program at lowa State," he said. "Hopefully, I've also had a leadership role, especially for those guys just coming into the program. I want to be one who leads by example, rather than by word of mouth."

That work ethic was instilled within Ross at an early age. His grandmother, who died earlier this year, and his mother, have helped him to develop a sense of values, he said.

"I think my mother and my grandmother are the most influential people in my life. Both have taught me to be a strong, self-supporting person, and to care for myself, as well as others," he said.

It's that philosophy which guided Ross to Iowa State.

"I wanted to get away from home - to venture out on my own into a totally different environment and see if I could handle it," he said.

Being from Detroit, the peer pressure was there to attend the University of Michigan or Michigan State, but Ross was not intimidated.

Once at Iowa State, he even considered taking on the role of a two-sport athlete.

An all-state honorable mention basketball selection in high school, Ross thought about joining the Cyclone cagers.

"The basketball coaches wanted me to give it a try, but after football season, you're physically and emotionally drained. I did give it some consideration, though."

And despite his reservations as his collegiate athletic career comes to an end,

Ross admits he's excited to be moving into another part of his life.

"If the opportunity is there to play pro, I'll give it a try. After that, I'll work hard to achieve my goals within the workforce, and be as successful as I was with football," the hotel management major said.


Looking back, Ross said the key to a successful collegiate career for the high school senior comes in taking the time to make the right decision.

"When he's being recruited, he shouldn't look at it as an ego thing," Ross said. "He needs to look at the whole – academics, environment, and being away from home. A lot of college careers are shot when a guy doesn't take the time to analyze the situation."

And when Iowa State fans look at the whole of Dennis Ross, what does he hope they will say?

"Boy, that Dennis Ross. He worked hard and strived to do the best he could do. We appreciate him," he said.

Not bad for the little boy with the sling shot in his back pocket.

Track Teams Eager To Start 1988-89 Campaigns

As the Iowa State cross country season comes to an end, both the men's and women's track squads are preparing for what should be another banner season in the Big Eight. Both of the squads will be using the middle distance and distance people as the anchors to a strong nucleus.

The men will be without the great running ability of Barnaba Korir. Korir uses up his eligibility after the cross country season. With Korir absent, the most experienced runner for the men will be junior Darrell Smith. Smith has placed four times in Big Eight competition, including a second-place finish in the 5,000-meter run at the 1988 Big Eight Conference Championship. Freshman Andrew Hollens placed 22nd at last year's NCAA District V meet and should be a very valuable contributor this season.

In the 800-meter run, the conference title will once again be a target for sophomore Brett Carney. Carney placed second in this event at the Big Eight indoor meet last year, and then came back in the outdoor season to win the title.

The women's squad will also anchor the team around the middle distance

events this year. With four returning All-Americans, the ISU women will try to improve on their third-place indoor and fourth-place outdoor conference finishes of 1987-88.

The middle distance events will be anchored by junior Maria Akraka and sophomore Edith Nakiyingi. As All-Americans in the 800-meter run, Nakiyingi placed sixth and Akraka placed seventh at last year's NCAA Outdoor Championship meet. Nakiyingi also is the reigning 800-meter conference champion, with teammate Akraka as runnerup.

In the hurdles, senior Jaqueline Parker is the top contender. A Big Eight champion in the 400-meter hurdles during the outdoor season last year, she qualified for the NCAA meet in this event during the indoor season. Junior Kris Parsons and sophomore Sandra Govinden will round out the hurdle trio.

If all the pieces of the puzzle fit together for Coach Dick Lee this season, the Cyclones could run away with the Big Eight Conference crowns.

Iowa State Ready To 'Play Ball'

Just because the weather is turning colder, and Christmas displays are going up, don't think that everyone is looking toward winter. With 20 lettermen coming back from a team that won 27 games, lowa State baseball coach Bobby Randall is more than ready to lace up the cleats and begin the 1989 Cyclone spring baseball campaign.

Randall, who is now in his fifth year as head coach, is very satisfied with the way the team looks after its fall schedule.

"This is the best I've felt about the ballclub that we'll put on the field since I've been here," Randall said. "I really feel that we can compete well in the conference because we play good defense, and that will keep you in a lot of ballgames," Randall said.

Leading the Cyclones defensively will be what Randall calls "the best outfield that we've ever had." That trio includes Bryce Hustedt, Mike Bentley, and Tom Vantiger. Randall is also looking to the middle infield of Dave Herbeck, Virgil Fulk, and Greg Brecht to provide Iowa State with consistent defensive play. Fulk was one of the Cyclones' standouts with a fielding percentage of .974.

The pitching duties this season will fall

on the shoulders of Mike Myers, Danny Kasperski, Kent Cesler, Shawn Stolte, Dan O'Reilly, and Don Wingert. This is the first time since he has been at Iowa State that the pitching rotation was no problem to determine, Randall said.

"These guys may not have had great numbers last year, but they got a lot of innings, and they're greatly improved," he said.

According to Randall, a good defense must be backed up with consistency at the plate, but don't look for the Cyclones to be a power hitting team.

"We may not have 10 Cadillacs out there, but we do have 10 good-looking Fords, and we're going to be a good ball club," he said.

Iowa State begins play this spring on February 25 against Air Force at Creighton University. The first home game will be March 5, when the Cyclones host the Northern Iowa Panthers. ISU will then play a tough schedule on its Southern tour, before it comes back home to begin Big Eight play on April 1.

"The quality and caliber of baseball in the Big Eight is extrordinary. Oklahoma State, Oklahoma, and Nebraska are definitely the teams to beat," Randall said.

Cyclone Academic Success Highlights 1987-88 School Year

The Iowa State University Athletic Department's commitment to serving its student athletes is underscored by the scholastic success achieved by Cyclone competitors last season. In all, 83 ISU athletes earned Big Eight Conference Honor Roll recognition for maintaining a grade point average of 3.0 or higher during the 1987-88 academic year and earning a varsity letter in their respective sport.

A total of 20 Iowa State athletes earned first-team all-Big Eight academic honors last season. Leading the way among this elite group were cross country competitors Lisa Skidmore of Des Moines, Charlene Letzring of Charlotte and base-

Skidmore earned a 4.0 grade point average in physical education during the 1987 spring and fall semesters. Letzring scored a 3.87 grade point average in zoology. Heiderscheit earned national recognition after notching a spot on the CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors Association) Academic All-America team for the second straight season. The pitcher-first baseman hit .321 last season, with a team high 48 RBI. He was 2-1 on the mound and finished the academic year with a 3.7 grade point

average in elementary education.





SUPPORT SERVICES



STRENGTH PROGRAM

Today, one of the most integral aspects of any intercollegiate athletic program is a sound strength and conditioning program. Iowa State recognizes this area as a crucial ingredient to the overall success of all 21 men's and women's intercollegiate sports offered at the university. Under

the direction of full-time strength and conditioning coach Tom Wilson, Iowa State's athletic teams have made tremendous strides.

The goal of the strength and conditioning program is not to make avid weightlifters out of athletes, but rather to keep athletes healthy and

prepared for competition by reducing their susceptibility to injury. This is accomplished by a computer analyzed combination of a strict strength and conditioning program, a good diet and sufficient rest.

"Iowa State offers all athletes proven strength and conditioning programs," said Wilson, "plus excellent facilities designed to enhance the athletes' performances and help them realize their maximum potential. Utilizing such a strictly supervised strength and conditioning program not only produces great physical results, but also increases the athletes' confidence when they become bigger, faster and more disciplined than their opponent."

For Iowa State's football team, as well as many other Cyclone squads, the strength and conditioning program continues on a year-round basis. During the summer and winter months, athletes concentrate on increasing strength and conditioning while inseason work consists of maintaining strength and the level of conditioning.

Through evaluation and testing, use of computerized training programs and diet analysis, ISU's strength and conditioning program is helping make Iowa State student athletes into better athletes.

ACADEMIC COUNSELING



The term "student-athlete" carries an important distinction at Iowa State University. Athletes at ISU must be students first if they are to retain the privileges associated with participating in intercollegiate athletics. The hours and energy demanded of today's college athlete can adversely affect a student-athlete's education without

guidance in time management and study techniques.

Iowa State's athletic academic coordinators monitor all student-athletes' academic status in terms of both eligibility and progress toward graduation to help prepare them for life after a collegiate athletic career. Four full-time academic coordinators, plus

several part-time counselors and numerous tutors, assure that these goals are being met. The staff works directly with the student-athletes, as well as with the athletes' academic advisers and instructors throughout the university.

Although absence from class because of athletic participation is held to an absolute minimum, any missed class time can impose a burden on the student-athlete. Support services such as tutoring and study table, help alleviate that problem. ISU's football team utilizes a study table that meets on a daily basis throughout the year. Academic staff members and tutors attend each session and are available throughout the day to meet with student-athletes.

The education of ISU student-athletes and their progress toward degrees has always been a prime consideration of the athletic department at Iowa State. A strong athletic academic counseling service helps support the student-athletes and offer them guidance and assistance as they work toward degrees and enjoy athletic successes.

COACHING STAFF

NORM ANDERSEN

Runningbacks



Andersen joined Jim Walden's staff in March of 1987 after nine seasons as an assistant coach at UCLA. For five seasons (1982-86), the former Bruin tight end coached and developed some of the nation's top runningbacks at his alma mater, including Gaston Green and Eric Ball. ISU runningback Joe Henderson rushed for 1,232 yards in Andersen's first season in Ames

A three-year starter at UCLA (1973-75), he now ranks 10th in career receiving with 61 catches for 1,051 yards. He led the Bruins in receiving as a sophomore and a junior, catching 19 passes in 1973 and 27 the following year. An all-Pacific-8 first-team selection in 1974, he was chosen in the 11th round of the 1976 NFL draft by the Chicago Bears.

TIM BALD

Program Coordinator



Tim Bald is in his third season as lowa State's program coordinator, organizing the recruiting and administrative responsibilities in the Cyclone football program.

The Freeport, Ill., native came to the Cyclones from the Washington Redskins of the National Football League. He served as the Redskins' administrative intern in charge of player personnel.

The 30-year-old Bald is a 1980 graduate of Loras College where he earned a bachelor's degree in business administration. He received his master's degree in Physical Education with an emphasis in sports management from Western Illinois University in 1985.



CRAIG BOLLER

Defensive Line



The 1988 season is Craig Boller's second as an assistant coach at Iowa State. The Belmond native is no stranger to Ames, however, where he lettered three times as an ISU defensive tackle under Clay Stapleton and Johnny Majors (1967-69).

Boller came to Iowa State in January of 1987 after serving six years as the defensive line coach at Oregon State. The 40-year old Boller was an assistant coach at Memphis State for two seasons (1978-79) after working one year as a part-time assistant coach at Tennessee.

Boller spent three seasons (1974-76) building the William Penn (Iowa) College football program. William Penn won the Iowa Conference title in Boller's final season as head coach. He began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Knoxville High School from 1971-73.

JIMMY BURROW

Defensive Secondary



Secondary coach Jimmy Burrow came to Iowa State in January of 1987 with Head Coach Jim Walden, after five seasons as a full-time coach at Washington State, the last four as the Cougars' secondary coach. The 34-year old Burrow coached tight ends at WSU in 1982.

Burrow's association with Walden dates back to his high school days in Amory, Miss. Walden was Burrow's coach in ninth and tenth grade football and baseball. Burrow attended the University of Mississippi for one season before transfering to Nebraska where he was reunited with Walden. At Nebraska, Burrow earned second-team all-Big Eight honors his senior season and was an academic All-American. A member of the 1972 Orange Bowl and 1973 Cotton Bowl teams, he also played in the 1974 Sugar Bowl and 1975 Fiesta Bowl. He graduated with a B.S. in education.

Burrow was picked in the eighth round of the 1976 NFL draft by the Green Bay Packers and played in three games of the 1976 regular season. He went on to play five years in the CFL (1977-81), the first four with Montreal and the 1981 season with Ottawa. He earned a master's in Education Administration in June, 1981 at Washington State. Burrow and his wife, Carol, are parents of two children, Jamie (9) and Danny (7).

DAVE ELLIOTT

Wide Receivers



The 1987 season marks Dave Elliott's 14th campaign as an assistant coach and his tenth season as an assistant to Jim Walden. At Washington State, Elliott tutored the inside linebackers from 1979-86.

The Champaign, Ill., native coached the defensive backs at Miami (Fla.) in 1975. In 1976, he coached at Michigan, working with linebackers. He spent the 1977-78 seasons at Toledo as defensive backfield coach before joining Walden's staff at Washington State.

Elliott, the nephew of Iowa Athletic
Director Bump Elliott and cousin of former
Cyclone assistant coach Bobby Elliott,
lettered three times in football as a
defensive back. He played for the Michigan
squad that went to the 1972 Rose Bowl.
Elliott also played in the 1975 Hula Bowl and
was invited to play in the 1975 American
Bowl. Dave and his wife, Peggy, are the
parents of two daughters, Catherine Lynn (6)
and Christina (4).

JON FABRIS

Outside Linebackers



Jon Fabris, who coached the tight ends under Jim Walden at Washington State (1983-86), will coach the Cyclone linebackers in 1988. Fabris, a native of Starkville, Miss., first joined Walden's WSU staff in 1982, when he assisted with the secondary, coached the offensive scout team and scouted the opposition's kicking game.

Fabris coached the junior varsity defensive backfield and defensive scout team at Georgia Tech in 1980, before working for an oil company in 1981. He earned four varsity letters playing all four secondary positions at Mississippi (1976-79), including three years as a starter. He ranked third in Southeastern Conference punt returns in 1977 and graduated fifth in career punt returns at Ole Miss. He received his bachelor's degree in education in 1980.

The 31-year old Fabris quarterbacked Starkville High School to a conference title and No. 10 state ranking his senior season.

LINDSAY HUGHES

Tight Ends



For Iowa State tight end coach Lindsay Hughes, the 1988 season will mark his 21st campaign in the collegiate coaching ranks and his 11th under Head Coach Jim Walden. Hughes coached the outside linebackers at Washington State.

Hughes started his coaching career as the freshman coach at San Jose State in 1967. He was a graduate assistant in charge of the offensive scout team and assisted with linebackers at Florida State in 1968, when the Seminoles played in the Peach Bowl. In 1969, the Redondo Beach, Calif., native worked with the secondary. He went to San Diego State in 1970-71 where he was an assistant coach working with the linebackers. From 1972-74 he was an assistant coach at Los Amigos (Calif.) High. He spent three seasons (1975-77) at Cerritos College as an assistant in charge of the linebackers.

Hughes played center for two years at San Jose State, earning a bachelor's degree in physical education. He received his master's in physical education from San Diego State in 1971. Hughes had earned All-America honors as a sophomore at El Camino (Calif.) Junior College in 1964. Hughes and his wife, Bonnie, have one daughter, Nicole (18).

STEVE MORTON

Offensive Line



Steve Morton's second year at Iowa State is his 14th in collegiate coaching and his 11th under Head Coach Jim Walden. The Chehalis, Wash., native coaches the Cyclone offensive line-the same position he held at Washington State for the past five seasons.

Morton coached the Washington State tight ends from 1978-81. He started his collegiate coaching stint at WSU in 1975 as an offensive line assistant. He was a defensive line assistant in 1976 and junior varsity and assistant offensive line coach in 1977.

Morton played at Grays Harbor (Wash.) Junior College in 1972 and 1973. He played two seasons and won the Outstanding Offensive Lineman Award, earning All-NWJC honors. Morton played guard and center at Washington State in 1973-74 before graduating with a bachelor's in physical education. The 34-year old Morton and his wife, Karen, are the parents of two children, Beau (12) and Bethany (8).

ROBIN ROSS

Defensive Coordinator



Robin Ross, Iowa State's defensive coordinator and inside linebacker coach begins his third season under Jim Walden. The Pico Rivera, Calif., native was the defensive line coach at Washington State in 1986.

Ross moved to Washington State after a two-year stint at Cincinnati. In 1984, he coached the defensive line and was strength and conditioning coordinator. In 1985, he was the defensive coordinator and defensive line coach. From 1979-83, Ross coached the defensive line and was the recruiting coordinator at Long Beach State. He started at CSLB as an assistant offensive line and tight end coach, a position he held during the 1977 and 1978 seasons.

Ross was a two-year starter (1974-75) at Washington State, where he earned second team all-conference honors and was an honorable mention All-America offensive tackle. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in education in 1977.

The 34-year old Ross was a first team allconference selection at offensive tackle in his second season at Rio Hondo (Calif.) College in 1973. Ross was a tenth-round choice of the San Francisco 49er's but signed as a free agent with Seattle and played the 1976 exhibition season. Ross is married to the former Jean Kwid.

MEL SANDERS

Middle Linebackers Defensive Tackles



Mel Sanders' second season at Iowa State is his 12th under Cyclone Head Coach Jim Walden. The Los Angeles, Calif., native played under Walden at Washington State for four seasons (1976-80) before joining the WSU coaching staff after graduating in 1981.

Sanders' first coaching assignment was assisting with the outside linebackers in 1981. In 1982, he tutored the WSU defensive line. Sanders assumed administrative and offensive line coaching duties in 1983. He coordinated the Freshmen Athlete Scholastic Training (FAST) program at Washington State.

The 30-year old Sanders was a four-year starter at Washington State, where he earned second-team freshman All-America honors from Football News. He injured his ankle in the 1977 season opener and was redshirted. Sanders came back to start the next three seasons for the Cougars. During the 1978 season, he was credited with 80 stops, ranking him second on the squad in tackles. He recorded 56 tackles in 1980, including two quarterback sacks. Sanders made 241 career tackles, including 149 solo stops in his career.

CYCLONE STADIUM / JACK TRICE FIELD



Without a doubt, the most beautiful and convenient football facility in the Big Eight Conference is the 50,000-seat Cyclone Stadium-Jack Trice Field. Located on a 30-acre tract, the stadium is part of the ISU Center on the southeast corner of the Ames campus.

In December of 1983, the Iowa State University football facility was officially named. The name of the stadium itself is Cyclone Stadium, with the field now named for and dedicated to Jack Trice, Iowa State's first black athlete, who died from injuries he received in his first major college football game in October 1923.

The stadium offers an unobstructed view of the playing field as well as remarkably easy access from all parts of the state. The ISU Center includes the stadium, James H. Hilton Coliseum, C. Y. Stephens Auditorium, J. W. Fisher Theater, the Carl Scheman Continuing Education Building, with lighted parking for 4,000 vehicles.

The stadium was completed in less than two years from the ground breaking, on October 26, 1973, to the first game, a victory over Air Force, on September 20, 1975.

In late 1973 and early '74, heavy

earth-moving equipment shaped the embankments. A huge, moveable form shaped the lower decks with thousands of cubic yards of concrete.

Originally, the stadium had a capacity of 42,500, all on the sidelines. In 1976, end-zone bleachers were constructed to bring the capacity to more than 48,000. Standing room tickets, sold for each game, bring the capacity to more than 50,000.

The record crowd was 54,101 for the 1987 Iowa State-Iowa game.

The press box is located between the upper and lower decks. There is seating for 123 sports reporters and eight broadcast teams as well as a cafeteria serving area and two photographic dark rooms. The press box is structured so that the media representatives can enter using ramps from either end of the stadium, eliminating the need for an elevator. There is an enclosed camera deck atop the west stands.

Opposite the press box on the east side is a modern club section, seating in theater seats. Included in the club section is a lounge as well as rest room facilities.

The stadium contains 16,000 tons of reinforced concrete, 1,000 tons of

structural steel and has a four-inchthick asphalt base under a new All-Pro Turf playing field. The All-Pro Turf, replaced in the summer of 1985, stretches from the edge of the stands on each side and 20 yards beyond each end zone. This allows for maximum practice space.

There are fully electronic scoreboards at each end of the stadium, while the north end area features the ISU Victory Bell, and a statue of Cy the Cardinal.

The Ralph A. Olsen Building is adjacent to the north end of the stadium. The Olsen Building, named in honor of the prominent Ellsworth farmer and alumnus, houses the athletic administration facilities.

Included in the Olsen Building are locker rooms, team meeting rooms, football coaching offices and staff rooms, the sports medicine clinic, Cyclone Club offices, athletic ticket offices and maintenance facilities.


The total cost of the stadium was \$7.6 million. It was paid for through contributions of alumni, friends and businesses to the Iowa State Foundation, as well as athletic receipts. More than 15,000 contributors have participated in ISU Foundation projects.




