Cyclones and Hawkeyes Seek Redemption Through Victory

otivation is never a problem when lowa State and lowa annually renew their intrastate football rivalry. As if the game was not enough to stimulate the senses of both squads, each team is seeking to atone for disappointing losses last weekend, as the two schools meet for the 37th time, before a sellout crowd and state-wide television and radio audiences.

lowa State was hampered by turnovers in a 30-20 loss to Minnesota last weekend in Ames. The Gophers outgained the Cyclones by a slim margin (366-336), but ISU lost three fumbles and suffered two interceptions that played a major factor in the contest's final outcome. There were several bright spots. Blaise Bryant rushed 29 times for 98 yards and two touchdowns. Quarterback Bret Oberg completed 18-of-25 passes for a career-high 231 yards. Former Ames and Iowa State quarterback John Glotfelty caught eight passes for 97 yards. Troy Moore snared four throws for 54 yards. All-Big Eight placekicker Jeff Shudak hit on field-goal attempts of 44- and 39-yards.

Iowa State's defense was led by junior line-backer Phil Navarro, who tallied 13 tackles.

Navarro, who was moved back to linebacker from the defensive line in fall drills, had seven unassisted stops against Minnesota. Senior free safety Tim Baker tallied eight tackles, giving him a teamhigh 26 stops through ISU's first two games. Linebacker Melvin Coleman came off the bench to record seven tackles, including one sack.


Walk-on players have made tremendous contributions to the lowa State football program under Jim Walden. Two defensive players in particular are making front-line efforts as walk-on competitors. Defensive tackle Travis Block and strong safety Jeff Bauer have earned starting spots this season. Block, a fisheries and wildlife biology major from Zwingle, has made 11 tackles, including two for losses and one sack. Bauer, a former Ankeny prep majoring in physical education, has made seven solo tackles in two contests.

lowa's 44-6 loss last weekend to Oregon (now ranked 22th on the AP poll) left fans with more questions than answers. Perhaps today's game will shed more light on just where the Hawkeyes sit on the collegiate football spectrum. There were a few individual performances bright enough to poke through an otherwise dark day for the Hawkeyes. Quarterback Matt Rodgers came off the bench to throw for 167 yards in the game's final 16 minutes. The redshirt freshman hit on 12-of-20 passes, including a 46-yard completion to tight end Michael Titley. He scored lowa's only touchdown on a six-yard bootleg in the fourth quarter.

Defensively, cornerback Merton Hanks was in on 11 tackles, including five solo stops. The junior also stopped an Oregon drive with an interception. Junior defensive lineman Jim Johnson had a solid day, making six solo tackles. Linebacker John Derby made eight tackles in his first collegiate start.

This season's game could come down, like last year's contest, to the final minutes. lowa held off Iowa State in the final seconds of last season's confrontation in Iowa City for a 10-3 victory. A 26yard touchdown pass from Chuck Hartlieb to Tony Stewart with 6:06 left in the third quarter broke a 3-3 deadlock. The Hawks carried that lead into the game's final two minutes. In their final possession, the Cyclones stunned the Kinnick Stadium crowd when Oberg hit Eddie Brown with a 58-yard pass that gave the Cyclones a first down at the lowa 11-yard line with less than a minute remaining. An interception by Iowa's Tork Hook let the Hawkeyes escape with the win. The Cyclones outgained the Hawks, 354-343, in total offense. Oberg finished the afternoon with 12 completions in 29 attempts for 238 yards. Dennis Ross made eight receptions for 120 yards. Stewart paced the lowa offense, with 32 carries for a career-high 194 yards.

lowa State's first road opponent will be Tulane, as the two schools will face each other next Saturday night at the Superdome in New Orleans. Game time is set for 7 p.m. lowa time. The Cyclones will then travel to Lawrence, Kans. for an Oct. 7 game that will be ISU's Big Eight opener. Game time is set for 1 p.m. lowa time. lowa State then returns home on Oct. 14 for a Homecoming showdown against sixth-rated Colorado. That game will start at 12:10 p.m. lowa time.

ince the first students enrolled at Iowa
State, the institution has been committed
to academic excellence. Iowa State's
reputation for scholarship is internationally
known and Iowa State's students are respected
nationwide as serious scholars.

Iowa State University was founded in 1868 under terms of the Land Grant College Act signed by President Abraham Lincoln during the Civil War. Since the beginning, Iowa State has been a co-educational "people's college". As years passed, the University developed a reputation as an outstanding broad-based institution with academic emphasis in the humanities and the arts, while maintaining its position in the scientific and technical fields. Recently, Iowa State has become known as a leading research center, renowned in the fields of engineering and agriculture.

There are ample opportunities for students to participate in theater, music, dance and intramural sports, as well as numerous academic and campus organizations. The Greek system is strong, as are the residence halls. Both have been nationally recognized, along with the top-notch academic advising program.



early three years ago, Iowa State University
President Dr. Gordon Eaton and Athletic
Director Max Urick began a search for a new
Cyclone football coach. The search was not only
for a football coach, but for a new direction, a new
personality and a new attitude for the Iowa State
program. Eaton and Urick found all of those
ingredients in Jim Walden, and on December 16,
1986, the former Washington State mentor
became Iowa State's 28th head football coach.

The personable native of Aberdeen, Mississippi arrived at ISU with "no magic formulas," just a promise to "come in here and do the best I can to work as hard as I know how." A glance at Walden's coaching record shows that his best has led to success at previous coaching stops.

His first ISU team finished 3-8-0 and demonstrated consistent improvement throughout the season. The Cyclone offense gained almost 4,000 yards and the ISU attack featured several trick plays.

His 1988 team improved to 5-6-0 and challenged for a winning season. The team finished fifth in the Big Eight Conference and took a 5-5-0 mark into the final game against Oklahoma State.

As the head coach at Washington State for nine years, Walden compiled a 44-52-4 record against tough Pacific-10 Conference competition. During that time, Walden guided the team to three winning seasons and four first-division finishes in the conference. He was one of only two WSU coaches to record more than one winning campaign, and only one other coach in Cougar history won more games or served longer as head coach than Walden.


Walden's Washington State teams became known for the upset victory. No opponent took a WSU team lightly, as the Cougars upset Pac-10 Conference powerhouses USC, UCLA and Washington during his years at the school. In fact, Washington State had great success against intrastate rival Washington, knocking the Huskies off in three of Walden's last five years in Pullman, Wash.

Offense was another trademark of Walden-coached teams at WSU, and his exciting, wide-open option attack had the Cougar offense ranked at the top of the conference. Washington State won three team rushing titles in Walden's last five years, along with two consecutive total offense titles in 1984 and 1985. The Cougar defense also showed improvement under Walden, rising from the lower echelons of the league to as high as third in 1981.

The 51-year-old Walden was actually at Washington State for 10 years, first serving as an assistant to Warren Powers. When Powers left WSU following the 1977 season, Cougar officials tabbed Walden as his replacement and Walden began building the Washington State program. The culmination of a four-year plan came when Walden took the Cougars to the 1981 Holiday Bowl, WSU's first bowl appearance since the 1931 Rose Bowl. WSU finished the season with an 8-3-1 mark, needing only a win in the regular-season finale to go to the Rose Bowl. In 1983, the Cougars were also within one game, a mid-season loss to UCLA, of winning the Pac-10 title and earning the Rose Bowl berth.

His success did not go unnoticed by his peers. Walden earned Pac-10 Coach-of-the-Year honors in 1981 and 1983. In 1981, he was the UPI West Coast and AFCA/Kodak District IX Coach-of-the-Year. Following the 1981 season, he was asked to be an assistant coach for the West squad in the Japan Bowl and at the East-West Shrine game that year. He was the head coach of the victorious West squad in the 1985 East-West Shrine Game, and was an assistant at the 1986 Hula Bowl.

Walden also brought stability to the WSU program. One of the keys to his success at Washington State was continuity on his staff over the years. Prior to the start of the 1986 season, all







of his assistant coaches had remained with him for at least five years, and several had been on the job since he became head coach at Washington State in 1978. When he accepted the job at Iowa State, Walden invited all nine of his assistant coaches to join him and seven of them did.

Despite spending 10 years in the Pac-10, Walden is familiar with Big Eight Conference football. He started his collegiate coaching career in 1969 at Nebraska under his former college coach, Bob Devaney. For the next four seasons, Walden was a defensive coach for the Cornhuskers. During those years Nebraska won two national championships.

From Nebraska, Walden moved to Miami (Fla.) in 1973 as an offensive backfield coach for Pete Elliott, and was later named defensive coordinator under Carl Selmer. Walden joined Warren Powers' Washington State staff as backfield coach for the 1977 season, and took over the head coaching job in 1978.

As a college quarterback at Wyoming, Walden guided the Cowboys to a pair of Skyline Conference titles. He was named both the conference and team Most Valuable Player in 1959, and played in the 1960 East-West Shrine Game. Following his college career, Walden signed with the British Columbia Lions of the Canadian Football League and played two seasons each with the Lions and Calgary. He coached Amory High School in his native Mississippi for five years before taking his first college job at Nebraska.

An excellent speaker, Walden is in demand for outside engagements. The NCAA has selected him twice as a guest speaker at its annual College Football Preview, in 1983 and 1985. Since coming to ISU, he's become a popular figure with both students and fans in appearances across the state. Since the day he was hired, Jim Walden has proven that he is the "right person" to bring a new direction, new attitude, and new personality to the lowa State football program.

429 S. Duff 515/232-6997 **The Series:** Iowa leads the series, 24-12. Iowa State's last series victory was a 19-7 win in Iowa City in 1982. In that game, the Cyclones rode the efforts of placekicker Alex Giffords and a fired up defense to capture their third straight win over the Hawkeyes. Iowa's only score gave the Hawks a 7-0 lead when Tony Wancket returned an intercepted first-quarter pass 26 yards for a touchdown. Giffords then went to work, kicking field goals of 26, 32, 25 and 24 yards. The Cyclones got an insurance tally when quarterback David Archer hit Frankie Leaks with a 46-yard touchdown pass. Iowa State's defense held lowa to just five first downs and 102 yards of total offense. ISU linebacker Mark Carlson was in on 11 tackles, two of them for losses. He also recovered a fumble. The Cyclones' last win in Ames was a 23-12 decision in 1981. Iowa leads the series at Cyclone Stadium, 3-1.

For the Record: Quarterback Bill Musgrave completed 20 of 27 passes for 263 yards and three touchdowns to lead Oregon to a 44-6 win over lowa last weekend in lowa City. The Ducks jumped out to a 24-0 halftime lead. Oregon's defense held lowa to 26 yards rushing in 28 attempts. The Hawkeyes committed seven turnovers in the game, their worst season-opening loss since 1909. Iowa quarterback Matt Rogers came off the bench to complete 12 of 20 passes for 167 yards. He also ran for a touchdown. Richard Bass had five carries for 21 yards for Iowa.

Offensively: Runningback Tony Stewart last season was lowa's first sophomore 1,000-yard rusher, despite a knee injury that shortened his season. Runningback Mike Saunders rushed for 123 yards and three touchdowns last season against Minnesota in relief of Stewart. Senior Tom Poholsky was the starting quarterback last weekend against Oregon, completing eight of 19 passes for 70 yards and two interceptions. Stewart carried the ball just three times for seven yards. The Hawks generated 263 yards of total offense against Oregon, 237 of it through the air.

Defensively: The leader of the lowa defense was supposed to be linebacker Brad Quast, who made 133 tackles last season. But the senior did not play against Oregon last weekend and his status is questionable this afternoon. Linebacker Melvin Foster had 10 tackles against Oregon, eight of them unassisted. Linebacker John Derby had eight tackles. Iowa allowed 435 yards of total offense against Oregon.

Kicking: Punter Sean Snyder punted seven times for a 33.9-yard average last weekend against Oregon. Placekicker Jeff Skillet was 11 of 24 on field-goal attempts last season. Teammate George Murphy was three of three. Punt returner Peter Marciano is the all-time leading returner in lowa history. He has averaged 6.2 yards per return thus far in his career. Marciano averaged 16.8 yards on four kickoff returns last weekend. Mike Saunders averaged 17.4 yards on five returns against the Ducks.

The Coach: Iowa head coach Hayden Fry is the fifth winningest active college football coach with a 166-130-8 record early into his 28th season. He coached 11 years (49-66-1) at SMU, six years at North Texas State (40-23-3), and is 77-41-4 into his 11th Hawkeye season. Fry is 7-3 against Iowa State.

Stadium Information

First Aid Station

Emergency medical treatment is available for spectators in special first aid quarters located under both the east and west stands. Contact the nearest usher to request medical assistance.

Ambulance Service

An ambulance is parked at the first aid quarters on the west side of the stadium.

Pass Out Checks

Persons leaving the stadium will be stamped for re-admission to the stadium. In addition, they must have a ticket stub for re-admission. No pass outs will be allowed between 12:30 and 1:00 p.m. or ½ hour before kickoff.

Service for Physicians

Doctors anticipating calls during the game are urged to register at the first aid quarters under the west stands, leaving their exact seat location. The management will see that all calls are delivered without delay.

Lost and Found

A lost and found service is maintained in the Athletic Ticket Office in the Olsen Building at the north end of the stadium. Articles found should be turned over to an usher or left at the Athletic Ticket Office.

Public Telephone

Pay telephones are located behind the east and west stands.

Refreshments

Refreshments are served in the stands and at locations around the stadium.

Iowa State Souvenirs

An attractive array of Iowa State souvenirs is available at conveniently located novelty sales booths throughout the stadium and from vendors in the parking areas.

Radios, Stadium Chairs, Umbrellas

As a courtesy to neighboring ticket holders, spectators are asked not to bring radios, stadium chairs, and umbrellas into the stands.

Rest Rooms


Rest rooms are located throughout the stadium behind each concession stand.

Public Address System

No appeals will be made over the public address system except under exceptional circumstances. The public is asked not to request this service.

Wheelchairs

Special areas in sections 18 and 19 are available for spectators in wheelchairs. In addition, wheelchair seating is available on the field level behind the goalposts.



No coolers of any size will be permitted in the stadium.

Carry-in Packages & Articles

Please do not bring into the stadium, bottles, cans, apples, oranges, toilet tissue, etc. Items thrown on the field can result in a penalty for the home team.

The State of Iowa code prohibits the use of alcohol in the Stadium. The Athletic Department asks our patrons to behave responsibly and in compliance with the State code.

Parking Lot Facilities

The ISU Athletic Department is one of the very few athletic facilities to provide portable toilets for their patrons in the parking lots. These are located in strategic spots throughout the stadium parking area.

Stadium Sign Policy

lowa State promotes and encourages the display of signs. All signs must be in good taste and supportive of lowa State University. Signs are to be displayed on the south end of the Olsen Building and on the walls of the stands, both upper and lower decks. In no case may the sign obstruct vision or endanger fans. Signs must be stationary. All signs must be approved by lowa State's athletic department. For sign approval, see Jim Overturf, Room 137 Olsen Building, before noon on Friday prior to home games. The athletic department

reserves the right to move or remove any signs not meeting these specifications.

Emergency Road Service

Iowa State University and Iowa AAA Motor Club will provide an Emergency Road Service for persons attending home football games. This service will be in effect during and within two hours after the game throughout the season. The phone number for the service is 292-2303. Proof of game attendance (i.e.; ticket stub) may be requested.

Distractions

We want to make football Saturday a totally enjoyable experience and want to encourage you to be respectful of those around you in the stadium. This attitude of cooperation can help to insure pleasant, enthusiastic game atmosphere. In the event you feel there is unreasonable distraction in your seating area, we ask you to take the following steps to help us control undesirable behavior:

-Note the seating section, row and seat number(s), and inform the usher in your section of the disturbance. The usher will observe the conduct and request it to stop, if appropriate.

-If the conduct continues, the usher will get assistance from a uniformed policeman to request improvement of behavior or to remove the fan(s) from the stadium.

-An additional occurrence is cause for removal from the stadium and could be grounds for relocation in next season's ticket assignment.





ordon P. Eaton, Iowa State's 12th
president, came to the position as an
acclaimed and well established scholar,
administrator and scientist. To this list should be
added the further accolades of distinguished
researcher, public speaker, author, editor and
teacher. Since taking office on July 1, 1986, Eaton
has provided leadership that has made an impact
on every department and segment of the campus
community as Iowa State University continues to
improve its facilities, academic programs and
student services.

Eaton was born March 9, 1929, in Dayton, Ohio. He received a B.A. in geology and mathematics "With High Honors and High Distinction" in 1951 from Wesleyan University, Middletown, Conn., a Master's in geology in 1953 and a Ph.D. in geology and geophysics in 1957 from the California Institute of Technology.

He served on the faculty of Wesleyan University from 1955 to 1959, and on the University of California, Riverside faculty from 1959 to 1963. He was on academic leave from the University of California from 1963 to 1965 to serve as project chief for the U.S. Geological Survey in Denver, Colo., for geological investigations of bentonite deposits and ground water resources. He returned to the University of California, Riverside, in 1965 as associate professor and chairperson of the department of geological sciences.

From 1967 to 1981 Eaton was with the U.S. Geological Survey, serving in a number of administrative and scientific positions, including: project chief for the Southwestern Geophysics Project, Regional Geophysics Branch, for the study of mineral and ground water resources in Arizona, New Mexico and Colorado; deputy chief of the Office of Geochemistry and Geophysics, Washington, D.C.; project chief for geothermal geophysics, Branch of Theoretical and Applied Geophysics; scientist-in-charge of the Hawaiian Volcano Observatory; and associate chief geologist, Geologic Division, at the national headquarters in Reston, Va.

In 1981 he was appointed dean of the College of Geosciences at Texas A & M, which includes the departments of geology, geophysics, oceanography, meteorology and geography. In 1983 he was named provost and vice president for academic affairs.

An established scholar and scientist in regional geology and geophysical synthesis and interpretation, Eaton is the author or co-author of publications on such subjects as the mineral resources in numerous regions of the Western United States; geophysical observations of Kilauea Volcano, Hawaii; regional gravity and tectonic patterns; ground water investigations and resources; volcanic ash deposits; petroleum potential of the U.S. Atlantic Coastal Plain and mining geophysics in the Soviet Union.

He has taught physical geology, mineralogy, structural geology, petrology and introductory geophysics, all at the undergraduate level, and exploration geophysics, fundamental geology and research courses at the graduate level.

Awards he has received include: Best Paper of the Colorado Scientific Society in 1975 and 1976, U.S. Government Senior Executive Performance



Award in 1980 and Wesleyan University
Distinguished Alumnus Award in 1981. He was
chairman of the Geophysics Division of the
Geological Society of America during 1978-79 and
has been an invited speaker to universities in
seven states and Iceland, and to eight major
geoscience association assemblies in this country
and abroad. He is a member of Phi Beta Kappa
honor society, Sigma Xi research honor society,
and is a member and fellow of the Geological
Society of America. He is also a member of the
American Council on Education, the American
Association for Higher Education, American
Geophysical Union, and the American Association
for the Advancement of Science.


He has served as a representative to the U.S. National Committee for Rock Mechanics and the National Research Council, a member of the editorial board for the Geological Society of America's Decade of North American Geology, associate editor of the "Journal of Volcanology and Geothermal Resources" and co-editor of the Geological Society of America "Memoir 152." He was also a member of the Geophysics Study Committee for the Assembly of Mathematical and Physical Sciences for the National Research Council, Washington, D.C. He serves as a member of the American Council on Education, the Commission on International Education, the Board of Directors of the Borlaug International Heritage Project and the Board of Directors of Living History Farms, and is President of the Board of Directors of the Iowa 4-H Foundation.

Eaton and his wife Virginia have two grown children.

ince the official groundbreaking on June 10, 1986, Iowa State University has watched with anticipation as the concrete, steel and glass were formed and shaped into the Charles W. Durham and Margre Henningson Durham Center for Computation and Communication.

The \$12 million Durham Center signifies yet another step for ISU as it leads the way in applying the latest computer technology to instruction and research, thereby strengthening its commitment to quality and efficiency in student learning and creating new knowledge. With this new center, ISU, birthplace of the electronic digital computer, is poised to exert its leadership in today's dynamic information society.

ISU's Computation Center and Telecommunications Office are housed in the Durham Center. Additional space for the Department of Electrical Engineering and Computer Engineering also has been provided.

With three times the space of its old location, the Computation Center will continue to be the electronic nerve center for campus-wide computer systems. It represents one of the most carefully planned and visionary facilities of its type in the country. This expanded center will serve as a powerful tool for instruction and research, as well as a central storage place for information accessible to students, faculty and staff.

Already, the Durham Center has made it possible to double the size of the university's high performance scientific computing system, an impos-

sibility under the confines of the Computation Center's previous location. This is the first of many such steps the university will take as the Durham Center opens new doors of opportunities.

The Durham Center's striking design was provided by the engineering and architectural firm of Henningson Durham & Richardson, Inc. (HDR). HDR was owned and operated for years by one of the building's namesakes, Charles (Chuck) Durham, and founded by H.H. Henningson, a 1907 graduate of lowa State and the father of the building's other namesake, Margre Henningson Durham. Chuck and Margre Durham, both 1939 ISU graduates, provided the impetus for this new center with their \$3,000,000 donation, the largest gift ever made to Iowa State.

The north half of the building is a pyramidal structure; the south half is rectangular. These two structures are united by a spacious walk-through atrium and topped by a cross-shaped copper cupola.

Placing the Durham Center adjacent to the Parks Library and major engineering and mathematical departments creates an academic complex of distinction and utility. Architecturally, the Durham Center provides an effective and attractive link between historic Marston Hall and the modern new wing of the Parks Library.

The new Durham Center lays the foundation for greatly expanded academic computing resources at lowa State, reinforcing the university's motto of "Science with Practice."

"student" comes first in the term
"student athlete" for a very good reason:
being a student **must** come first to keep
the privilege of competing in intercollegiate
athletics. Almost 485 student-athletes in 21 team
sports budget their time and energy to practice,
travel, and compete while enrolled as full-time
students. The Athletic Academic Services staff,
which includes director Steve McDonnell and
counselors Marty McFadden, Kathy Lyons and Ed
Banach, helps ISU student-athletes become the
most successful students they can be, through an
individualized blend of the programs.

New Student-Athlete Orientation

An orientation session is held each semester to welcome all new student-athletes to ISU. The athletic academic counselors provide information about university procedures such as registration, fee payment, and residence hall living. They also explain eligibility requirements, academic support services, and athletic department rules. The counselors help the new student-athletes become familiar with the campus layout and generally assist in their transition to college life at ISU.

Student-Athlete Handbook

ISU student-athletes are given a practical handbook full of up-to-date information about NCAA, Big Eight, and university regulations, plus a list of commonly used local phone numbers. The calendar portion of the handbook can be used for reminders of important dates and for time management purposes.

Study Tables

Regularly scheduled study tables are sponsored for all ISU athletic teams, giving student-athletes a consistent time and place for studying and for meeting with tutors. In addition, the athletic academic counselors instruct student-athletes in study skills and time management techniques.

Tutoring Services

Tutors are available for ISU student-athletes to learn more rapidly, to prepare more thoroughly for classes and tests, and to develop more effective study habits. As a result, student-athletes generally experience reduced test anxiety and improved grades.

The Write Place

This service provides tutoring help when studentathletes write papers for any course at ISU. The staff works individually with student-athletes on whatever skills they need to improve, including punctuation, spelling, expression, formatting, and proofreading. The student-athletes become independent writers as they learn writing skills that will transfer to on-the-job situations and improve their course grades.

Educational Programs

The staff of the Athletic Academic Services unit presents instructional programs on study skills, time management, and stress management to groups of student-athletes, especially in study table settings.

Career Exploration

Student-athletes need preparation for their lives after college. The athletic academic counselors, in conjunction with on-campus resource people, help student-athletes identify their interests and aptitudes, explore college degree programs and related careers, and learn how to write resumes and application letters.

Monitoring of Academic Progress

The main duty of the athletic academic counselors is to identify problems early in each semester and assist in resolving them. They maintain frequent contact with the academic advisers in each college to stay informed about student-athletes' academic status and satisfactory progress within their degree programs. The counselors also send out academic progress report forms to instructors so that they can check the student-athletes' class standings, be alerted to possible tutoring needs, and encourage improved performance.



Intervention/Referral

The athletic academic counselors work with the Student Counseling Service and the Dean of Students Office in diagnosing and resolving the problems faced by student-athletes. Such problems might be personal (coping with a parent's illness, for example) or academic (dealing with a learning disability in the college classroom).

Advocacy

The staff of Athletic Academic Services acts on behalf of student-athletes in negotiating the university system. Student-athletes can receive help in dealing with instructors and administrators to achieve better working relationships within the classroom and the university.

Athletic Academic Recognition Dinner

Those student-athletes who have performed well in the classroom are recognized at a special banquet held in their honor every spring. Invited are those who have achieved a grade point average of at least a 3.00 within the previous two semesters, as are those who have significantly improved their academic performances. Also in attendance are university administrators, faculty members, and athletic department personnel.

Graduation Reception

Each spring, the athletic department sponsors a celebration of graduation for student-athletes, their families, and their friends in the company of department members.



Men's Basketball Team Enters Rigorous Season Laden with Talent

n paper, the 1989-90 Iowa State men's basketball team could be Johnny Orr's best at Iowa State. More than half of the team's rebounding and scoring return, along with three of the six players who could be considered as starters during last year's 17-12 campaign.

Leading the way is junior Victor Alexander, the 6-9 center who developed into the league's most dominant big man by the end of the 1989 season. Alexander averaged 19.9 points per game as a sophomore, and was named a first-team all-Big Eight selection by the Associated Press. An honorable mention All-America choice of *The Sporting News*, he was also named the team's MVP, Outstanding Offensive Player and Outstanding Rebounder. This past summer, the Detroit, Mich., native played for the U.S. team at the World University Games, which was highlighted by a 16-point effort against Poland.

For the first time in years, Orr has more than one big man to control the boards. Junior Phil Kunz, a transfer from Illinois in 1988, is eligible this season, providing ISU with another husky 6-9 player with scoring ability. Kirk Baker (6-8) was the 1987-88 Division II National Junior College Player of the Year at Lansing Community College in Michigan. At ISU, he is expected to give the Cyclones more rebounding and shot-blocking firepower.

Junior Mark Baugh looks to be a starter once again at forward, after being named the team's Most Improved Player a year ago. With a 13.3 ppg average, Baugh was the squad's second-leading scorer, while holding the top spot in steals with 41. In January, he hit 11-of-11 shots vs. Western Illinois, establishing a new ISU and Hilton Coliseum record for field goal percentage in a game.

Last year's hard-luck story starred Paul Doer-rfeld, who returns healthy for his junior season. After earning a starting position and recording his most productive game ever in an 88-58 win at Creighton, he was sidelined with an apendectomy for five weeks. Doerrfeld, a 6-7 part-time starter in 1987-88, earned his spot back but was again sidelined three games later with a knee injury that forced him to take an injury redshirt. A solid defender and rebounder, he was a member of the Big Eight Select Team that toured Australia during the summer. Doerrfeld played in all nine contests, averaging 7.4 ppg and 2.2 rpg.

At point guard, the Cyclones welcome back twoyear starter Terry Woods. The Waterloo native led ISU in assists for the second consecutive year in 1989, recording 158. At the Phenix NCAA Ball Tournament in Tokyo, he scored 13 points with four assists vs. Bradley to take MVP honors. With 391 career assists, he enters his senior year third on the ISU all-time assist chart behind Jeff Hornacek (665) and Gary Thompkins (600).

The Cyclone "long ball" attack will be strengthened by sophomore walk-on Brian Pearson. The Palmer native played in 19 games during the 1988-89 season, scoring a career-high 13 points against Oklahoma last January. From three-point range the 6-2 guard hit a solid 11-of-27. In July, Pearson was a member of an Iowa AAU 19-and-under unit that toured the Soviet Union.

Iowa State's biggest test could come in replacing forward Marc Urquhart and guard Mike Born. Urguhart started 17 games in '89, and was named the team's Outstanding Defensive Player, Against Illinois-Chicago last January, he posted the first triple-double ever recorded by an ISU player (10 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists) since assists started being kept in the early 1970's. Born broke or tied five school records last season, and was selected captain of UPI's all-Big Eight Conference Surprise Team. The West Des Moines native established a new single-season free-throw shooting percentage mark, sinking 87-of-99 from the line for an average of .879. He also broke his own school record for three-point goals in a season with 39. In addition, he set a career three-point goal record with 75. Born hit his 21st consecutive free throw in the second half against Missouri last February to break the old record of 20 set by Ron Harris during the 1984-85 season. He rounded out his collegiate career by tying the school record for three-point goals scored in a game with five vs. Oklahoma State.

In addition to their changes in personnel, the Cyclones will find an even tougher challenge in this year's schedule. Along with the always-competitive Big Eight Conference, ISU will face Big Ten powerhouses Indiana and Iowa, along with last year's national champion Michigan.

The Cyclones open up the 1989-90 season on Nov. 11 with an exhibition game against the Australian National team. Tip-off is set for 7 p.m. in Hilton Coliseum.

New Era Holds Promise, High Aspirations for Women's Basketball

It garners respect, acceptance and recognition.

It demands talent, intelligence and dedication. For the 1989-90 women's basketball team, a new decade could see those demands being met, establishing the foundation for unprecedented and unlimited success.

"There is a renewed enthusiasm among our players this year; a real sense of pride and determination," said head coach Pam Wettig. "We came so close to our goals during the 1988-89 season, and that has definitely had a positive effect on the team's outlook. We know our potential. Now it's time to put it to full use."

The Cyclones are coming off a 15-13 season, their first winning record in the last three years. With a 6-8 mark and fifth-place finish in the Big Eight Conference, ISU was not to be taken for granted, creating a new obstacle for league opponents.

That obstacle will remain on the court this season, as the Cyclones return both their leading scorer and rebounder to challenge for conference honors.

Senior Vanessa Ward enters her final campaign as Iowa State's top offensive threat, and has the potential to be among the Big Eight's best. In her first full-time role as a starter in '89, Ward led the team in scoring with an average of 12.1 points per game. Named twice to all-tournament teams, she set a career high with 25 points vs. Yale, scoring in double figures 20 times.

"Vanessa is a very influential part of this team," Wettig said. "Her leadership qualities will be crucial in determining the impact we will have throughout the season."

Joining Ward is two-year starter Shelly Coyle. The Spring Green, Wis. native came on strong during the latter part of the season, posting double figures in both scoring and rebounding in four of the last seven games. Coyle wrapped up the year averaging 5.8 rebounds per game to lead the squad. But among conference foes she was at her best, holding the top spot in rebounding (6.9 avg.) and scoring (11.6 avg.).

Iowa State's supporting cast should also attract attention, with two of the remaining seven letterwinners strengthened by starting experience.

Lynne Lorenzen started 15 games as a sophomore last season, averaging 6.6 points per contest. Strong inside the lane, Lorenzen's greatest contribution came from the free-throw line, where she shot a solid 60 percent (24-of-40). Leslie Maple stepped in quickly to provide some needed speed at the guard position a year ago, joining the starting five on eight occasions. As a freshman, she posted 30 assists and 25 steals.

Several upperclassmen will get the first true test of their collegiate careers as they look to move into starting positions. Laurie Decker, Kirsten Beach and Sanquenetta Davis served as the Cyclones' top reserves in 1989, but will find their roles expanded in the coming year.

Decker led the team with 17 three-point goals last season, and will be counted on for a more diversified offensive output. Beach enjoyed her most productive season as a sophomore, showing definite leadership potential in 19 appearances. Davis was the defensive spark plug for the Cyclones, whose physical, no-nonsense style of play gave ISU the edge off the boards. This year, however, Wettig hopes to take advantage of her offensive abilities as well.

Rounding out the returnees are Mardi Pfannebecker and Nichelle Jenkins. Although both have seen limited playing time, each has made major contributions off the court, with the capability to put their hard-earned skills into full-time roles.

"Balance will be a real strength of this team," Wettig said. "We have the maturity, and a good mixture of leadership styles. This is a very goal-oriented, high achieving team. Our expectations are more clearly defined than ever before."

Assisting in the Cyclones' efforts are four newcomers who could take on key roles as the season progresses.

Leading the way is sophomore Tynnetta Rasheed, who sat out last season due to the NCAA's Proposition 48 ruling. The Savannah, Ga., native averaged 23.6 points per game in 1988, and was selected for both all-state and all-region honors. Kim Van Deest, Cledella Evans and Shanda Fitzgerald make up this year's freshman class, which possesses the speed and agility necessary to bring variety to the ISU game plan.

"The Cyclones will be exciting to watch," Wettig said. "We have a team that really plays hard and with great intensity. Our efforts will make us a fun team to see."







Cyclone Academic Success Highlights 1988-89 School Year

The Iowa State University Athletic Department's commitment to serving its student-athletes is underscored by the scholastic success achieved by Cyclone competitors last season. In all, 87 ISU athletes earned Big Eight Conference Honor Roll recognition for maintaining a grade point average of 3.0 or higher during the 1988-89 academic year and earning a varsity letter in their respective sports.

A total of 38 Iowa State athletes earned firstteam all-Big Eight academic honors last season, the highest total in school history. An additional 39 ISU athletes earned honorable mention all-Big Eight academic recognition.

Among these student-athletes are six individuals who were recognized by ISU as high scholarship honorees for last season. Blake Rhodes, a member of the ISU men's track team, had a 3.97 GPA in finance; golfer Hank McFarland had a 3.93 GPA in business; and men's tennis player Owe Pipkorn had a 3.93 GPA in chemistry.

A member of the women's cross country team, Charlene Letzring, was recognized for academic excellence for the third straight year, after earning a 3.91 GPA in animal ecology. Letzring's teammate Lisa Skidmore, who owns a 4.0 grade point in biology, was recognized by the Iowa State Athletic Department for the second straight year. Women's gymnastics team member Amy Rechenmacher received recognition for her 3.91 GPA in civil engineering.




He is married to the former Heidi Julich.


He is the father of two daughters, Valerie (21) and Kimberly (18).


Dave and his wife, Peggy, are the parents of two daughters, Catherine Lynn (7) and Christina (5).

As a sophomore at El Camino (Calif.) Junior College, Hughes earned All-America honors in 1964.

Offensive Line


A 10th-round choice of the San Francisco 49er's, Ross signed as a free agent with the Seattle Seahawks and played the 1976 exhibition season.

ne of the most integral aspects of any intercollegiate athletic program is a sound strength and conditioning program. Iowa State recognizes this area as a crucial ingredient to the overall success of all 21 men's and women's intercollegiate sports offered at the university. Under the supervision of seventh-year strength and conditioning director Tom Wilson and his assistant Steve Ballenger, Iowa State's student-athletes have made tremendous strides.

The overall goal of Iowa State's program is to keep athletes healthy and prepared for competition by reducing their susceptibility to injury. This is accomplished by a computer-analyzed combination of a strict strength and conditioning program, a good diet, and sufficient rest.

"Iowa State offers its athletes proven strength and conditioning programs," said Wilson, who previously served four years in the nationally acclaimed program at the University of Nebraska. "ISU has excellent facilities designed to enhance the athletes' performances and help them realize their maximum potential. We work with everyone from the 'blue-chip' athlete to the unknown walk-on—our program is intended to help everyone. And utilizing such a strictly supervised program not only produces great physical results, but also increases the athletes' confidence when they become stronger, faster, and more disciplined than their opponents."


lowa State's strength and conditioning program is conducted throughout the calendar year. During the summer and winter months, athletes go through conditioning and strength training four times per week. The four aerobic workouts consist of concentrating on speed drills and

plyometrics two days per week, with the other two spent on conditioning and agility drills. Strength training is also very rigid, with the athlete working a minimum of $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours per workout, and alternating three body parts per day.

During the fall season and spring workouts, maintaining strength and the level of conditioning obtained during the winter and summer months is the primary objective. The goal is for athletes to be as strong for the season finale as they were for the season opener. This is accomplished by following a four-day per week workout schedule, with each player lifting and stretching for approximately 20-30 minutes per day.

Prior to the implementation of a strength and conditioning program, every player is evaluated in six areas. Each athlete is tested on upper and lower body strength, flexibility, agility, power, speed (40-yard dash and 10-yard splits), and cardiovascular endurance. The testing results are then entered into the program's computer and analyzed to illustrate strengths and weaknesses. Each athlete meets individually with the strength and conditioning director to evaluate the results and establish appropriate goals.

"Our program is set up to meet the needs of the individual athlete according to the testing evaluation and the athlete's goal," said Wilson. "We also take into consideration the needs and demands of the sport. All training done is very sport specific."

ithout a doubt, the most beautiful and convenient football facility in the Big Eight Conference is the 50,000-seat Cyclone Stadium-Jack Trice Field. Located on a 30-acre tract, the stadium is part of the ISU Center on the southeast corner of the Ames campus.

In December of 1983, the Iowa State University football facility was officially named. The name of the stadium itself is Cyclone Stadium, with the field now named for and dedicated to Jack Trice, Iowa State's first black athlete, who died from injuries he received in his first major college football game in October 1923.

The stadium offers an unobstructed view of the playing field, as well as remarkably easy access from all parts of the state. The ISU Center includes the stadium, James H. Hilton Coliseum, C. Y. Stephens Auditorium, J. W. Fisher Theater, the Carl Scheman Continuing Education Building, with lighted parking for 4,000 vehicles.

The stadium was completed in less than two years, from the ground breaking on October 26, 1973, to the first game, a victory over Air Force on September 20, 1975.

In late 1973 and early '74, heavy earth-moving equipment shaped the embankments. A huge, moveable form shaped the lower decks with thousands of cubic yards of concrete.

Originally, the stadium had a capacity of 42,500, all on the sidelines. In 1976, end-zone bleachers were constructed to bring the capacity to more than 48,000. Standing room tickets, sold for each game, bring the capacity to more than 50,000.

The record crowd was 54,101 for the 1987 lowa State-lowa game.

The press box is located between the upper and lower decks. There is seating for 123 sports reporters and eight broadcast teams, as well as a

cafeteria serving area and two photographic dark rooms. The press box is structured so that the media representatives can enter using ramps from either end of the stadium, eliminating the need for an elevator. There is an enclosed camera deck atop the west stands.

Opposite the press box on the east side is a modern club section with theater seats. Included in the club section is a lounge, as well as rest room facilities.

The stadium contains 16,000 tons of reinforced concrete, 1,000 tons of structural steel, and has a four-inch-thick asphalt base under a new All-Pro Turf playing field. The All-Pro Turf, replaced in the summer of 1985, stretches from the edge of the stands on each side and 20 yards beyond each end zone. This allows for maximum practice space.

There are fully electronic scoreboards at each end of the stadium, while the north end area features the ISU Victory Bell, and a statue of Cy the Cardinal.

The Ralph A. Olsen Building is adjacent to the north end of the stadium. The Olsen Building, named in honor of the prominent Ellsworth farmer and alumnus, houses the athletic administration facilities.

Included in the Olsen Building are locker rooms, team meeting rooms, football coaching offices and staff rooms, the sports medicine clinic, Cyclone Club offices, athletic ticket offices and maintenance facilities.

The total cost of the stadium was \$7.6 million. It was paid for through contributions of alumni, friends and businesses to the Iowa State Foundation, as well as through athletic receipts. More than 15,000 contributors have participated in ISU Foundation projects.




Iowa State 1979-82, Cincinnati Bengals 1983-

Reimers, a six-year veteran, was a key in the successful Cincinnati running attack that helped propel the Bengals to a Super Bowl berth last season.

Iowa State 1983-86, Detroit Lions 1987-

Former ISU linebacker Dennis Gibson, an eighth-round pick of the Detroit Lions in the 1987 NFL draft, beat the odds to become a starter through his first two professional seasons and a statistical leader on the Lion defense.





Iowa State 1982-83, Atlanta Falcons 1984-87, San Diego Chargers 1989-

Former Cyclone quarterback David Archer signed with San Diego this past summer. The Chargers are led by head coach Dan Henning, who was Archer's coach during the former Cyclone's four-year stint with the Atlanta Falcons.

Iowa State 1979-82, New York Giants 1983-

Fighting his way back into the New York Giant lineup last season was former Iowa State offensive lineman Karl Nelson. Nelson's courageous comeback from cancer received national attention. It was Nelson who helped pave the way to the 1987 World Championship as a blocker for Joe Morris and Phil Simms.





Iowa State 1980-83, Tampa Bay Buccaneers 1984-

Iowa State career tackle leader Chris Washington has been a linebacker for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers since 1984.

Iowa State, 1975-78, Houston Oilers 1979-85, Minnesota Vikings 1986-87, Tampa Bay Buccaneers 1987-88, Kansas City Chiefs 1988.

ISU's senior NFL veteran is defensive lineman Mike Stensrud, who currently plays for the Kansas City Chiefs. Stensrud, an all-Big Eight selection in 1976, 1977, and 1978 has played for the Houston Oilers, the Minnesota Vikings, the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, and the Chiefs during his decade of NFL experience.



The long list of Iowa State players who went on to professional careers starts with Lew Reeve, who played one season with the Chicago Tigers in 1920. Over the years, ex-Cyclones Matt Blair, Jim Doran and Dan Johnson, among others, have made their marks on the National Football League. In all, 60 former Iowa State football players have played one or more seasons in the professional league, including runningback Joe Henderson, a 10th-round selection of the New Orleans Saints in 1989.



Thibodeaux: A Leader On and Off the Field

As a leader on the gridiron, Thibodeaux realizes he is a role model and must constantly display a positive outlook among his teammates.

"Your actions and the way you try to conduct yourself on the field are being watched by other people," Thibodeaux said. "When you're elected as a captain, and they see you not working as hard as you can, then they might feel that they don't have to work either. It's up to me to keep a positive mental attitude from day-to-day."

In addition to leading his teammates, Thibodeaux has the responsibility of guiding the ISU student body. Although some people have questioned his commitment due to his rigid time constraints, Thibodeaux feels it is his job to budget time for the president's duties. However, he admits he has to set priorities.

"The main reason I came to Iowa State was to play Division I football and get an education," Thibodeaux said. "I set these two priorities above anything else. While I'm fortunate to have the GSB office, and I have fun doing it, I wouldn't let either football or academics slip in order to have the best student government in the country."

Although he idolizes the work ethic of former Chicago Bears runningback Walter Payton and Dr. Martin Luther King, Thibodeaux said his mother was his anchor in developing his determination for success.

"My mother, Alma, dedicated her life to making sure that her four children were raised properly, and making sure that we had things to do to keep us off the street," Thibodeaux said.

A majority of Thibodeaux's childhood was devoted to athletics, with football and baseball receiving primary attention. The St. Rita High prep rushed for 1,230 yards and scored 17 touchdowns his senior season, and received 1984 Chicago Catholic League Player-of-the-Year honors.

Over the five years at Iowa State, number 31 has made some explosive plays — last year's 67-yard touchdown run against Nebraska; and a 73-yard touchdown run against Kansas in 1987 with a career-high 81 yards in that game. As a freshman, he was ISU's top kick returner with a team-high 10 kickoff receptions for 164 yards.

The co-captain hopes the 1989 Cyclones can improve on last year's 5-6 record, and ultimately reach a bowl game. And getting there begins with positive thinking.

"This year we have a bunch of guys that want to win and won't settle for anything less," Thibodeaux said. "We have been producing with the players we have available. We try to deal with the situation that is within our control, and try to maintain a good football team working towards a winning season."

One key to a successful Cyclone football team is establishing a solid running game, and Thibodeaux is pleased to be flanked by Blaise Bryant.

"When I do the best I can to block for Blaise, I know that he will hit the hole hard and fast," Thibodeaux said. "With Blaise back there along with the other runningbacks, we can establish a running game, and consequently, that helps improve our passing game."

During his collegiate career, the three-time letterwinner has seen his share of transitions, including two different head coaches and five runningback coaches. However, the biggest change he has seen is in himself.

"I've learned to prepare myself for competitive situations and learned how to make it in life," Thibodeaux said. "So many things we do in football are very strenuous and physical, and only the strong survive. I've learned how to persevere and make it. What you have to do to prepare yourself for the game also prepares yourself for life. Football helps you to accept disappointment and relish the good times."

en's Athletic Trainer Frank Randall, his assistant Steve Stricker, and Women's Athletic Trainer Alice McLaine direct Iowa State's sports medicine programs. The men's and women's athletic training staffs work closely with each of Iowa State's teams and, along with the team physicians, apply the most recent techniques in the field of sports medicine.

The training staffs are headquartered in four locations on the ISU campus—the Olsen Building, James H. Hilton Coliseum, Beyer Hall, and the new Physical Education Building. The staff also works closely with the team physician, Dr. Alan Philippi, and orthopedic surgeons at McFarland Clinic.

The athletic training room, equipment room, and weight room comprise the conditioning component of the athletic program. In the training room, athletic trainers deal with the prevention, treatment, and rehabilitation of athletic injuries. Each trainer must have working knowledge of the other two areas, however, to properly care for athletes.


Prevention includes taping and padding different areas of the body. Each football player gets both ankles taped prior to every workout and game. All players except wide receivers and defensive backs also are equipped with lightweight protective knee braces for each practice and game. Randall played an integral part in the development of the knee brace, which is now being marketed nationwide.

Treatment of athletic injuries is another valuable aspect of the sports medicine program. Treatment methods can be as simple as applying a bag of ice to the injured area, or as complex as utilizing electrical muscle stimulation. Each injured athlete receives at least three treatments



per day during the season. Most of the treatment units are portable and give the athletes the advantage of treatment at home or on the road.

Rehabilitation is necessary following an injury or surgery. Along with receiving treatment, the athlete is tested with various flexibility and strength exercises. All athletes are supervised by a member of the training staff from the first day of rehabilitation until it is completed.
