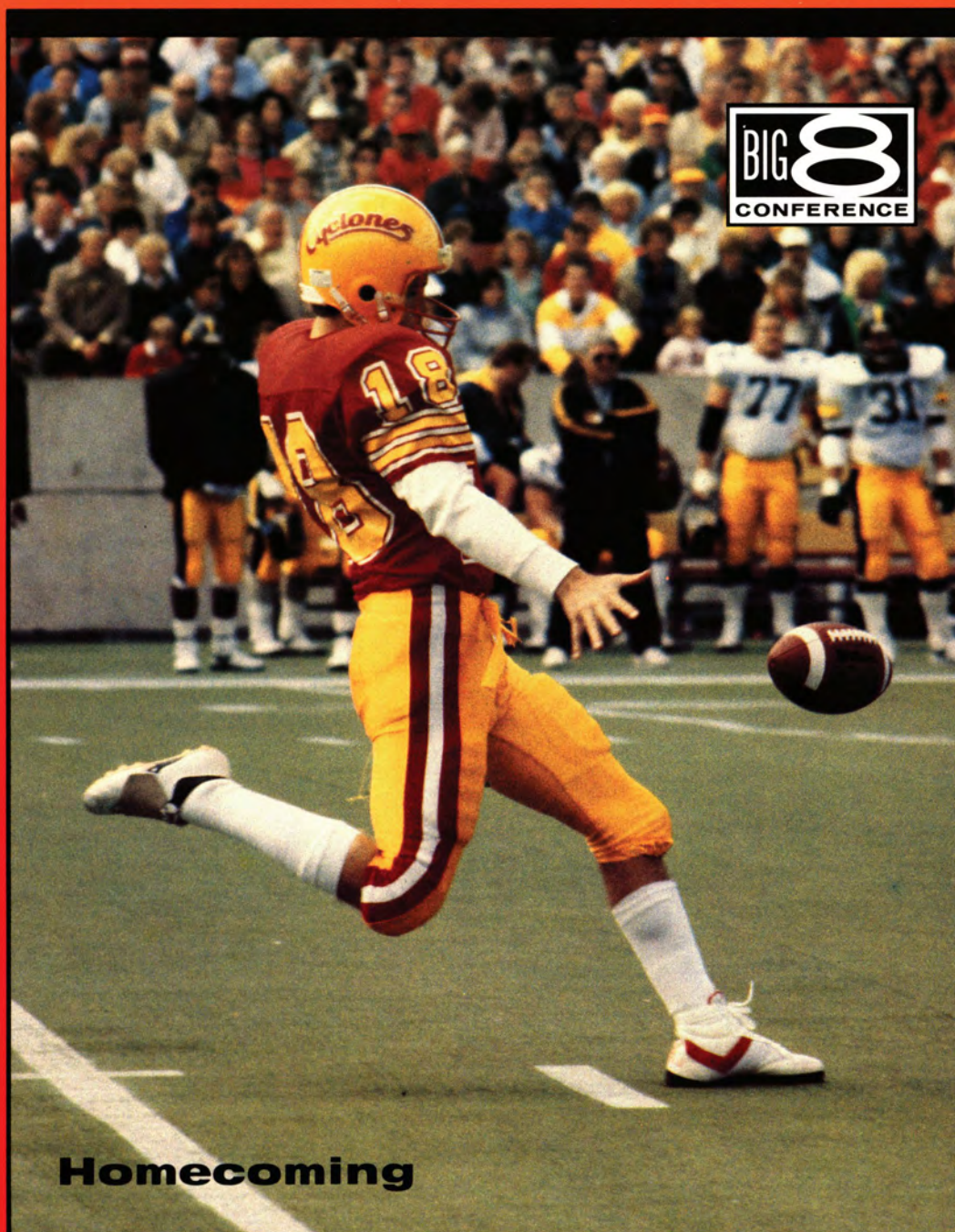

CYCLONES HOPE TO BITE INTO BUFF-BONE

Homecoming, Oct. 31, 1987

Cyclone Stadium/Jack Trice Field

Rebuilding takes time. Just ask Colorado head coach Bill McCartney. The former Michigan assistant was 7-25-1 in his first three seasons at the Golden Buffalo helm, including a 1-10 mark in 1984. Since then, he is 17-14, 11-6 in Big Eight play. That stretch includes two Bowl Game appearances and a victory over Nebraska last season. The 4-3 Buffaloes are the latest challenge for Jim Walden's small but feisty squad that is laying the foundation for Iowa State's rebuilding job.

Most everyone expected Colorado to have a formidable rushing attack this season. After all, the Buffaloes started the fall with 18 fifth-year seniors, and 44 returning lettermen. Sixteen starters returned from the 1986 Big Eight runner-up football team and all told, over 100 players returned from that Bluebonnet Bowl team, with 88 of those players present in 1985 when Colorado was the most improved team in the NCAA.

Colorado is rushing the ball effectively, but the CU ground game is being propelled by newcomers. Sophomore quarterback Sal Aunese, who sat out last season, has been CU's leading rusher with 429 yards on 88 carries. Freshman halfback Eric Bieniemy, like Aunese, a former California prep, has gained 355 yards on 69 carries, including a 185-yard effort against Washington State.

Freshman redshirt Michael Simmons has gained 324 yards on 65 carries and a 142-yard rushing contest against Oregon. Last year's starting quarterback, Mark Hatcher, has rushed for 230 yards. Buffalo rushers are averaging 307.1 yards per game and 4.9 yards per carry.

Defensively, the veteran Colorado defense, which returned eight starters from last year's unit that finished 11th nationally, has had its ups and downs but has been generally stingy. The Buffaloes have allowed just 128.7 yards per game rushing.

Senior linebacker Eric McCarty, a former fullback, leads the squad in tackles with 94 total stops. Sophomore linebacker Michael Jones has 82

tackles. Two-time all-Big Eight strong safety Mickey Pruitt is having another great season with 74 tackles, four interceptions and four tackles for a total loss of 12 yards.

Another Colorado strong point is the punting game, where two-time consensus All-American Barry Helton is averaging 46.4 yards per kick.

Oklahoma derailed the Buffaloes, 24-6 last Saturday evening in Norman. Two field goals by freshman kicker Eric Hannah accounted for the CU scoring. The Sooners held Colorado to 158 yards on 49 carries.

Jim Walden's first Big Eight victory last weekend at Kansas was one runningback Joe Henderson will never forget. The junior rushed for a career-high 226 yards on 32 carries, the third-best effort in Iowa State history. The effort pushed Henderson over the 1,000-yard career mark and marked the third time that he has topped the single-game 100-yard mark. Henderson's 756 yards rushing in 1987 is the highest ISU individual total since Tommy Davis gained 832 yards in 1982. He has accounted for 72 percent of Iowa State's rushing total this season.

There were several heroes in the Cyclones' 42-28 triumph in Lawrence. Linebacker Anthony Hoskins, coming off a neck injury suffered in the UNI game, intercepted two passes, and returned one of those thefts 25 yards for the go-ahead touchdown. The junior also recovered a fumble, and finished with 10 total tackles, including eight solo stops.

Junior split end Dennis Ross snared eight passes for 91 yards last weekend. Over the past three weeks, Ross has 24 receptions for 329 yards and leads all Cyclone receivers with 34 catches for 423 yards. Freshman kicker Jeff Shudak hit on a career-long 50-yard field goal and added a 35-yarder against the Jayhawks. He has made at least one field goal in each game this season and has 13 field goals, just two shy of the school record set by Tom Goedjen 1973 and Alex Giffords in 1982.

Iowa State tallied 32 second-half points at Kansas last weekend, after totalling just 24 second-half points in their first six games this season. ISU's 481 yards in total offense was a season high.

Colorado leads the series, 29-11-1. Iowa State has won five of the last nine contests, although the Buffaloes have recorded three straight victories against the Cyclones. Colorado defeated ISU 31-3 last year in Boulder, holding the Cyclones to just 191 total yards. Hatcher and fullback O.C. Oliver rushed for 85 and 79 yards, respectively, en route to a 303-yard team rushing effort. Cyclone quarterback Alex Espinoza completed 17 of 29 passes for 144 yards and wide receiver Eddie Bridges caught four passes for 56 yards. Iowa State's last victory over the Buffaloes was a 22-10 decision at Cyclone Stadium in 1983. The series is tied 3-3 in Cyclone Stadium.

Iowa State has won eight of its last 11 Homecoming contests. The Cyclones stand 28-42-4 in Homecoming games, including an 8-4 mark in Cyclone Stadium. The Cyclones rolled up 409 yards in total offense while stopping Wyoming 21-10 in the 1986 Homecoming contest.

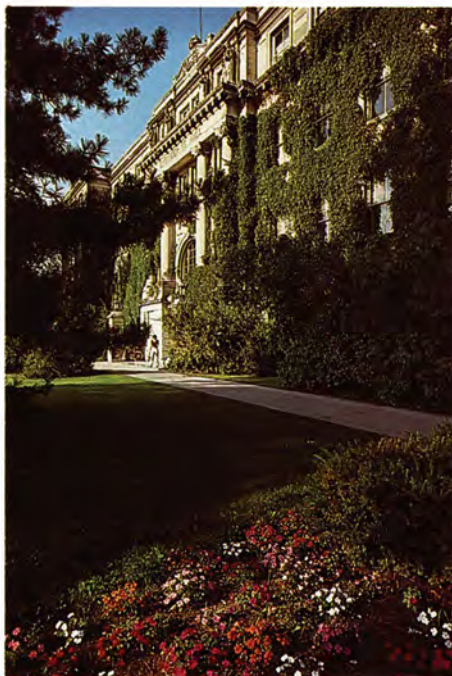
Since the first students enrolled at Iowa State, the institution has been committed to academic excellence. Iowa State's reputation for scholarship is internationally known and Iowa State's students are respected nationwide as serious scholars.

Iowa State University was founded in 1868 under terms of the Land Grant College Act signed by President Abraham Lincoln during the Civil War. Since the beginning, Iowa State has been a co-educational "people's college". As years passed, the University developed a reputation as an outstanding broad-based institution with academic emphasis in the humanities and the arts while maintaining its position in the scientific and technical fields. Recently, Iowa State has become known as a leading research center, renowned in the fields of engineering and agriculture.

One of the largest institutions governed by the State Board of Regents, Iowa State is a major Midwestern center of learning for over 26,000 students, from all 50 states and 99 other nations. Iowa State attracts a diverse student body with a wide range of undergraduate and graduate programs, a student to teaching faculty ratio of 19 to 1 and an average class size of 29 students. Over 120 undergraduate programs of study are available from Iowa State's eight colleges: Agriculture, Business Administration, Design, Education, Engineering, Family and Consumer Sciences, Sciences and Humanities and Veterinary Medicine.

The picturesque campus is comfortably situated in a central campus "park" - a splendid combination of conventional and contemporary architecture. ISU's classrooms and buildings are a blend of the old and the new, nestled amid thousands of trees and acres of greenery. The ultra-modern south campus is dominated by the Iowa State Center, Cyclone Stadium-Jack Trice Field, and the College of Veterinary Medicine.

Fisher Theater, the Scheman Continuing Education Center, and the James H. Hilton Coliseum. Concert facilities draw some of the top names in entertainment. Bruce Springsteen, Tina Turner, Bill Cosby



and the Broadway hit "Cats" have been featured on campus.

One of the highlights of the year occurs in spring as the campus blooms with tulips and apple blossoms just in time for the Veishea celebration. "Veishea" is ISU's annual open house and the largest student-run festival in the nation, complete with parade,

exhibits and thousands of alumni. The campus is also a breathtaking sight in the fall, when autumn colors and leaves make it a cardinal and gold showplace.

Sports are a vital part of the life at Iowa State as the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics offers 21 men's and women's sports and the extensive intramural program boasts one of the highest student participation rates in the country. A number of Cyclone intercollegiate teams have been nationally ranked in recent years and several have brought home national titles. Iowa State has also produced 17 Olympians, three of whom captured gold medals. While athletics remain in the spotlight, the academic side shares equal time.

The opportunities that Iowa State offers stretch beyond the lengths of academics and athletics. There are ample opportunities for students to participate in theater, music, dance and intramural sports as well as numerous academic and campus organizations. The Greek system is strong, as are the residence halls. Both have been nationally recognized along with the top-notch academic advising program.

Iowa State University is an institution founded on a commitment to academic challenge, achievement and excellence. Iowa State reaches beyond this by offering its students some of the most advanced athletic, cultural and social opportunities in the Midwest.

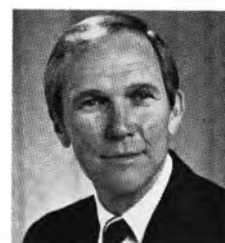

IOWA STATE'S JIM WALDEN



Last fall, Iowa State University President Dr. Gordon Eaton and Athletic Director Max Urick began a search for a new Cyclone football coach. The search was not only for a football coach, but for a new direction, a new personality and a new attitude for the Iowa State program. Eaton and Urick found all of those ingredients in 49-year-old Jim Walden, and on December 16, 1986, the former Washington State mentor became Iowa State's 28th head football coach.

The personable native of Aberdeen, Mississippi arrived at ISU with "no magic formulas," just a promise to "come in here and do the best I can to work as hard as I know how." A glance at Walden's coaching record shows that his best has led to success at previous coaching stops.

As the head coach at Washington State for the last nine years, Walden compiled a 44-52-4 record against tough Pacific-10 Conference competition. During that time, Walden guided the team to three winning seasons and four first-division finishes in the conference. He was one of only two WSU coaches to record more than one winning campaign, and only one other coach in Cougar history won more games or served longer as head coach than Walden.

Walden's Washington State teams became known for the upset victory. No opponent took a WSU team lightly, as the Cougars upset Pac-10 conference powerhouses USC, UCLA and Washington during his years at the school. In fact, Washington State had great success against intra-state rival Washington, knocking the Huskies off in

three of Walden's final five seasons.

Offense was another trademark of Walden-coached teams at WSU, and his exciting, wide-open option attack had the Cougar offense ranked at the top of the conference. Washington State won three team rushing titles in the last five years, along with two consecutive total offense titles in 1984 and 1985. The Cougar defense also showed improvement under Walden, rising from the lower echelons of the league to as high as third in 1981.

Walden was actually at Washington State for ten years, first serving as an assistant to Warren Powers. When Powers left WSU following the 1977 season, Cougar officials tabbed Walden as his replacement and Walden began building the Washington State program. The culmination of a four-year plan came when Walden took the Cougars to the 1981 Holiday Bowl, WSU's first bowl appearance since the 1931 Rose Bowl. WSU finished the season with an 8-3-1 mark, needing only a win in the regular-season finale to go to the Rose Bowl. In 1983, the Cougars were also within one game, a mid-season loss to UCLA, of winning the Pac-10 title and earning the Rose Bowl berth.

His success did not go unnoticed by his peers. Walden earned Pac-10 Coach-of-the-Year honors in 1981 and 1983. In 1981, he was the UPI West Coast and AFCA/Kodak District IX Coach-of-the-Year. Following the 1981 season, he was asked to be an assistant coach for the West squad in the Japan Bowl and at the East-West Shrine game that year. He was the head coach of the victorious West squad in the 1985 East-West Shrine Game, and was an assistant at the 1986 Hula Bowl.

Walden also brought stability to the WSU program. One of the keys to his success at Washington State was continuity on his staff over the years. Prior to the start of the 1986 season, all of his assistant coaches had remained with him for at least five years, and several had been on the job since he became head coach at Washington State in 1977. When he accepted the job at Iowa State, Walden invited all nine of his assistant coaches to join him and seven of them did.

Despite spending the past 10 years in the Pac-10, Walden is familiar with Big Eight Conference football. He started his collegiate coaching career in 1969 at Nebraska under his former college

coach, Bob Devaney. For the next four seasons, Walden was a defensive coach for the Cornhuskers. During those years Nebraska won two national championships.

From Nebraska, Walden moved to Miami (Fla.) in 1973 as an offensive backfield coach for Pete Elliott, and was later named defensive coordinator under Carl Selmer. Walden joined Warren Powers' Washington State staff as backfield coach for the 1977 season, and took over the head coaching job in 1978.

As a college quarterback at Wyoming, Walden guided the Cowboys to a pair of Skyline Conference titles. He was named both the conference and team Most Valuable Player in 1959, and played in the 1960 East-West Shrine Game. Following his college career, Walden signed with the British Columbia Lions of the Canadian Football League and played two seasons each with the Lions and Calgary. He coached Amory High School in his native Mississippi for five years before taking his first college job at Nebraska.

An excellent speaker, Walden is in demand for outside engagements. The NCAA has selected him twice as a guest speaker at its annual College Football Preview, in 1983 and 1985. Since coming to ISU, he's become a popular figure with both students and fans in appearances across the state. Since the day he was hired, Jim Walden has proven that he is the "right person" to bring a new direction, new attitude, and new personality to the Iowa State football program.

Scouting Report

Cyclone Scouting Report

The Series: This is the 52nd meeting between the Cyclones and the Buffaloes. Colorado holds a 29-11-1 advantage in the series that began in 1946 with a 13-7 Colorado victory. Between 1966 and 1977, the Buffs recorded 12 straight wins over the Cyclones. Colorado has won the last three meetings, but Iowa State has captured five of the last nine contests. Last season, Colorado posted a 31-3 victory in Boulder as the CU defense allowed Iowa State just 191 yards total offense. Colorado leads the series 15-6 in Ames and posted a 40-6 victory in Ames in 1985. Iowa State's last win against Colorado was a 22-10 victory in Ames in 1983. The series is tied 3-3 in Cyclone Stadium.

For the Record: Oklahoma's Jamelle Hollieway rushed for 146 yards as Oklahoma overcame nine fumbles and six penalties to top Colorado, 24-6 in Norman. Two field goals by freshman kicker Eric Hannah accounted for the CU scoring. OU held the Colorado rushing attack to 158 yards on 49 carries. The Buffaloes own victories over Stanford, Washington State, Colorado State, and Kansas. The other CU loss was a 42-17 defeat at Oklahoma State.

Offensively: Colorado's rushing offense is averaging 307.1 rushing yards per game out of the wishbone. CU rushers are averaging 4.9 yards per carry. Three newcomers lead the Golden Buffalo offense. Sophomore quarterback Sal Aunese has rushed for a team-high 498 yards on 88 carries. Freshman runningback Eric Bieniemy has rushed for 355 yards on 69 carries and sophomore Michael Simmons has gained 326 yards on 65 rushes. CU quarterbacks Aunese and Mark Hatcher have completed 30 of 71 passes for 603 yards and have thrown six interceptions.

Defensively: The Colorado defense has allowed just 128.7 yards per game rushing. CU is led by linebackers Eric McCarthy and Michael Jones. McCarthy has made 94 total stops and Jones 82 total tackles. Two-time all-Big Eight strong safety Mickey Pruitt has made 74 stops and has a team-high four interceptions. Opponents have averaged 222.7 yards passing against the Buffs.

Kicking: Buffalo punter Barry Helton is a two-time consensus All-American. He is averaging 43.9 yards per kick this season. Hannah has hit on four of five field goal attempts after replacing sophomore Ken Culbertson, who hit on three of 10 attempts. Punt returner Jeff Campbell is averaging 10.1 yards per return and kickoff returner Jo Jo Collins is averaging 23.9 yards per return.

The Coach: Bill McCartney is in his sixth year at Colorado, where he has a record of 24-39-1. He is 17-14 overall and 11-6 against the Big Eight over the past 2½ seasons. The three-time letterwinner at Missouri was the first prep coach in Michigan history to win both the football and basketball state titles in one season. He went on to Michigan, where he coached under Bo Schembechler from 1974-1981, including a five-year stint as defensive coordinator.

Runningbacks

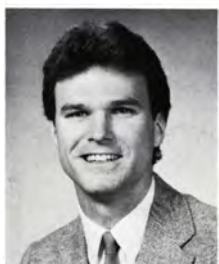


Andersen joined Jim Walden's staff in March of 1987 after nine seasons as an assistant coach at UCLA. For the past five seasons (1982-86), the former Bruin tight end coached and developed some of the nation's top runningbacks at his alma mater, including Gaston Green and Eric Ball.

A three-year starter at UCLA (1973-75), he now ranks 10th in career receiving with 61 catches for 1,051 yards. He led the Bruins in receiving as a sophomore and a junior, catching 19 passes in 1973 and 27 the following year. An all-Pacific-8 first-team selection in 1974, he was chosen in the 11th round of the 1976 NFL draft by the Chicago Bears.

Tim Bald

Program Coordinator



Tim Bald is in his second season as Iowa State's program coordinator, organizing the recruiting and administrative responsibilities in the Cyclone football program.

The Freeport, Ill., native came to the Cyclones from the Washington Redskins of the National Football League. He served as the Redskins' administrative intern in charge of player personnel. Prior to that, Bald worked at the U.S. Olympic Training Center in Colorado as an assistant to the National Program Director.

The 29-year old Bald is a 1980 graduate of Loras College where he earned a bachelor's degree in business administration. He received his master's degree in Physical Education with an emphasis in sports management from Western Illinois University in 1985.

Craig Boller

Defensive Line



The 1987 season is Craig Boller's first as an assistant coach at Iowa State. The Belmont native is no stranger to Ames, however, where he lettered three times as an ISU defensive tackle under Clay Stapleton and Johnny Majors (1967-69).

Boller came to Iowa State in January of 1987 after serving six years as the defensive line coach at Oregon State. The 39-year old Boller was an assistant coach at Memphis State for two seasons (1978-79) after working one year as a part-time assistant coach at Tennessee.

Boller spent three seasons (1974-76) building the William Penn (Iowa) College football program. William Penn won the Iowa Conference title in Boller's final season as head coach. He began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Knoxville High School from 1971-73.

Jimmy Burrow

Defensive Secondary



Secondary coach Jimmy Burrow came to Iowa State in January of 1987 with Head Coach Jim Walden, after five seasons as a full-time coach at Washington State, the last four as the Cougars' secondary coach. The 33-year old Burrow coached tight ends at WSU in 1982.

Burrow's association with Walden dates back to his high school days in Amory, Miss. Walden was Burrow's coach in ninth and tenth grade football and baseball. Burrow attended the University of Mississippi for one season before transferring to Nebraska where he was reunited with Walden. At Nebraska, Burrow earned second-team all-Big Eight honors his senior season and was an academic All-American. A member of the 1972 Orange Bowl and 1983 Cotton Bowl teams, he also played in the 1974 Sugar Bowl and 1975 Fiesta Bowl. He graduated with a B.S. in education.

Burrow was picked in the eighth round of the 1976 NFL draft by the Green Bay Packers

and played in three games of the 1976 regular season. He went on to play five years in the CFL (1977-81), the first four with Montreal and the 1981 season with Ottawa. He earned a master's in Education Administration in June, 1981 at Washington State. Burrow and his wife, Carol, are parents of two children, Jamie (8) and Danny (6).

Dave Elliott

Wide Receivers



The 1987 season marks Dave Elliott's 13th campaign as an assistant coach and his ninth season as an assistant to Jim Walden. At Washington State, Elliott tutored the inside linebackers from 1979-86.

The Champaign, Ill., native coached the defensive backs at Miami (Fla.) in 1975. In 1976, he coached at Michigan, working with linebackers. He spent the 1977-78 seasons at Toledo as defensive backfield coach before joining Walden's staff at Washington State.

Elliott, the nephew of Iowa Athletic Director Bump Elliott and cousin of former Cyclone assistant coach Bobby Elliott, lettered three times in football as a defensive back. He played for the Michigan squad that went to the 1972 Rose Bowl. Elliott also played in the 1975 Hula Bowl and was invited to play in the 1975 American Bowl. Dave and his wife, Peggy, are the parents of two daughters, Catherine Lynn (5) and Christina (3).

Jon Fabris

Linebackers



Jon Fabris, who coached the tight ends under Jim Walden at Washington State (1983-86), will coach the Cyclone linebackers in 1987. Fabris, a native of Starkville, Miss., first joined Walden's WSU staff in 1982, when he assisted with the secondary, coached the offensive scout team and scouted the opposition's kicking game.

Fabris coached the junior varsity defensive backfield and defensive scout team at Georgia Tech in 1980, before working for an oil company in 1981. He earned four varsity

letters playing all four secondary positions at Mississippi (1976-79), including three years as a starter. He ranked third in Southeastern Conference punt returns in 1977 and graduated fifth in career punt returns at Ole Miss. He received his bachelor's degree in education in 1980.

The 30-year old Fabris quarterbacked Starkville High School to a conference title and No. 10 state ranking his senior season.

Lindsay Hughes

Tight Ends



For Iowa State tight end coach Lindsay Hughes, the 1987 season will mark his 20th campaign in the collegiate coaching ranks and his 10th under Head Coach Jim Walden. Hughes coached the outside linebackers at Washington State.

Hughes started his coaching career as the freshman coach at San Jose State in 1967. He was a graduate assistant in charge of the offensive scout team and assisted with linebackers at Florida State in 1968, when the Seminoles played in the Peach Bowl. In 1969, the Redondo Beach, Calif., native worked with the secondary. He went to San Diego State in 1970-71 where he was an assistant coach working with the linebackers. From 1972-74 he was an assistant coach at Los Amigos (Calif.) High. He spent three seasons (1975-77) at Cerritos College as an assistant in charge of the linebackers.

Hughes played center for two years at San Jose State, earning a bachelor's degree in physical education. He received his master's in physical education from San Diego State in 1971. Hughes had earned All-America honors as a sophomore at El Camino (Calif.) Junior College in 1964. Hughes and his wife, Bonnie, have one daughter, Nicole (17).

Steve Morton

Offensive Line



Steve Morton's first year at Iowa State is his 13th in collegiate coaching and his 10th under Head Coach Jim Walden. The Chehalis, Wash., native will coach the Cyclone offensive line-the same position he held at Washington State for the past five seasons.

Morton coached the Washington State tight ends from 1978-81. He started his collegiate coaching stint at WSU in 1975 as

an offensive line assistant. He was a defensive line assistant in 1976 and junior varsity and assistant offensive line coach in 1977.

Morton played at Grays Harbor (Wash.) Junior College in 1972 and 1973. He played two seasons and won the Outstanding Offensive Lineman Award, earning All-NWJC honors. Morton played guard and center at Washington State in 1973-74 before graduating with a bachelor's in physical education. The 33-year old Morton and his wife, Karen, are the parents of two children, Beau (11) and Bethany (7).

Robin Ross

Defensive Coordinator Inside Linebackers



Robin Ross, Iowa State's defensive coordinator and inside linebacker coach begins his second season under Jim Walden. The Pico Rivera, Calif., native was the defensive line coach at Washington State last season.

Ross moved to Washington State after a two-year stint at Cincinnati. In 1984, he coached the defensive line and was strength and conditioning coordinator. In 1985, he was the defensive coordinator and defensive line coach. From 1979-83, Ross coached the defensive line and was the recruiting coordinator at Long Beach State. He started at CSLB as an assistant offensive line and tight end coach, a position he held during the 1977 and 1978 seasons.

Ross was a two-year starter (1974-75) at Washington State, where he earned second team all-conference honors and was an honorable mention All-America offensive tackle. He graduated with a bachelor's

degree in education in 1977.

The 33-year old Ross was a first team all-conference selection at offensive tackle in his second season at Rio Hondo (Calif.) College in 1973. Ross was a tenth-round choice of the San Francisco 49er's but signed as a free agent with Seattle and played the 1976 exhibition season. Ross is married to the former Jean Kwid.

Mel Sanders

Offensive Line



Mel Sanders' first season at Iowa State is his 11th under Cyclone Head Coach Jim Walden. The Los Angeles, Calif., native played under Walden at Washington State for four seasons (1976-80) before joining the WSU coaching staff after graduating in 1981.

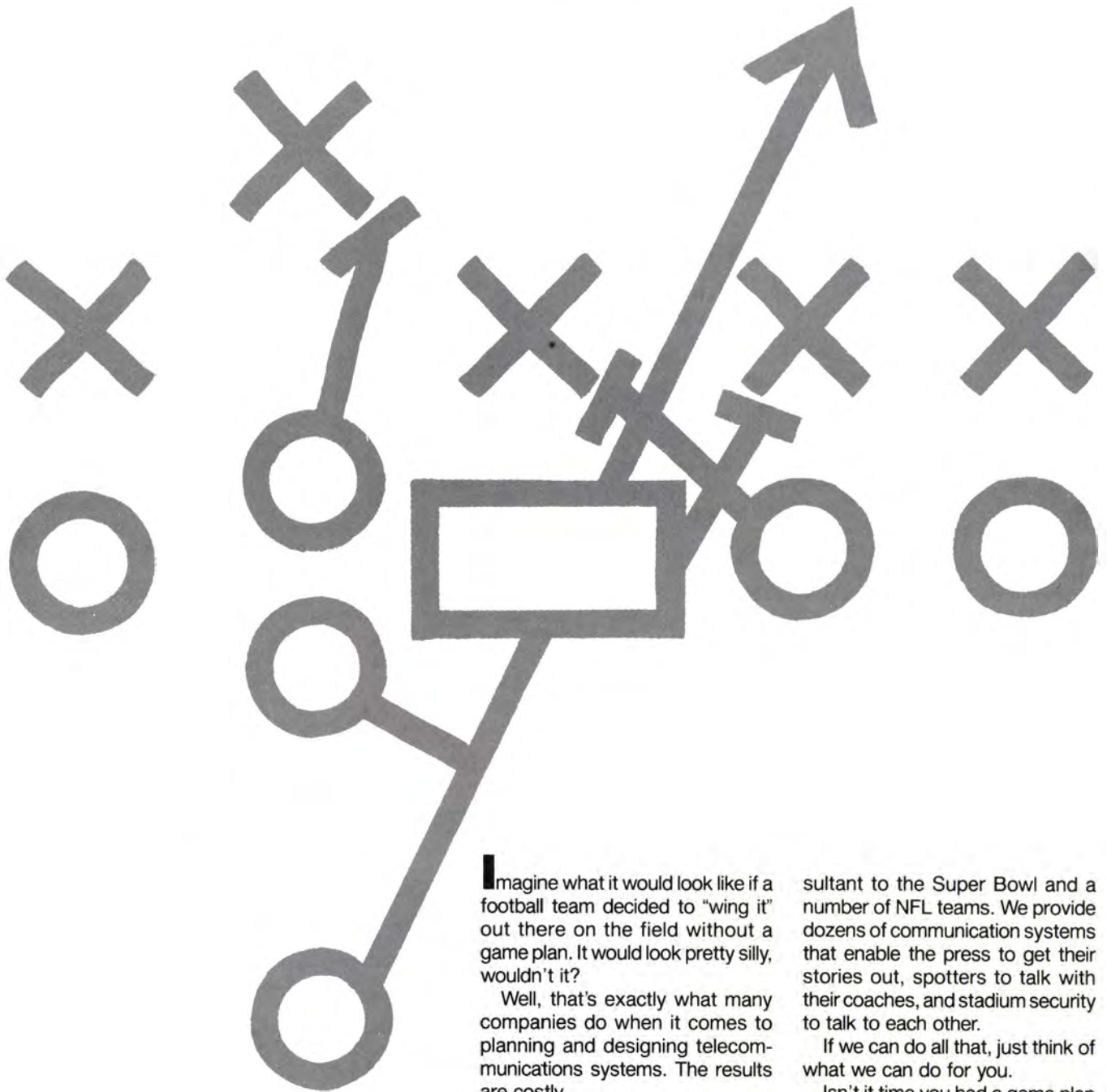
Sanders' first coaching assignment was assisting with the outside linebackers in 1981. In 1982, he tutored the WSU defensive line. Sanders assumed administrative and offensive line coaching duties in 1983. He coordinated the Freshmen Athlete Scholastic Training (FAST) program at Washington State.

The 29-year old Sanders was a four-year starter at Washington State, where he earned second-team freshman All-America honors from *Football News*. He injured his ankle in the 1977 season opener and was redshirted. Sanders came back to start the next three seasons for the Cougars. During the 1978 season, he was credited with 80 stops, ranking him second on the squad in tackles. He recorded 56 tackles in 1980, including two quarterback sacks. Sanders made 241 career tackles, including 149 solo stops in his career.

CY'S FAVORITE ALUM

A 1940 Iowa State chemical engineering graduate who built the Eddy-Walker Equipment Company into one of the most successful ventures of its kind in the Midwest is the 33rd annual honoree as Cy's Favorite Alum. This recognition is bestowed by the Iowa State University Department of Intercollegiate Athletics to a loyal friend who has demonstrated exemplary service to the University and its intercollegiate athletic programs.

It is with great pride that the athletic department announces its 1987 recipient, O. Robert Eddy of Des Moines, Chairman of the Board of Eddy-Walker Equipment Co. He will be honored at halftime of today's game.

Born in Northwood, Eddy graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in chemical engineering in 1940. A swim team

member as a freshman, the Phi Delta Theta member was inducted into the Scabbard and Blade ROTC honorary. He was also the assistant editor of the *Bomb*, the Iowa State yearbook.

Eddy attended the University of Iowa law school in 1941 before joining the Army at the outset of the Second World War. He saw extensive combat action in the European Theatre, finishing the conflict as a Lieutenant Colonel in command of the Third Army's 271st Engineering Battalion under General George Patton. He was awarded the Bronze Star and received the U.S.S.R.'s Russian Order of Battle from the commander of the Soviet Fifth Guards Division. The 1970 Legion of Merit honoree remained active in military service after the war, retiring as a colonel from the United States Army Reserve

after 30 years of service in 1970.

He joined Mills Plastic of Chicago, as a design engineer in 1946 and also served there as production manager. From 1947-49, he worked as a Gas Design Engineer for Consolidated Industries of Lafayette, Ind. In 1950, he joined the Herman M. Brown Co. as a sales engineer.

In 1959, Eddy joined with Duane Walker to form the Eddy-Walker Equipment Co. His business prospered, marketing a variety of light construction equipment along with municipal and refuse equipment.

Today, Eddy-Walker Equipment has sales throughout Iowa and the Midwest, in both urban and rural areas.

Eddy's generosity to Iowa State and the Central Iowa community is underscored by membership in a variety of organizations and boards. A member of The Board of Governors of the ISU Achievement Foundation, a member of the Founders Club of ISU's Order of the Knoll and the Captain's Club level of the Cyclone Club, Eddy continues to direct a significant portion of his effort toward his favorite charity—Iowa State University.

A 33rd degree Mason who has received highest service recognition from the Boy Scouts of America, Eddy has served as a deacon and trustee of Des Moines' Westminster Presbyterian Church, on the Board of the Wakonda Club and the Des Moines Chamber of Commerce.

Eddy and his wife, the former Barb Nelson, a 1940 ISU Home Economics graduate, are the parents of four children, Robert R., Steven, Donald and Mary Sue, all of whom attended Iowa State and received college degrees.

Williams Gets Weather-Wise, Game Experience

Last year at this time, ISU junior cornerback Lopey Williams was playing football for Citrus Junior College in sunny southern California. He had never experienced a snowfall and the biggest crowd he had ever played in front of was 6,000.

Coming to Iowa State has been an eye opener for Williams, a native of Duarte, Calif. After the first flurries fell in Ames last week, he asked teammates if the weather would be as bad all winter.

"They told me that felt like a day at the beach," Williams said. "I thought, 'what am I doing here?'"

However, playing in front of the Cyclone faithful at Jack Trice Field has warmed Williams to Iowa weather and Iowa State football.

"At first it was scary, I never dreamed of playing in front of 50,000 screaming fans," Williams said. "Once I got in the game, though, I got over the butterflies and the big crowd got me pumped up...it helped."

Williams has responded by making

15 solo tackles and 16 assists so far this season. He is the third leading tackler in the ISU secondary and leads the team in interceptions with two. The 5-10, 180 pound junior made one interception in the Wyoming game and another against Northern Iowa. The play against Northern Iowa came with 11 minutes remaining in the game and began the Cyclones 17-point rally, allowing them to come from behind to defeat the Panthers in the closing minute.

ISU coaches feel that although Williams' experience in big-game situations is somewhat limited, his performance thus far this season has been good.

"He's got a lot of natural ability," said Jimmy Burrow, Iowa State secondary coach. "Lopey has been thrown into some heavy-duty action and he's done well considering his lack of experience."

Williams is equally pleased with his coaches and the high standards they have set for the team.

"They're pretty good teachers. They really push the team to get better and better," he said. "They have taught us to never give up and it shows. The attitude among my teammates is to never give up no matter what the opposition is."

Williams has also set some personal standards at Iowa State.

"The reason I came out here was to number one, get my degree in school," he said. "Secondly, I hoped to be able

As Williams learns to cope with the weather and gains game experience, he is well on his way to making a name for himself at Iowa State in his first season as a Cyclone.

"SCRAPPY" ISU BASEBALL SQUAD SET TO BATTLE IN '88

It could be an extraordinary year for the 1988 Iowa State baseball team. ISU returns experienced starters at six of eight positions, and returns depth at those positions as well. Fourth-year Head Coach Bobby Randall is excited about the return of that group and the addition of some promising newcomers to his 1988 squad.

"I think we've got an exciting year to look forward to," Randall said.

"The thing that excites me most about our ball club is the depth and number of guys we can count on at all positions."

The Cyclones lost just four players, and only one pitcher, off a 1987 squad that went 25-27, 7-13 in the Big Eight. Randall believes pitching depth and consistency will be the Cyclone key to success in 1988.

"The primary concern I have is consistency in our pitching staff," Randall said. "I know we have the talent. The key is to make quality pitches game after game."

Randall has six pitchers, based on fall workouts, from which to form a starting rotation of four. Those six include 1987 starters Brian Lonergan and Dan O'Reilly, and returnees Ken Sage and Shawn Stolte.

Lonergan and O'Reilly, both juniors, started 10 and nine games, respectively, last season, including some key Big Eight contests. Also contending for a starting spot are newcomers Mike Myers, and Barry Steim, who led Ankeny to the 1987 Class 2A state championship game.

Iowa State has the luxury of two experienced relievers this season as both Pat Heiderscheit, 3-3 in 1987, and Chris Zima, 4-3, return for their senior seasons. Each collected four saves to tie for the team lead. Zima's earned run average is the lowest among Cyclone returnees at 4.54. Other pitchers who could contribute in 1988 are newcomers Dan Kasperski, Bill Wengert and Tim Weber, and returnees Craig Harman and Ty Calkins.

Behind the plate, ISU is looking for another excellent year from Heiderscheit and Ed Riley. Heiderscheit was the team's top backstop last year and earned second team District VII and Academic All-America honors. He led Iowa State in hits, runs, RBI's and average. Riley also had a strong year at the plate, hitting for a .324 average and clubbing seven home runs to lead the squad.

"One of the strengths of this team is defensively up the middle," Randall said. "And that begins with the catcher. Offensively and defensively catcher is a good position for us."

The Cyclone infield also has the potential to provide punch offensively and defensively in 1988. At first, several players, including Heiderscheit, Riley and sophomore Mike Busch, will see action. ISU's record-setting double play combination of 1987 returns intact

with a pair of juniors, Dave Herbeck at second base and Greg Brecht at shortstop. Senior Russ Schiltz backs up both Herbeck and Brecht and could break into the starting lineup. At third, sophomores Reggie Stalzer and Virgil Fulk are battling to take over the spot vacated by Jeff Breeling.

"I don't expect us to be the same in the infield as we were last year," Randall commented. "We are going to be better."

Like the infield and catching spots, the outfield will be manned by familiar faces. Two of the outfield positions will be filled by sophomores Dave Shinn and Mike Weimerskirch. Both were starters as freshmen, in left and right field, respectively. Shinn earned the Mike Curran Rookie of the Year award with a .299 average while Weimerskirch hit .284 and was 17 of 18 in stolen base attempts. Several players will challenge for the final outfield spot, including speedy junior Bryce Hustedt, Busch, senior Craig Prather and newcomer Tom Vantiger.

The Iowa State schedule will once again be tough, with a spring trip to Florida to begin the season, matchups with other area Division I schools, and the always challenging Big Eight slate.

"When you play the Big Eight, you are playing as tough a schedule as there is in America," Randall said. "We've also tried to schedule all the Division I schools in our region in an effort to make the schedule this year even more demanding."

Despite the tough schedule, Randall looks for his 1988 Iowa State squad to battle in every game, and thinks the experience of the squad and some clutch pitching could lead to an excellent season.

"Our goals for 1988 are simple," Randall said. "We want to play hard and play well every pitch, every inning, every game, all year long. We have a bunch of guys that really love baseball and we'll scrap all season long."



Senior Pat Heiderscheit was an honorable mention all District VII and Academic All-America pick as a catcher, but also helped ISU on the mound with a 3-3 record and four saves.

DETERMINATION DRIVES RICHARDS' 1987 COMEBACK

If you ever want senior Randy Richards, ISU's starter at strong outside linebacker this season, to do something, just tell him he can't do it.

It was six years ago when Richards, then a wiry 175 pound all-state linebacker at Urbandale High School, was told that very thing. Despite having 110 tackles his senior year and 4.8 speed in the 40, many told Richards he was too small to play major college football. Richards did not think so, and neither did former ISU Head Coach Donnie Duncan as his staff signed Richards to play for Iowa State in 1982. Richards remains on the Iowa State squad in 1987, his sixth and final season, the last link to the Donnie Duncan era of Cyclone football.

Richards was redshirted his freshman year and embarked on a rigorous weight regimen, where he grew to his present dimensions, 215 pounds on a 6-4 frame. Over the next three years he played in 33 straight games for former Head Coach Jim Criner. During that time he saw extensive play, starting some his junior year, and was ticketed for a key role in 1986 when weightlifting came back to haunt him.

While doing a leg squat before spring practice, Richards severely injured a disc in his lower back. Surgery was performed to remove the fifth lumbar disc last fall. Football did not appear to be in his future. Richards remembers that he was just hoping the operation would put an end to the constant pain in his lower back.

"I didn't know if I would ever play football again, or even if the surgery would be successful," Richards said. "It was only a fifty-fifty chance, but I was always optimistic."

After a long recuperation, which included leaving school for a semester, the pain was gone, but so, it appeared, was his football career. He had already taken a redshirt season and with doubts about his physical ability to return to competition, it was presumed his career was over.

But Richards and Iowa State refused to accept that decision. The same person whose determination had brought him to play major college football despite the odds faced a greater challenge to regain his senior year of eligibility. This time, however, he would need some outside help.

The help came in the form of Iowa State University, which applied

for a medical hardship on Richards' behalf for the 1987 season. The NCAA allows athletes five years to complete four years of eligibility, and it is a rarity when an athlete is given a sixth year. Against the odds, in a landmark decision, both the NCAA and the Big Eight Conference approved Richards' extra year. He would get one more shot at football, and his reaction, though predictable, has been admirable.

Richards' optimism came through as he is once again wearing number 59 and starting at strong outside linebacker for the Cyclones. Richards has taken full advantage of his extra year, becoming one of the leaders on the Iowa State defense. He has collected 52 tackles, including 25 unassisted, and has made two tackles for loss and one sack.

"Everyone said that I couldn't get back into football after the surgery," Richards said. "And I'm the type of person who, whenever somebody tells me I can't do something, I want to prove them wrong."

Randy Richards has proven a lot of people wrong. His positive attitude has been especially valuable this season under his third collegiate head coach at ISU, Jim Walden.

"There were a lot of negative things said about the football program at one time," Richards said. "But Coach Walden is trying to emphasize the positive aspects. He tells us when we've done something right and how we can build upon it."

Coach Walden commented on Richards' extra motivation this year.

"Maybe the motivation he's got one more chance to play for his team - well, for Randy, that was great therapy," Walden said. "And he's having a ball. He knows what he almost didn't have."

CYCLONE SOFTBALL SPORTS A NEW LOOK IN 1988

Coming off last season's second-place finish in the Inaugural National Invitational Championship, Iowa State softball coach Deb Kuhn feels the 1987 season was important in the development of her program.

"It was a good season for our program and a good season for our seniors," the sixth-year coach said. "It was the best season we have had since I have been here. The opportunity to play at the NIC and in postseason competition isn't something our team had had a chance to do. For them to go to the tournament and pull off a second-place finish was something very positive."

Kuhn, the 1987 Big Eight Coach-of-the-Year, faces a new challenge in 1988. After losing ten players from last year's 32-18 squad, she is faced with replacing six starters, including all-conference honorable mention selections Kelli Alberts and Amber Masteller.

"We're in a rebuilding year," Kuhn explained. "There's no doubt about it. But, when I look at the personnel we have, we're in a position to do much better than a lot of people anticipate."

The Cyclones' offensive attack looks to be strong with last year's top two hitters returning. Outfielder Jenny Condon, another Big Eight conference honorable mention pick, led the team with a .328 average in her rookie season. Junior infielder Karen Brenner will also carry a big stick for the Cyclones after hitting .311 in 1987. The LeClaire, Iowa native topped last year's statistics with 23 runs, 50 hits, 18 runs batted in, and four triples.

"The one area I feel most comfortable with in this year's team is the offense," Kuhn said. "We have very few returners, but we have some key people back. We also brought some new people into the program who will help us offensively."

"We're confident we're going to produce some runs," Kuhn added. "We showed in the fall we have a good offense as we hit .271 as a team and had 30 runs batted in in 11 games.

We were productive with the bats, but our defense was inconsistent."

A key area to the success of the Cyclones will be their ability to maintain consistency on defense. In 11 exhibition games this fall, ISU committed 29 errors.

Another area the Cyclones will focus on in the winter months is the pitching staff. Kuhn lost the services of Kelli Alberts, Breana Reedy and Denise Pate to graduation. Junior Leslie Greer, the lone returning hurler, had surgery on her forearm this summer and did not see any action in the fall.

"It's going to be critical to see the progress the pitching staff makes in the off-season, and how they come together by spring," Kuhn said.

Freshman Maria Schell threw the majority of the games for the Cyclones in the fall, and Kuhn hopes the experience will pay off in the future. Junior Beth Lin moved from second base to the mound, and will continue to pitch in the off-season workouts. Jane Peterson will join the Cyclones this spring after a

successful career at Crowder Junior College.

"Hopefully, Leslie can come back and add stability to the pitching staff, and Jane can make the transition to Division I play," Kuhn said. "At present, I don't view anyone as our number one pitcher. It's up for grabs."

Denise Harper, an Iowa first-team all-state selection last year handled the fall catching duties. Sophomore Carrie Bargman, a utility infielder last season, also saw action behind the plate and could contribute there this spring.

Kuhn experimented with infield positioning this fall, hoping to find a consistent combination on defense. Seniors Monica Campana and Mary Laufer, and Brenner all saw action at first base. Kuhn feels finding a solid first baseman will be a key to the infield stability.

Newcomers Lisa Leinen, Jodi Babb and Carol Seymour all played in the infield this fall and will contribute in 1988. Leinen earned All-American honors at Crowder Junior College as a shortstop and is a powerful offensive threat. Babb is a junior walk-on, while Seymour entered ISU after an impressive prep career at Indianola.

Kuhn feels the Iowa State outfield combination of Missy Dent, Marcie Smith and Condon has the potential to be the strongest in the Big Eight. All three are capable of hitting over .300 and possess great speed.

"There can't be a quicker outfield in the conference," Kuhn claimed. "It's a matter of them feeling comfortable playing together. They are all young—a freshman and two sophomores. This year they can be the best and we have three years of that. There's a lot of potential."

Potential is the key word for the Cyclones this season. Kuhn realizes her squad is relatively young and inexperienced, but feels the talent is there. With some concentrated work on pitching and defense in the off-season, the "rebuilding" year squad of 1988 can become a solid Iowa State softball team.

ISU PRESIDENT GORDON EATON

In 1986, Iowa State University entered a new era under the direction of President Gordon Eaton. The former vice president for academic affairs at Texas A&M, Eaton took office July 1, 1986 as Iowa State's 12th president.

Eaton received his bachelor of arts from Wesleyan University at Middletown, Conn., in 1951. He graduated "With High Honors and High Distinction" with degrees in geology and mathematics. He earned his masters of science degree in geology (1953) and his Ph.D. in geophysics and geology (1957) from the California Institute of Technology.

He served on the faculty of Wesleyan University (1955-59) and the faculty of the University of California-Riverside (1959-63) before a two-year stint as the project chief for the U.S. Geological Survey in Denver, Colorado. Eaton then returned to California-Riverside where he was the chairperson of the department of geological sciences.

From 1967-81 Eaton was with the U.S. Geological Survey, serving in a number of capacities. He was the project chief for the Southwestern Project, scientist-in-charge of the

Hawaiian Volcano Observatory, and associate chief geologist at the national headquarters in Reston, Va.

In 1981, he was appointed the dean of the College of Geosciences at Texas A&M, which includes the departments of geology, geophysics, oceanography, meteorology and geography. Eaton was named provost and vice president for academic affairs in 1983, a post he held until coming to Iowa State.

An established scholar and scientist, Eaton is the author and co-author of more than 40 publications covering such subjects as mineral resources throughout the United States, volcanic ash deposits, and mining geophysics in the Soviet Union. He has worked on the "Journal of Volcanology and Geothermal Resources" as an associate editor, and was the co-editor of the Geological Society of America's "Memoir 152".

Eaton's leadership has already made an impact on every department and segment of the campus community as Iowa State improves its facilities, academic programs and student services to lead the way into the 21st century.

STRENGTH PROGRAM

Today, one of the most integral aspects of any intercollegiate athletic program is a sound strength and conditioning program. Iowa State recognizes this area as a crucial ingredient to the overall success of all 21 men's and women's intercollegiate sports offered at the university. Under the direction of full-time strength and conditioning coach Tom Wilson, Iowa State's athletic teams have made tremendous strides.

The goal of the strength and conditioning program is not to make avid weightlifters out of athletes, but rather to keep athletes healthy and prepared for competition by reducing their susceptibility to injury. This is accomplished by a computer analyzed combination of a strict strength and conditioning program, a good diet and sufficient rest.

"Iowa State offers all athletes proven strength and conditioning programs," said Wilson, "plus excellent facilities designed to enhance the athletes' performances and help them realize their maximum potential. Utilizing such a strictly supervised strength and conditioning program not only produces great physical results, but also increases the athletes' confidence when they become bigger, faster and more disciplined than their opponent."

For Iowa State's football team, as well as many other Cyclone squads, the strength and conditioning program continues on a year-round basis. During the summer and winter months, athletes concentrate on increasing strength and conditioning while in-season work consists of maintaining strength and the level of conditioning.

Through evaluation and testing, use of computerized training programs and diet analysis, ISU's strength and conditioning program is helping make Iowa State student athletes into better athletes.



University. Athletes at ISU must be students first if they are to retain the privileges associated with participating in intercollegiate athletics. The hours and energy demanded of today's college athlete can adversely affect a student-athlete's education without guidance in time management and study techniques.

Iowa State's athletic academic coordinators monitor all student-athletes' academic status in terms of both eligibility and progress toward graduation to help prepare them for life after a collegiate athletic career. Three full-time academic coordinators, plus several part-time counselors and numerous tutors, assure that these goals are being met. The staff works directly with the student-athletes, as well as with the athletes' academic advisers and instructors throughout the university.

Although absence from class because of athletic participation is held to an absolute minimum, any missed class time can impose a burden on the student-athlete. Support services such as tutoring and study table, help alleviate that problem. ISU's football team utilizes a study table that meets on a daily basis throughout the year. Academic staff members and tutors attend each session and are available throughout the day to meet with student-athletes.

The education of ISU student-athletes and their progress toward degrees has always been a prime consideration of the athletic department at Iowa State. A strong athletic academic counseling service helps support the student-athletes and offer them guidance and assistance as they work toward degrees and enjoy athletic successes.

STADIUM INFORMATION

First Aid Station

Emergency medical treatment is available for spectators in special first aid quarters located under both the east and west stands. Contact the nearest usher to request medical assistance.

Ambulance Service

An ambulance is parked at the first aid quarters on the west side of the stadium.

Pass Out Checks

Persons leaving the stadium will be stamped for re-admission to the stadium. In addition, they must have a ticket stub for re-admission. No pass outs will be allowed between 12:30 and 1:00 p.m. or ½ hour before kickoff.

Service for Physicians

Doctors anticipating calls during the game are urged to register at the first aid quarters under the west stands, leaving their exact seat location. The management will see that all calls are delivered without delay.

Lost and Found

A lost and found service is maintained in the Athletic Ticket Office in the Olsen Building at the north end of the stadium. Articles found should be turned over to an usher or left at the Athletic Ticket Office.

Public Telephone

Pay telephones are located behind the east and west stands.

Refreshments

Refreshments are served in the stands and at locations around the stadium.

Iowa State Souvenirs

An attractive array of Iowa State souvenirs is available at conveniently located novelty sales booths throughout the stadium and from vendors in the parking areas.

Radios, Stadium Chairs, Umbrellas

As a courtesy to neighboring ticket holders, spectators are asked not to bring radios, stadium chairs, and umbrellas into the stands.

Rest Rooms

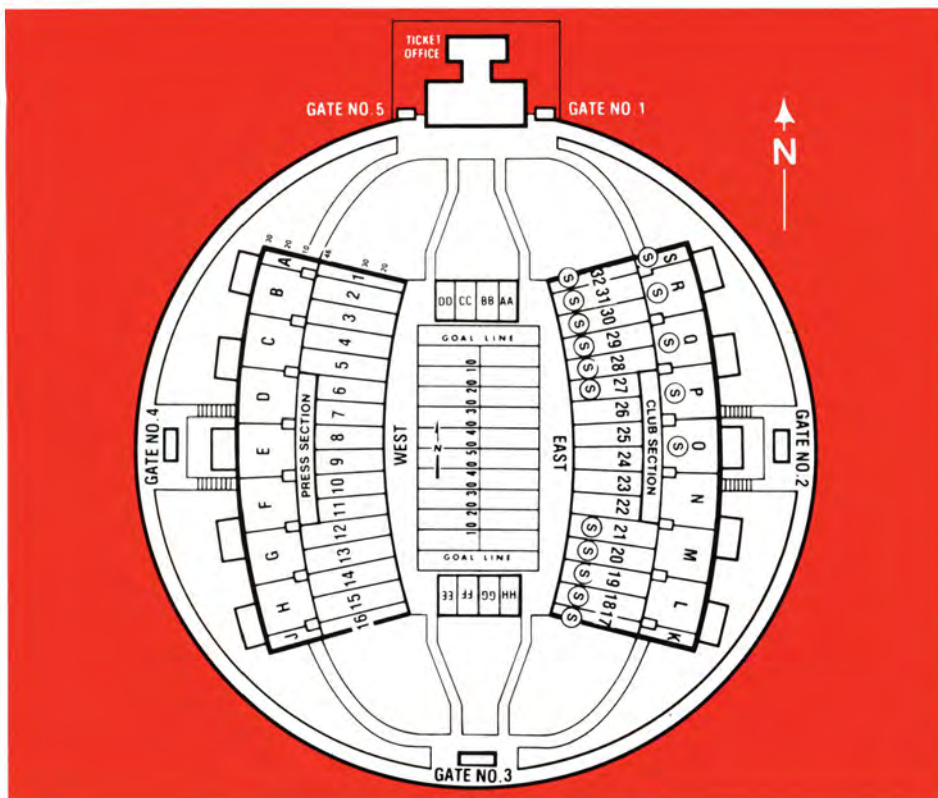
Rest rooms are located throughout the stadium behind each concession stand.

Public Address System

No appeals will be made over the public address system except under exceptional circumstances. The public is asked not to request this service.

Wheelchairs

Special areas in sections 18 and 19 are available for spectators in wheelchairs. In addition, wheelchair seating is available on the field level



behind the goalposts.

No coolers of any size will be permitted in the stadium.

Carry-in Packages & Articles

Please do not bring into the stadium, bottles, cans, apples, oranges, toilet tissue, etc. Items thrown on the field can result in a penalty for the home team.

The State of Iowa code prohibits the use of alcohol in the Stadium. The Athletic Department asks our patrons to behave responsibly and in compliance with the State code.

Parking Lot Facilities

The ISU Athletic Department is one of the very few athletic facilities to provide portable toilets for their patrons in the parking lots. These are located in strategic spots throughout the stadium parking area.

Stadium Sign Policy

Iowa State promotes and encourages the display of signs. All signs must be in good taste and supportive of Iowa State University. Signs are to be displayed on the south end of the Olsen Building and on the walls of the stands, both upper and lower decks. In no case may the sign obstruct vision or endanger fans. Signs must be stationary. All signs must be approved by Iowa State's athletic department. For sign approval, see Jim Overturf, Room 137 Olsen Building, before noon on Friday prior to home games. The athletic department

reserves the right to move or remove any signs not meeting these specifications.

Emergency Road Service

Iowa State University and Iowa AAA Motor Club will provide an Emergency Road Service for persons attending home football games. This service will be in effect during and within two hours after the game throughout the season. The phone number for the service is 292-2303. Proof of game attendance (i.e.; ticket stub) may be requested.

Distractions

We want to make football Saturday a totally enjoyable experience and want to encourage you to be respectful of those around you in the stadium. This attitude of cooperation can help to insure pleasant, enthusiastic game atmosphere. In the event you feel there is unreasonable distraction in your seating area, we ask you to take the following steps to help us control undesirable behavior:

- Note the seating section, row and seat number(s), and inform the usher in your section of the disturbance. The usher will observe the conduct and request it to stop, if appropriate.

- If the conduct continues, the usher will get assistance from a uniformed policeman to request improvement of behavior or to remove the fan(s) from the stadium.


- An additional occurrence is cause for removal from the stadium and could be grounds for relocation in next season's ticket assignment.

CYCLONES IN THE PROS

As the pro football training camps opened in August, seven former Cyclone standouts were listed on NFL rosters. The most recent addition to the "Cyclones in the Pros" list is Ankeny linebacker Dennis Gibson, an eighth round draft choice of the Detroit Lions who starred for Iowa State from 1983-86.

Gibson is the latest in a long list of Iowa State players who went on to professional careers, beginning with Lew Reeve who played one season with the Chicago Tigers in 1920. Over the years, ex-Cyclones Matt Blair, Jim Doran and Mike Stensrud, among others, have made their marks in the National Football League. In all, 60 former Iowa State football players played one or more seasons in the professional leagues.

The current group of NFL Cyclones includes David Archer, a 25-year old former free agent who beat the odds to become starting quarterback for the Atlanta Falcons. In addition to Archer and Gibson, tight end Dan Johnson of the Miami Dolphins, offensive linemen Karl Nelson of the New York Giants and Bruce Reimers of Cincinnati, linebacker Chris Washington of Tampa Bay and defensive back Kevin Williams of Buffalo are the Cyclones in the Pros heading into the 1987 football season.



No. 16 Quarterback David Archer sat out the last five games of the 1986 NFL season with an injury but was 150 of 294 for 2,007 yards in 11 games.

No. 57 Linebacker Dennis Gibson was one of Iowa State's top defensive players in 1986 and has made a place for himself on the roster of the Detroit Lions this season.

No. 49 Chris Washington, ISU's career tackle leader, was a starter at outside linebacker last year for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

No. 23 Defensive back Kevin Williams has played for both the Washington Redskins and Buffalo Bills in the NFL since leaving Iowa State in 1984.

No. 63 Karl Nelson helped pave the way to the NFL Championship for the Giants last year as a blocker in front of Joe Morris and Phil Simms.

No. 87 Although bothered by injuries, tight end Dan Johnson played in 15 games last year for the Miami Dolphins.

No. 72 Bruce Reimers was a leader on the Cyclone offensive line from 1979-83 and has enjoyed a successful professional career with the Cincinnati Bengals.

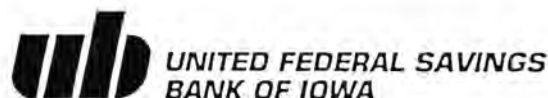

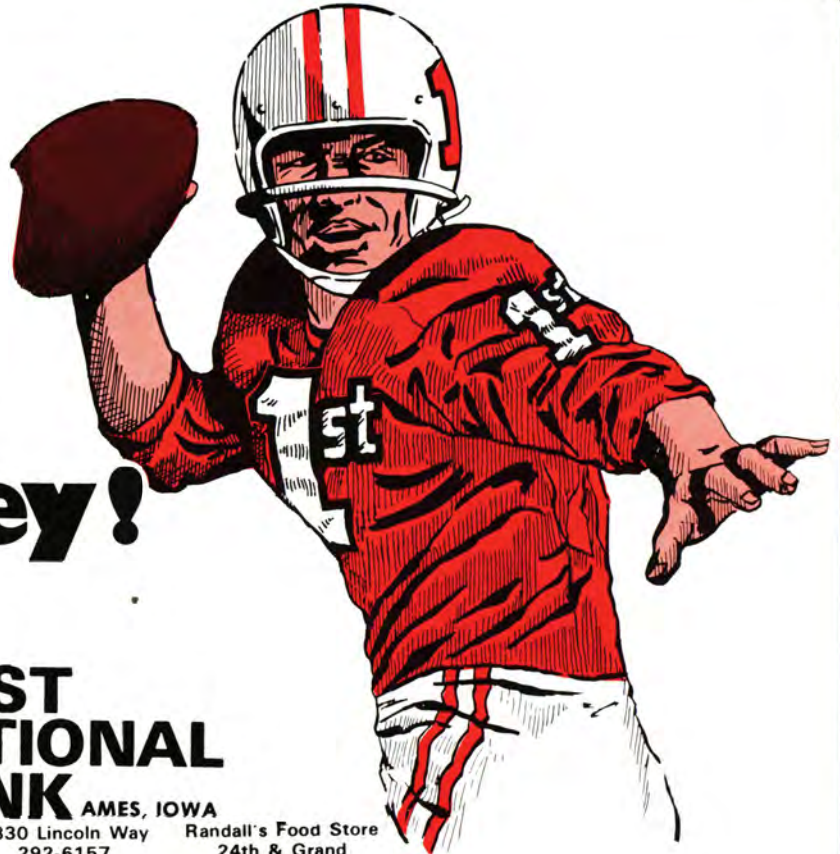

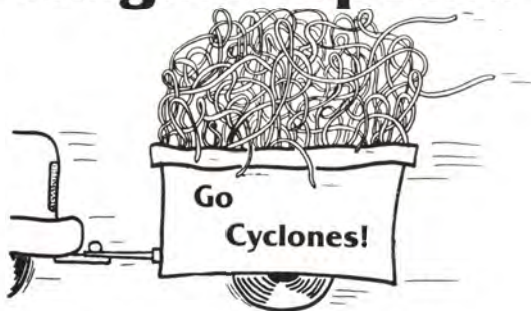

CYCLONE STADIUM/JACK TRICE FIELD

Without a doubt, the most beautiful and convenient football facility in the Big Eight Conference is the 50,000-seat Cyclone Stadium-Jack Trice Field.

Located on a 30-acre tract, the stadium is part of the ISU Center on the southeast corner of the Ames campus.

In December of 1983, the Iowa State University football facility was officially named. The name of the stadium itself is Cyclone Stadium, with the field now named for and dedicated to Jack Trice, Iowa State's first black athlete, who died from injuries he received in his first major college football game in October 1923.

The stadium offers an unobstructed view of the playing field as well as remarkably easy access from all parts of the state. The ISU Center includes the stadium, James H. Hilton Coliseum, C. Y. Stephens Auditorium, J. W. Fisher Theater, the Carl Scheman Continuing Education Building, with lighted parking for 4,000 vehicles.

The stadium was completed in less than two years from the ground breaking, on October 26, 1973, to the first game, a victory over Air Force, on September 20, 1975.

In late 1973 and early '74, heavy

earth-moving equipment shaped the embankments. A huge, moveable form shaped the lower decks with thousands of cubic yards of concrete.

Originally, the stadium had a capacity of 42,500, all on the sidelines. In 1976, end-zone bleachers were constructed to bring the capacity to more than 48,000. Standing room tickets, sold for each game, bring the capacity to more than 50,000.

The record crowd was 54,066 for the 1983 Iowa State-Iowa game.

The press box is located between the upper and lower decks. There is seating for 123 sports reporters and eight broadcast teams as well as a cafeteria serving area and two photographic dark rooms. The press box is structured so that the media representatives can enter using ramps from either end of the stadium, eliminating the need for an elevator. There is an enclosed camera deck atop the west stands.

Opposite the press box on the east side is a modern club section, seating in theater seats. Included in the club section is a lounge as well as rest room facilities.

The stadium contains 16,000 tons of reinforced concrete, 1,000 tons of

structural steel and has a four-inch-thick asphalt base under a new All-Pro Turf playing field. The All-Pro Turf, replaced in the summer of 1985, stretches from the edge of the stands on each side and 20 yards beyond each end zone. This allows for maximum practice space.

There are fully electronic scoreboards at each end of the stadium, while the north end area features the ISU Victory Bell, and a statue of Cy the Cardinal.

The Ralph A. Olsen Building is adjacent to the north end of the stadium. The Olsen Building, named in honor of the prominent Ellsworth farmer and alumnus, houses the athletic administration facilities.

Included in the Olsen Building are locker rooms, team meeting rooms, football coaching offices and staff rooms, the sports medicine clinic, Cyclone Club offices, athletic ticket offices and maintenance facilities.

The total cost of the stadium was \$7.6 million. It was paid for through contributions of alumni, friends and businesses to the Iowa State Foundation, as well as athletic receipts. More than 15,000 contributors have participated in ISU Foundation projects.

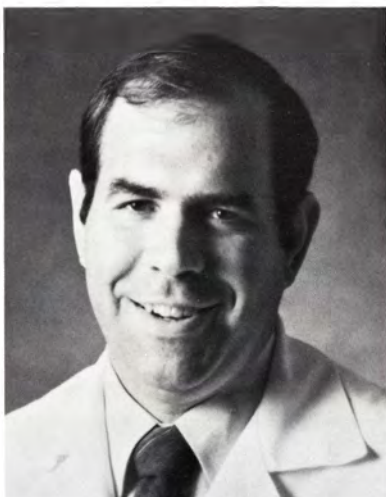

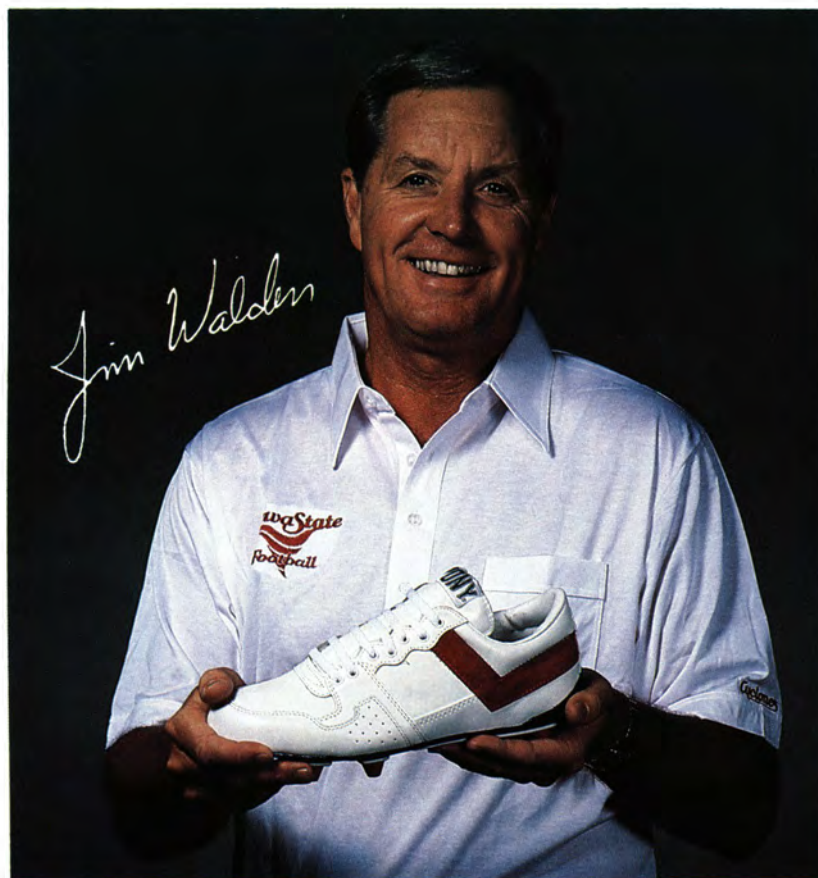
