Cent rabbit

11/7 - With Herb Ptaats at Hills Club on Monday morning where we had a hot spot. Not many new ducks but the corn mallards were swelling. We got 16, by noon & then during PM, went quail hunting & I got a big cock ringneck.

11/12 Red & I with Jim & Otto started at Crystal Lake - on mallards - Lots of early corn fed mallards a bit soggy & wouldn't quit come so we came home at 10:00 Red & I started north for Coopersville & pheasants - near Kerhus Club, found a spot. 4 miles north of Coopersville & then went a 1/4 with a friendly farmer, hunted & started up his ditch at 12:00. Competition killed a rooster at road edge, & we went on to get 4 cocks. Saw 5 or 6 coveys of quail & could not hit them with shot & + 6 shot. Duct at 4:00 with 4 cocks, which did a fine job.

11/13 Edith & Red, Jimmy - Lingo left for Farmington at 8:30 AM. Which stayed at home to give the new dog a chance to show. & drove down in a pea soup fog & arrived in the same. Our first stop was an hour & a 1/4 before we finally hit a good cooty batch near the car. Jumped aside by Lingo - one indeed still wild but got one. Then got 4 straight all tough running shots. Took Edith & Jim to a

corner to cook our spare ribs. Bear stone quarry. Found a small cooney & Red nearly got a white cat. Killed 2 out of 3 - red had to eat lunch with 7 shells. The ribs were wonderful. Jim seems to love it all, and he is a steady walker. Never admits he is tired or cold.

Got out a big cooney at school house. They were strong fliers. Got 3 with a lot of misses. Ended up with a long walk along sweet hound hedge etc. which yielded a little group of 4. Killed one on cooney rice.

Linga is a hard enthusiastic hunter. Found all my 10 down birds very effectively. Seldom holds a point unless I am close. Retriever very very well. Far the ability to be very warmly friendly - and a tremendous appetite. Guess I'll buy him.

"16 Crystalabalone - Not bad down & Frank & Giehe joined at Run. Very cold & chipping temp. Saw ice. A few mallards winged & they decoyed pretty well. Beautiful bright morning after a clouded start. Giehe left at 8:00 with one mallard. I left at 10 with 3 + 1 lesser scaup.

"17 Edith - Linga & F.L. north of Farmington. Road slick ice all the way down there. 30 mi. per hr top. 3/4 snow on the ground at 10:30 when we started. Linga still flushed the cover & held up a bit on singles. I made two doubles. Edith killed her first bird in several seasons.

Slings is "hellion rabbit". If I buy him I'll have to give him a name of some kind.

Found 4 covies - big ones - except, that may be had on about 10 huds. Heard no others hunting parties lots of rabbits.

11/26 Edith - old Hick - on perhaps her last quail hunt. She did some good work - made good points, but her nose on crippler was poor and her ankles kept collapsing and her hind legs were stiff.

We were north of Farmington. Found 3 covies shot very poorly. Plenty of birds this year. Lots of rabbits

Found much hazel brush - with lots of nuts. Short cut to the area - turn north at cemetery at railroad right of way. Go thru village about 4-5 miles north, then take 1st road to left & in a couple of miles turn right.

Just finished hulling our hazel nuts.

11/27 Edith - Jim & Paco & I left home about 9:15 for Farmington & north. Sky overcast & stormy, blowing N.W. Soon got much colder & before we arrived snow blowing hard & level. I nail very wild or she they lay so tight no jump. First stop made a long loop down a draw. So huds - Jim returned to car & Edith flushed a covey 60 feet from our car in a small draw. When I returned to our car we followed

the birds flushed wild at 50 yards - second flush I killed one. A crippl we had trouble catching. Moved on went to familiar ground where we found scatter of yesterday covey. Got one an 2nd rise. Then we got up wild covey near farm field. Hit a 2nd rise scatter.

Very proud of how Jim stood the wind & cold. Saw the best herded cedar I ever saw on the bank of the broken river.

1 $\frac{1}{2}$ Edith & I - Fly left at 11:15 AM, for N.W. of Farmington. Snappy - below freeze - breeze N.W. First covey out smarted us & no birds. Went on N. to new area - scrub corns blue stem a plenty - & oak brush. Covey size in leafy oaks - on the follow & we never saw this covey again we jumped another - with a 12 min. Confusion on nowhere were our birds. We jumped just a few singles - & mixed - lost a dozen crippl. Which more about gone - Grade a long hill earlier with a 10' lead. Back to car & a dream popped quail - a covey less than 15 yds from car. Killed a good kick, couldn't find the - over the hill - scatter. Never did shoot worse - unless it was last week.

1 $\frac{1}{2}$ Saturday. Red & I with Paco went north of Farmington to place Edith & I found 1 $\frac{1}{2}$. Most exciting prospect as to covey etc but no birds to be found at all. Later moved to Hazel nut hills & gathered a bag of mts. Red raised a small covey number at least 4 home - 1 covey - no birds.

14/11 Red-Paco - & I - north of Kappa. Country & condition
looked excellent but found only 2 covies in 4 hrs.
I killed 4 with 9 shells. Last two were down at one
time - both cripples - runner & in oak tree top.
Took at least 20 or more rounds but finally found
both of them. Red got greenbrier berries.

1956 Season

The Crystal Lake water so low that I didn't buy a license until 2 weeks after season opened.

About $\frac{1}{4}$ I went over & joined Ed Lady & got a green head at Point. Red & I tried a day or 2 later but no shots.

Then weather changed $\frac{1}{8}$ Red & I drew last & were invited by Dick & Walter to Point where we got our 4 mallards early. Next day tried again & drew 2nd & Ran where we got only 2. Lots of trouble going thru.

The big flight started Red P.M. $\frac{1}{7}$ - Ran thru $\frac{1}{8}$ & the morning of $\frac{1}{9}$, lots of scaups as well as mallards.

Goodies all gone far & much now.

$\frac{1}{10}$ Pheasant opening - Elih, Red, Jim - Fred & I drove to Tom Velters farm & arrived just at 12:00 noon to open season. A hatchet of Roanhan helped us get O.K. We had a fine afternoon, got 4 cocks & 3 quail.

Fred enjoyed his first hunt, & did well. I had a cock & didn't find out till back at Velters. An extra mile & half search - no luck. Then I remembered rolling under a fence. At dark I went back & found the cock at the fence - felt better. Shot at 4 cocks & got 4, two got up wild - out of range - because we failed to follow close enough to the dog.

11/11 Sunday, Family Picnic. Started 9:30 AM with Red & 2 boys & Spud. Marion & Frances to follow at noon.
Drove to Ted's house. His "2 corners east of the house" could
not be found, even going an extra $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to 300m
field. Looked good - no quail? Too dry? Went back
to home & watched Red's covey in draw to west. Big covey
scattered on 1st rise & lost one - then lost another &
Red lost one. So dry & so many rabbits. Spuds
had a good score but doesn't know much about
close work. Girls had sandwiches ready at 1:30.
Yum! Took a few pictures.

Drove north & east to colored man's house
Found a big covey & killed & found 3 on the rise.
Added another. That made 9 killed on 14 shells (2 bad)
Then proceeded to double miss 3 straight - all
tough shots. The boys were enthusiastic & good company.
11/15 "11/15 - Alone at Crystal Lake. Lehner invited me to
join. The forecast of rain turning to snow foiled out
& the flight was not uninteresting. At Paint. Together
we got 4 g. w. teal & Johnson a mallard.

11/16 Red & I turned out early to a clear cold blow, & got
2nd draw. - Run. Beautiful AM, bright sky. A
modest flight. We managed 3 mallards. So good
chances. All far. I found a green head that
dropped way back at end of pond to right rear,
Young dry. Trilled and not formed our younger
Home at noon.

11/18 Red & I tried a new area, south of Konza & east of Hollar. We didn't find many birds but the country looked good. The first two places we tried didn't produce anything but a scatter-moderate birds. Then along side the R.R. track we finally got a covey of 9 or 10 birds. Got 4 cocks with the first shot. (5).

Later out of Hollar we i.e. I had flushed a covey, too far up the hill & I had again flushed the birds. too far. I was ever good company & did a lot of walking. Bright warm day with a colorful sunset.

11/20 Red & I tried the duck - big S.W. storm & rain at 10:00 AM. Found houses empty - walked off Kawhina, Wunder, George Goldie, Philip ditch Eatons & back thru big woods total seen 2 hen mallards. Sat till 4:00 in blind - still no ducks. Milk didn't ripen last summer.

11/21 John H. - Red & I. 1K^o above & N.W. wind. Last draw again. Got home blind. Ice forming fast everywhere. I got a wet foot & had to go home for a dry boot. We jammed into the little blind. Got a single - then 4 decoys & we got only two. Then a single wing neck. Kept busy breaking ice to keep the blocks free. Snappy plus. Left at 11:30 for Thanksgiving at Golf Club.

11/25 Stephen, Red and I went north of Hannington - Rain snow, wind, cold. We were late and found only scatter all day. Coville broken up earlier. Stephen walked all day. Carried a gun for a few minutes.

11/28 A call from Spedal - at 9:45 AM - lot of slush & shooting brought me hot. foot. Red couldn't come. The ice in front of my boat still heavy enough to hold me & the boat. I pushed across to open water. Found Rehner in Dr. L. & upper end full. I took Kauke Blnd & set out alone. 15° wind N.W. & mixed sky - some snow. Typical wind-up hunt.

A pair of fin-tails from south fooled me. M.L. got them. Then a long vacant spell - occasional big flocks - high. More north bound than south. The Big Blnds got little shooting. Kat soup kept me warm.

Wid a scaup sneaked in & sat - before I saw him. Finally noticed him & collected. Then a hen mallard landed in & lit before I could shoot. No turns - I collected. Pulled up at 4:05 PM Chilly - but a beautiful day.

12/1 Red and I took Stephen & Jim North of Farmington. Stephen had a gun for the first time. He felt the importance of the privilege. Most of the time he carried the gun empty. He had one fair rabbit chance but forgot to cock his hammer, so no shot.

I started from town at 7:30 AM & did arrive ahead of competition, but found only small cover plus scatter of earlier hunters on more cover.

Found a good area about 1 mile east of Bentonsport as well as another area a bit east of the Rota area.

12/2. Ill. Hunt - got a late start - as Red & Marney had been at Charity Ball last night. Started north of Hoppers & got up a huge covey in field at hedge - Fred flushed them up wild & I failed to connect at covey size. Then got better on the weather & ended with 5 birds on this covey.

Up the big hill & got a covey at the colly night corner, where I added 4 birds after some had missed. Red was not connecting, at 12:15 down the steep hill to where Edith & Jim were to catch sparrows. When they had phoned Marney to bring Francy & the 2 Barker dogs, the ribs were a great success. After the big fragments of Hopper to the old commoner, 12 birds till we got on the east slope where Fred flushed a small group wild. In the follow, I got one. Then along Ellison & I got a fancy single snap shot. Then went to foot of hill where we got a covey & Red killed his first bird & I got another.

As we got to see a huge covey spattered out & I threw 4 barrels in the air & got none.

Saw a big bald eagle at luncheon time. The sun it was over to remember. Gold, blue green & all the yellows & orange colors, he perched about a shack on the hill top. !!!!

12/8 Red & Stephen & Jim - joined me for an Illinois hunt. First snow & more falling thru the day. Started north of Rappah. The birds were laying like glue. Red made a double on the first coney birds. He failed to get one single.

The second coney I flushed on the rise & we didn't follow because of small number. Then climbed the hill & found the same coney in S.E. corner of hill top field. Again raised only 1 single.

Then I flushed another coney out of a gully & they failed us too. Found no single here. Jim got very cold & headed far east. But we got him warmed up when the fire rose. Pack shops thick & good.

In PM, the boys stayed at home. Stephen fell into creek & got wet half way up. Very cold by the time we got back from the south ground. Where we found 2 conies & Red made another double.

Eight birds for the 2 of us. Still snowing & cold

12/9 Red & I alone north of Oquawha. Snow 5" deep -aborre this AM. Bright blue sky. We found a beautiful spot about 4 miles south of Keithsburg. We found a few scatter & coney before lunch, but couldn't hit no at 2:00 we had 1 bird a piece.

After lunch we drove to Keithsburg & then east & south. We started watching for tracks along the hedge as we passed. Mr Brown's farm showed a big bunch of

track so we tried & found & killed several. Then another coon just a hit west & we scared again. Then we tried a hedge corner & added 3 & so on till we had 13 hids. Our best of the season. Red was keeping up his end too. One of our best days.

This is the biggest quail year in 10 or 15 years. Saw about 7 coons today $1\frac{1}{2}$ q

12/15 Saturday. Red & I headed for north of Ogallala. Snow on the ground 4-5". Just at freezing - frost turned to moisture on my hands of gun. A shower at every step. Red emptied his Bear's Boots 3 times.

Good finished his first season with quite an improvement. Retrieved fairly - pointed a little and lost only one cripple out of 74 hids.

Sam Gunn seems to have no fear for him. Settin could not have made his mark today.

Jim Rodgers met us again today - warden. Didn't see a single mallard where we saw 1000 last week. Red shot better with his brush loads - he reacts to his better performance of course.

Arrived about 4:00 PM at Bethel Station - Al having picked me up at Parage Bar Station. We hurried into hunting clothes and paddle east a $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to a sheltered phragmites cove. Learned how to stabilize a canoe for shooting by tying phragmites stems lengthwise at 2 points each side.

The birds were everywhere in small numbers - geese. Paced up channel at lesser scaups to favor mallards. Had several had misses but finally scared one a greenhead. Al had not brought his gun. Up here they shoot till 30 minutes past sundown when it is quite dark.

A few geese trading back & forth from big lake to stubble field. Almost constant moving ducks, with lesser scaup predominant. Practically no canvas-back. An occasional woodie - too

Thursday we ate a hasty breakfast and Al did some darning & we went out to same point i.e., Wayne took me out because Al was tied to duty. We moved along later - to a point beyond the Lodge - hoping for canvas back but none showed. Shot a little better and brought in 5.

Al and I went out in later of morning - far east where he had a canoe & flock ready. The same kind of flight but more mallards. He net out on an east facing phragmites point and had several nice shots at singles & pairs. Beautiful Delta sunset.

Spent at the guest lodge with the Precault from Rhia. Joan joined us of course Cl.

Friday. No hurry here - we worked at many projects in the morning. Precault left about 10:00 AM, leaving me as the only Lodge guest. I drove out to Bell Lodge to see Peter Grud & he said the east marsh was not being hunted.

The lee shore (south) of Lake Manitoba was full of flocks of ducks resting. Some geese too. At dusk the birds go out too while as the marsh Al left me after an hour gunn shooting, where I got 3 straight green heads. He went in to get young Albert who was returning from his week at school in Portage. He hunted a fair for the flight.

but we had fun. Frank & Kenney & mother
& grand father were with us. Got to bed early for
the big sharp tail opening.

Saturday 10/2. Breakfast at 6h with young
al & young George at 5:00 AM. Off in Al's car for
the sharp tail grounds - 50 miles west & north.
To find the place turn left off highway a mile west
of Lakeland and drive 5 or 10 miles to the
marginal country that holds the birds. Ken
Hillman was to meet us there at working & hunting
ground - he came later.

Arrived 6:30 AM & practically dark. The prairie
chicken were calling all around us - with their

voluntary flutter. Groups sometimes 30 or more
at a time, moving to feeding ground. We
followed and soon were getting some shots,
although most birds jumped away too wild.

I got a fair shot & then another out of old

& then off again north of road. Ken & Peter too.

Got into very rough land - hard walking and very wet. Just before noon a real occasion th. with Al as witness. Blushed 2 birds - midway between us. My shot. With my first barrel both birds dropped dead. They were "in line" and 6 feet apart. So I had 4 birds at noon lunch.

Al had blarkele & we napped after luncheon. About 1:30 we were off. Again Albert found me and we hunted together. In a brusly island of prairie we each killed one - back to back. Later we both shot two boys at a bird & at my second shot he was bad hit. I watched & saw him drop dead after about 200 yards. Marked & followed. Dropped while handkerchief & coat to establish line. After 10 minutes found my dead bird in base of bush & within 4-6 of my line.

Back to car - tired - and waited for Al & others. I sat off 100 yards or a pass & soon had a chance & killed a seventh bird. Al and the boys also had done well and we had our limit of 18 sharp tail prairie chicken. Harkness fell right after we started home. A hot shower restored my ability to move about a bit and a couple of drinks gave me an appetite for lunch which

Unpicked and not drawn up flocks for home will be picked & dressed, too.

One of the students (Lloyd) showed us how to sex birds by tail feather marking and age by 2nd primary. Age by crow marking - short & straight across 2 - longer marking of dash crow marks 3. Rough tip on 2nd primary = young - smooth & new = old

1957 Hunting Season

10/20 Ducks opened yesterday 10/19 but went to see Jr.- Div. football which we won 21-7. Red and I were joined by John Hale and drew Inverness which was not good in this low water stage. Set out on the Pilgrim Island Point where we had one shot only & I killed a green head. Saw few ducks. Opening day 16 hunting hill 34 ducks

10/24 - Went to draw alone - Red being sick with flu. Joined Paul Lehner & drew Schafner Room. Looked red-hot early while putting out blocks. Lot of mallards Then the duck disappeared. Panned up one long chance At 7:30 went for a walk to Youngs-Philip-Holden. Bert Lake & Buck Brush & killed 1 blue winged teal. Home at 10:10 AM.

10/25 Went to the office around & greeted by RMF. More ducks in the river than I've ever seen. So gathered up Red & got over about 10:00. Inverness - only good opening. Sat for 40 minutes & not a shot. Then looked although they should be near full limit & so moved & found they were leaving. We moved in. Such a night of mallards I haven't seen in years. And chequing too. Sam Jones sr. joined us a few minutes later.

I put out four marsh for a pup of 2 years. The mallards wanted to drop in back in pool & little Young so I moved back there. Soon had 5 big mallards on a string.

as they passed. And one more out of return fire. Waited over
2 hours but little come in - Stephen killed a baldpate.

Got 2 more in Flat Top well. Returned to car & house
Not much action in flying birds as compared to yesterday.

11/8 Looked ducky. Wind N.W. 25 MPH and colder. So I went to
office early & left for Hydaburg 8:25 AM. arrived Phillips 9:20. jumped
about 30 mallards there. Set out "a few blacks. No quick
return & little flight traveling. So walked thru Cunigan
no ducks - ditch dry. To Brush Brush - 1 drake - which I got.
Returned to Phillips no - mittens - so to Ash Tree - 10 or 12
mallards & got my 4th. at Eatons. Back saw but rounds

and while eating lunch 3 green heads dropped & I
got 2 of them. Then the wind came back with big
boats & motor - to deep water. In office at 1:15 PM.

- 11/9 Iowa University - Da 44. Sun 20 !!!
11/10 Red Stephen & I went to Bettis with our usual
1/5 of Bourbon & hopped, Spuds & Jason to help.
We worked from noon to 4:30 - hard - saw 3 or
maybe 4 coots (Red had 1 shot) 13 hens, 3 couples of
quail. Stephen killed a rabbit - all on his own.
11/12 Herb & Belle Staahl came in at noon & after lunch
we took a quail hunt while the girls washed the birds
game with Pauline & Phyllis.

We started SW of Irene & found no birds. Moved
to west of Lemmarch & found 1 couple. Got a double on the
rice and then proceeded to miss several. Got 4 with 8 shells

- 11/13 Herb S. and I left about 9:00 AM to hunt & to take
Jane to Russell Fair at Weston. We made a hunting
stop near Bloomfield & found only a 5 bird couple & didn't
hunt further. I killed a banded cat.

Moved on to a new place south of Benterville where
we found 2 couples & got 5 birds. Herb drafted me near
Iro. birds at 3:00 PM to hunt while he went to
Tipton with the dog. I hunted hard for 2 hours in
drizzle & found 1 bird only - no shot.

With over an hour to wait I had told H. I'd build a fire
by the roadside - which I did. Got dried out by Harveyall
I have been in fog & arrived 9:00 PM.

11/16 Went alone to north of Kopper at 9:00 AM - hunted till 11:30 and found only 3 scattered birds got none. I find it doesn't seem to find the cover.

11/17 Edith & I took Jim - to Farmington for the day. Went to Hazel-mut hill & found a big covey & got 1 bird only. Then moved north & left Edith & Jim to cook's farm while I found a covey & killed 3 birds. Then I walked back to find more birds - 2 locations & down a blank. Those who say this is a big quail year don't know their facts.

11/19 Alone to Crystal to try a stormy morning. Joined Paul & Lannie Lehman & Drew Stoney. Where we watched the day break & saw few ducks. Had a pair of green heads & then at 9:30 I walked to Eatoni & Ash Tree & got a double on green heads & then moved 5 straight shots at mallards coming by me in the timber.

11/23 Saturday. Edith & I went beyond Denmark, Combination nothing & quail. We left home at 9:00 & went to Hickory Grove. Thru lot of fine quail country. Gathered some fine big nuts. Then left Edith for a turn at quail. Worked a lot of good country & found no birds. Home for the Iowa State Game game & lunch. Drove 21 to N.D. 13.

At 3:30 I went to Crystal for a late walk. Rained to Stoney & walked to Eatoni - no ducks. Rained thru Ash Tree - to George still zero. Finally a single hen in little young. Whoo! Fleated woodpecker again - each day I hear at Eatoni or Stoney woods a racoon snort on the lane. I stopped the car & walked right hind car. I stepped out he kept on, & I picked him up by the tail & he remained calm. I released him & he ambled off now - shallant thru tall.

"1/24 Edith Spaul & I - near Keithsburg. The big barren over too
tough with prickly pear spines for the dog, so we went too
the hedges where Red & I found birds last year.

We soon found a covey - no warning of the covey rise &
I wasn't ready & missed a barrel. The wind blew hard & the
birds were fast & tiring. I made some good shots
missed some. Got 3 big females. The farmer's owner
& son or grandson came to kick us out & invited friends
invited us to return and ask permission.

We kept trying to find birds & get a place to hunt.
We quit at 4:30 & didn't find another bird.

"1/29 Supposed to be a Thanksgiving Hunt. Red & I took the boys
up the Stoney Timber in the car & I proceeded to get the car
'stuck in the mud'. We spent 2 hours digging out & got home just
in time to have Golf Club dinner.

"1/31 Stephen, Red & I to Pennmark. 10:00 to 4:00 hunt &
found only 1 small covey & got one quail. Re-hunted
lot's of fine coveys - empty. Stephen tried his hand at
rabbits & no luck.Flushed a big cock pheasant.

"2/1 Left home at 10:00 AM - west to Flanville & north west.
Drew London - morning sun etc. Still found no big
quail population. Killed 3 straight including a double.
Then missed 7 shots - including 2 dbl misses. Then killed
2 straight.

New Place. About 1½ miles west of Drews. Go south on dirt road
several miles to find a 40 acre grass & brush area. flushed
a hen pheasant at 100 yards.

12/7 Red, Jim, & Spud & I headed for Farmington at 9:00 AM. We turned off at a new side road & found good territory. Got permission from farm woman. Trouble with Fred chasing calves & sheep. Punished him hard.

Two covies before a 1:00 PM lunch. Got 3 straight then added 3. Moved on to familiar areas & found no birds where I know they have been found.

Finally at 4:00 PM, got a late coney where I killed out on the rise & therefore never did find the feathers. Lots of rabbits. We hope to go tomorrow at 8:00

12/8 Red over slept & Stephen was tired after a scout camp Friday night so Jim & I went alone. A light snow hanging on all vegetation. We went back to Farmington - new place - We hunted hard thru three coney locations - without seeing a track or a feather. Got soaked thru near to the waist in melting snow. Jim tried to get his gun trained on a rabbit but the 20 gauge was a bit heavy & long stocked.

After lunch in the car with motor & heater running we tried several added stops & still no feathers.

Finally at 3:45 Jim decided on a final spot. We had just started when several quail jumped - and I got one - a few yards more and I dropped another & then another across the creek. Jim just got the biggest kick & a spark. Finally as it got dark Jim still wanted to keep hunting. It's gone backwards made date for next Saturday.

12/14 Red, Jim, Spud & I. Stopped first at Mr Cook's house & with his permission hunted a pretty area. Found a covey & got one there. Then a long interval looking for scatter. Spud pointed & we knocked down 2 - one big Jim but failed to find his bird. Red & I took an hour walk to good area - no birds. Lunch on Cook's lawn.

Next 2 stops blank - then tried a quarry edge & jumped big covey & I killed a coulton on the rise. Would finding scatter but Red & I too on after a long bushy try. Jim whacked a rabbit with pebbles on a near miss.

One more stop - no birds

12/15 Jim Stephen Red Edith Spud & I at 8:30 for points S.W. Back to yesterday's quarry & soon found another covey. Mamma got her bird & then rest of us missed, so 1 that one quail. There were only 5 left so we didn't follow. Stopped at some false leads - no birds.

new place After lunch found a place 4.3 miles south of Homelot and then west 1 mile. Red & I went alone - killed a black cat - i.e. Spud did most of it. He helped with a steel part.

That very poorly. Neither out of three birds - one even hit the ground & then flew on. One covey just hid in a tree for an hour.

Finally a hit before dark we - Red & I - made a last turn & after long walk thru corn edges. Spud pointed. I made a key double - but one flew on after hitting the ground. On the other bird - many feathers & no bird. So - a double & no

bird, despite Spuds best efforts. I decided to try for the second bird that had flown away crippled. On the line for 125 yds & a good sound bird flushed. On the return walk - I found my dead bird right on my line.

We went back to the flushed site. + Spud pointed & after 2 or 3 advances caught my second bird so I had my double. This being the only day of the season I had killed my six birds.

Spud killed a big black cat - with white markings. This is the first time he has showed a fight against Blood. Three cats for the season.

Ilenio duck opening passed as I went to
Iowa - Is in. football.

Next morning Red & two boys & I drew Young and
set out there but got an hour from mallards at Hick Tree
where there was just a little water. A few days later I
went back to Hick Tree & the water & the ducks were
gone from there.

"1/1 Iowa Fair Opening - Red & Jim & I with Fred
in West Point Area. Found a good place. Turn
south on valley side road $\frac{1}{2}$ mile east of town. Go
south about a mile to big farm on left - woman in
charge - says OK. if we ask permission.

Later moved west of W. P. where we found 2
coveys about a mile west of town on north-south road.
Jim stayed in car at this point. Fred pointed covey
immediately. Even I double missed at least we didn't
find the bird I thought I had dropped on it shot.
Followed & rained another covey where I got 1 & then
thought I missed on a pair of scatter. Later found a
lonely dead hen lying where one may have flown.
Scatter flew toward Jim & sure enough he had seen
them coming & watched 5 alights. He joined us with his
gun and killed his first quail. Great excitement.

11/2 Red not available at 8:00 AM. Jim had a blistered foot. Edith & Spud & I drove to 4 mile south of Ronnelson & 1 mile west and I sat in tree hour steady trying & found 1 covey of pheasants of which I got one & then quit. Where we had found corn last year was fallow or ploughed bean stubble.

Drove west to Farmington & north. Got permission on 1st east road as before. Finally found a covey at south end of far hedge & hit a double on the rise but lost one running cripple. Spud couldn't locate. Tried following into oak brush timber & Spud made 5 nice points but in the brush I missed the 4 I shot at.

Spud jumped a big black cat which I killed with a load of $\frac{1}{2}$ shot - a male.

Back to car & moved north to old area, & covey jumped wild. On scatter I got 2 out of three and that ended the day, early.

11/8 Pheasant opening day. Red Jim & I with Spud went to Veltier with our usual bottle of bourbon & were well received. At 10:00 AM we started north & soon flushed a lone hen. Then a cock I killed.
