EDITORIAL

A Palestinian's Point of View

The Arab Palestinian students are aware of increasing Zionist propaganda in this country, especially after the June war. They are also aware of the Zionist monopoly on the press and television in the United States. We would like to bring to your attention the psychological game Israel plays of the American public. The Palestinians have no objection to having Jews or others live with them on a equal basis in a state; however, we refuse and resent and will resist domination and take over by Zionism. We know that a great many Jews share us this virpoint and we are very thankful for their understanding.

The United States would be better off economically and ethically to stad for justice in the Middle East and stop helping Zionism which is practicing 'wzism techniques of astrocities in the Holy Land. Help us keep the Holy Land free all evils - Zionism, Communism, Anarchism and Dictatorship.
