The Inauguration of WILLIAM ROBERT PARKS as eleventh President of IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY

The first social scientist to be named president of Iowa State University, W. Robert Parks brought to the office 14 years' experience in teaching, five and one-half in research, seven as an educational administrator.

When he assumed office last July 1 he had already served the University 15 years—from 1948 through 1956 developing a program of course work and research in "Government and Agriculture," from 1958 through 1961 as dean of instruction, and after that, as academic vice president.

"Bob" Parks is a native of Tennessee. Born Oct. 13, 1915, the youngest of seven children, he attended country school through the tenth grade and completed high school at Fayetteville, the county seat, near his home town of Mulberry. A key player in sandlot sports, he explains: "I owned the balls, courtesy of my brother, Horace, who was the high school coach." He earned high school letters in basketball and baseball.

His decision to enter Berea College was influenced largely by two older brothers who had earned doctorates. One, Taylor, was then head of the history department at Berea, and is now employed by the State Department. The other, Joseph, is chairman of the history department at the University of Georgia.

"They gave me two good examples to follow," Dr. Parks says, "and they helped me financially."

Before he completed his sophomore year Dr. Parks had determined to go on to graduate study. He received the bachelor of arts degree in political science—public administration, public law and political theory—from Berea in 1937. The following year he earned the master of arts degree at the University of Kentucky, and received a graduate assistantship for further study at the University of Wisconsin.

There he shared an office with another political science graduate student, Ellen Sorge of Madison. They were married July 1, 1940, and ended their wedding trip in Washington, where Dr. Parks had taken a position with the Bureau of Agricultural Economics in the Department of Agriculture.

Both Dr. and Mrs. Parks completed their doctorates in 1948. They have two daughters. Andrea graduated in chemistry at Iowa State last spring, married, and is continuing her studies at Indiana University. Cynthia is a 12-year-old sixth-grade student.

Except for 30 months of navy duty 1943-5, Dr. Parks was with the USDA until 1948, directing re-

search in federal-state-local administrative relations, taxation and rural institutions, public land administration, and land utilization.

Iowa State faculty members familiar with his USDA work recommended him to set up the "Government and Agriculture" program at Iowa State. He left that assignment in 1956 to become chairman of graduate training in a newly established National Agricultural Extension Center for Advanced Study at the University of Wisconsin. But he had made a deep imprint at Iowa State, and when the University created the office of dean of instruction, it called him to fill it.

In announcing Dr. Parks' selection (Dec. 10, 1964) to succeed Dr. James H. Hilton as Iowa State's 11th president, State Board of Regents President A. W. Noehren said the board had made a thorough search among 140 of the nation's most capable educational administrators, and Dr. Parks "stood out significantly. . ."

When Dr. Parks returned from the Regents' meeting in Des Moines that afternoon, a large gathering of his colleagues was waiting on the steps of Beardshear Hall to welcome him in a spontaneous show of enthusiasm.

Dr. Hilton fully shared this enthusiasm, terming Dr. Parks "one of the ablest men with whom I've been privileged to work during my 42 years in education."

The reaction of the University's off-campus friends was expressed by the Des Moines Tribune, which declared editorially that Dr. Parks "possesses an ideal background. . .a skillful educational executive. . .widevisioned on the functions of a technical and scientific university. . ."

This "wide vision" was reflected in Dr. Parks' statements following his appointment: "What I want this university to be is broad-based in the liberal arts, with an orientation around science and technology. . . .Any man the Regents selected has real assets in following a great President, James H. Hilton, who has done so much for the school and the state of Iowa. . . Also, I'm particularly fortunate that I will be serving with a good group of administrators, a fine faculty, an outstanding student body. . .Iowa State is unique among the schools I know, for having a real tradition and atmosphere for hard work. . .I want to stay as close to the students as I possibly can. . .I want to go out and meet the people in the state, and our alumni everywhere. . ."

Sloshing up the muddy lane from Ames station in a mule-drawn farm wagon at dusk on a chill October day in 1868, Adonijah Welch beheld an unfinished hulk of Victorian architecture silhouetted on a naked sweep of prairie horizon.

He was a frail and gentleman, called to this desolate place as an instrument of a "great and essential mission."

He was formally inaugurated as Iowa State's first president the following March 17 in ceremonies which also dedicated the college building and opened the institution to 183 students who were "as poorly prepared as the surroundings."

Benjamin Gue later wrote that "no more unpromising College enterprise was ever launched into existence—even in the 'wild west.'"

But despite this, the March weather, and the difficulty of travel, more than 1,200 Iowans came to witness the inaugural program. In part theirs was a typical show of the "western enthusiasm" generated by any local enterprise, however uncertain. But more than that it was a show of faith in the "people's college" movement which had brought this institution into being.

The day had been a long time coming. The charter for this "people's college" had passed the Iowa General Assembly March 22, 1858. Under pressure of hard times the Assembly had provided only \$10,000 for establishment of the college. Even that modest allowance raised such opposition that Gue, co-author of the charter act and its most perusasive sponsor, had to resort to a tabling action to save the act from repeal.

Whether the college would ever become anything more than a legislative document was still in question the summer of 1862, when President Lincoln signed into law Justin Morrill's Land Grant Act for federal endowment of state schools embodying the "people's college" concept. With Gue again leading the debate, the Assembly voted the following March to award Iowa's endowment to Iowa State.

The day of the inaugural, dedication and opening began with welcoming remarks by Lieutenant Governor John Scott. After some "soul stirring" vocal and instrumental music, there was dinner for all, "so far as the capacity of the dining room and the amount of eatables held out."

Quite appropriately, the principal speaker of the formal program that afternoon was Benjamin Gue, then president of the College Board of Trustees. Governor Samuel Merrill presented the College charter and seal, President Welch delivered his inaugural address and Chairman of Agriculture Norton Townshend responded for the faculty.

Now, 97 years later, Iowa State's "great and essential mission" involves more than 14,000 students and 1,500 faculty members in six nationally eminent colleges comprising one of the nation's leading universities. A campus noted for its beauty provides the setting for a physical plant with a book value of \$71 million, including one of the nation's largest nuclear research facilities. Iowa State now ranks among the 20 leading educational research centers in the nation; its research and service functions embrace a dozen University agencies whose operations represent a combined annual budget of \$20 million.

Ninety-seven years ago it seemed optimistic to hope Iowa State would some day achieve excellence in its then narrowly defined area of instruction. Today it seems quite reasonable to expect Iowa State will continue to achieve excellence in steadily broadening areas of instruction, research and service.

Nine private citizens of Iowa comprise the State Board of Regents. Appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate, members serve six-year terms. Responsible to the Board are:

The Iowa Braille and Sight Saving School at Vinton

The Iowa School for the Deaf at Council Bluffs

Primary duty of the Board is the development and government of these institutions for the best interests of the people of Iowa. The Board appoints faculties and employees, and approves programs and curricula of the institutions. It makes rules for admission to them and for government of them. It controls their properties, directs the expenditures of their funds and administers trusts, gifts and grants tendered for various purposes.

The Board elects its own officers. It normally meets for two days each month, and it maintains a full-time staff to administer its business from offices in the State Office Building in Des Moines. Included in this staff are a secretary and a three-man finance committee who carry out ministerial duties assigned to them.
