
There was a new feature this year, though, an unscheduled University event. It was called Gentle Thursday, the big kids' Alice in Wonderland fantasy.










# Torch Tradition Perpetuated, Canoes Stay Intact







## '67 Campus Chest Attains \$18,000 Goal




Miss Legs finalists jained the Rowdy Red Roup to be auctioned off as waitresses for charity.

The big final dance with the Red Dogs ended the most successful Campus Chest Week ever.










# Engineers Say `Try It'!

Members of Orchesis prepared all choreography, stage designs, costumes, and programs. But Barjche was not sponsored by just dancing enthusiasts.


Among its participants were Don Graves, ISU football player, and Don Timmerman, ISU Track.

#### A Diverse Focus Program Attempts To Reach All Interests


Focus, ISU's annual spring festival highlighting arts and humanities, presented a little something for everyone.

Focus events were described as well balanced and so varied that it was hard to call one event outstanding.






The Focus program included an art exhibit and accompanying lecture.

The tour ended with a home concert in the armory before a record turnout.

They also participated in the Madrigal Dinner and Musica Antiqua, a program of music from the court of Frederick the Great of Prussia.

Song practice became a common and accepted thing in dormitories and sororities during Spring '67.

The girls were preparing for Sor-Dor, the annual singing competition between women's residences.

This year was a triumph for the dormitories as Welch Hall took first place, closely followed by Birch and Roberts.



#### Symphonic Band Tours Mid-West

Entertainment is provided for Iowa State Students by the five bands on campus. The marching band, Varsity band, symphonic band, stage band, and basketball band, participate in a variety of events.

Present at all our home football games are the 120 male members of the marching band along with the five twirlers, headed by Miss Cookie Richards, and two bell players. This year the band traveled to Kansas at Migration and will march in the Veishea parade. The band plays original music arranged by James (Red) McCloud.

A select group of 55 band men is chosen from the marching group to play in the basketball band. Performing at all home basketball games as well as a few wrestling meets, the members must compete for a position.

Symphonic band is composed of seventy-five members. They toured South Dakota, Nebraska, and Iowa in five days, presenting over nine concerts. The stage band, commonly known as "lab band" is working in the field of experimental music. The fifteen members create and play variation of modern jazz. Providing "listening" music for its audiences is the varsity or concert band. Annually the groups give a spring concert. All of the bands working together make ISU a more cultural and enjoyable place.



After a successful tour through the Mid-West, the band climaxed its performances by a concert with The New York Brass Quintet in the Armary.

#### 'The Servant of Two Masters' Features the Unconventional


#### 'Tartuffe' Is Commentary on Religious Hypocrisy

### Governor Hughes Now Completing Third Term

Harold E. Hughes, Governor of Iowa, is now completing his third term. Hughes rose to executive capacity in the Iowa trucking industry, was elected to the Iowa State Commerce Commission in 1958, and then was elected Governor in 1963.

Members of the State Board of Regents are appointed by Governor Hughes to six-year terms. The board administers the three state institutions of higher learning; Iowa State University, University of Iowa, and University of Northern Iowa. It also has charge of the Iowa Braille and Sight-Saving School and the Iowa School for the Deaf.

# President Robert Parks Continues Reorganization

President Robert Parks became president of Iowa State University on July 1, 1965. Previously he had been professor of government, dean of instruction, and vice-president of academic affairs. He received his B.A. degree from Berea College in 1937, the M.A. from the University of Kentucky in 1938, and the PhD. from the University of Wisconsin in 1948. Pres. Parks also has an honorary doctor of laws degree from Berea.

During the third year of his administration, President Parks continued his reorganization of various aspects of University operations. A major undertaking was the establishment of the office of Vice President for Student Affairs and the appointment of a University Council on Student Affairs. The council, composed of faculty members and students, advises and aids the vice president.



At one point, GSB censored President Robert Parks for alleged editorialship of the "Sex and Selfhood" lectures, and at another time GSB issued a resolution demanding immediate return of the U.S.S. Pueblo which was captured by North Korea.

With Spring '68 came a less controversial administration under Denny Forsyth and Bill Gilbert. Action has been swift with several major bills including one to set up a GSB draft council being passed within the first few weeks of business.



The department can presently accommodate 7,000 single students in Residence Halls and 1,164 families in married student apartments.

Additional facilities are under construction for 1,126 single students and 200 families.

So ended a desperate season with memories of sweat, muscle, and determination embedded in the minds of many.










### Cross Country-Best In Six Years




### Gable, Bahr, and Wicks Take Honors in Nationals




With Gerlach and sixteen other sophomores returning for next springs squad, the outlook for a title contender looks optimistic.








## Five New Sports Added to Intramural Competition

Men's intramurals is growing fast on the Iowa State campus. This year five new sports were added to the already long roster of sports. These were such things as water polo and trap shooting.







# The House System Brings Administrative Pains to WRA






# WARD SYSTEM





In spite of the many complications, we did manage to produce a book using as our motto, "Better late than never," and to incorporate a few










She doesn't laok mean and cruel, does she? Managing Editor Margie Pfister was better known as the Ogre to the 222'ers.


The Daily got rid of its circa 1926 flatbed, web perfecting, Duplex press—it got a bit part in Gut-



### Phi Eta Sigma


Phi Eta Sigma is a freshmen men's honorary which is open to any student who has a 3.5 cummulative grade point average at some time during his freshman year.



They have a fine drill team, which acted as honor guard for such events as Homecoming, a Drum and Bugle Corps, and a Rifle team.







Festivities included an all-University Bar-B-Q which was attended by 1200 people and an all-University convocation with congressman William Scherle as speaker. The college also began an Iowa Agriculture Hall of Fame. The publicity figure for the event was Alf Alfie, the stereotyped farmer image.









The Block and Bridle Horse Show celebrated its twenty-fifth anniversary this year. It has grown into the largest student sponsored horse show in the nation.


Complete management and sponsorship was turned over to Block and Bridle Club in 1960. Outstanding exhibitors and horses from the whole Midwest compete in the annual event.



Each year this club awards an Agriculture Business Manager of the year award.


This year it was to the outstanding farmer and businessman in the ag business field.



The College of Home Economics as of Winter '68 had an enrollment of 2680, up by 66 per cent since 1962. Although the rest of the university has faced the increased enrollment problem by providing more facilities for the students, the Home Ec College facilities have not increased since 1962.

The college has instituted a new Peace Corps program this year. This is the first internship program of its kind. In the project volunteers spend three months of training in a country and then return to ISU to finish their degree work. Upon graduation, the students return to the country in which they have trained and work in their specialized fields.

The Home Economics College has also formed a new department, family environment, by merging the departments of home management and household equipment. Experimental courses were presented throughout the year to add to the present program.

# Enrollment Climbs in College of Sciences and Humanities



Dean Chalmer Roy of the College of Sciences and Humanities is working on the extensive credit and course changes in the college.

Enrollment in the College of Sciences and Humanities continued to climb steadily with fall quarter's enrollment up by more than 500 over that of Fall '66. Sciences and Humanities received three new majors also. They were computer science, music, and philosophy. As of winter quarter, music and philosophy had 23 majors a piece. To ease the crowded class situation, Sciences and Humanities received many capital improvements including a new physics addition and Botany's Bessey Hall.

The faculty has also approved a proposal to reduce the total number of credits required for graduation in Sciences and Humanities from 205 to 192. At present a student must average over 17 credits per quarter, and thus 74 per cent of the students take over 12 quarters to graduate. The faculty also recommended reducing the minimum credit requirements in several groups such as math and English.



### Statistics Club





A new curriculum has been initiated for the first year students which they will follow throughout their four years of study. It attempts to more closely coordinate the presentation of material in related courses.



Vet Med students study intricate details of embryo zoology.








# Graduate College Strong in Spite of Draft Policy Change









## Eight Patents Received as Result of Research

How does a rat react to a hypo? Researchers find out.



Most of the faculty members and graduate students at Iowa State are actively engaged in research. Their research ranges from the field of food processing to electronic equipment. After many years of work the researchers had 37 disclosures this year. Disclosures are the first step to a patent. Within the next 3 years the department hopes to have 30 patents from these disclosures. This year twenty-three applications for patents were made. Of these eight were received. The most outstanding ones are a respritory augmentor and a new process for the production of sulphur from calcium sulphate. The latter is extremely important because of the scarcity of sulphur on the world market in the past year. The main portion of the approximately 27 million dollars allotted for research this year was granted to the University by the federal government. The rest is acquired from patent royalties.

## University Extension Establishes Four New Area Offices

In its second year since reorganization, University Extension is progressing well in its installation of new area offices. In addition to the three offices established last year, four more have been added toward the final goal of twelve. This year area offices have been set up in Mason City, Fort Dodge, Creston, and Council Bluffs.

Under director Dean Marvin Anderson, University Extension extends its resources to the people of Iowa. The divisions of the program include the Cooperative Extension, working in agriculture and home economics, the Engineering Extension, the Center for Industrial Research and Service, and the short course program.


## Technical Institute Trains Specialists in Practical Application
