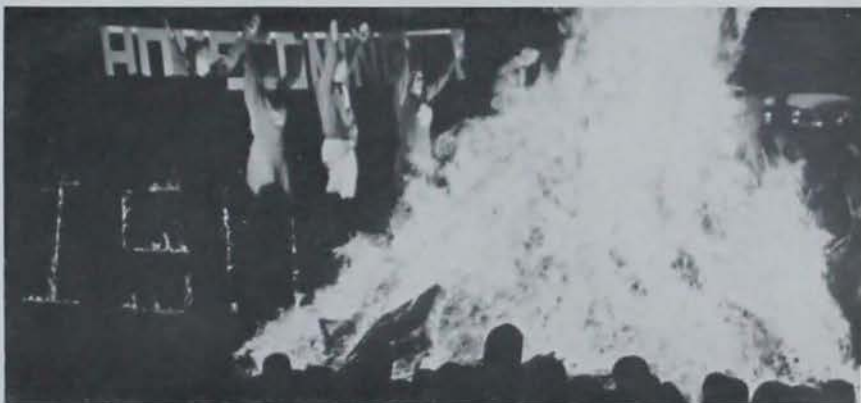

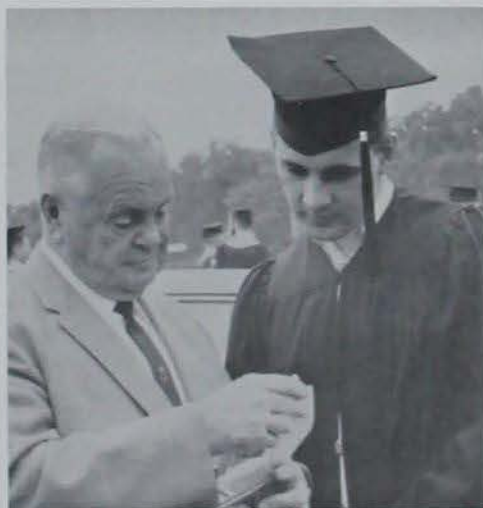

The physical plant, additional curricula, and improved courses, along with the teaching staff, have contributed to Iowa State's worldwide reputation. Administration of the University is not only in the offices on campus. Someone must inform the legislature and watch Iowa State's policies—the Governor. And some must supervise the allocations to the school—the Board of Regents. The drive of Iowa State comes from many sources.

## President James H. Hilton

With a decade of experience, President James H. Hilton continually thrusts himself into the expanding scope of University activities. When he isn't promoting the Iowa State Center or a research project on campus, President Hilton oversees the administration of Iowa State. The staff, the Board of Regents, the Governor, the legislature, the alumni, the students—we underestimate him. Yet he is there, helping each student. And his satisfaction comes from watching that student progress from a bewildered freshman to a disciplined senior.

Fiscal operations of Iowa State are under the supervision of Boyne H. Platt, Vice President of Business and Finance. He manages all monetary aid and grants to the school, advises in the budgeting approved by the state legislature, and coordinates University expansion.

As Vice President of Academic Affairs, W. Robert Parks, with the aid of the deans and directors, coordinates and administers Iowa State's academic program. He also serves as personnel officer directly responsible to President Hilton and the Board of Regents.



As Vice President for Research, J. Boyd Page is responsible for maintaining contact with the federal granting agencies and foundations. All research proposals cross his desk, where their scientific content is reviewed. He also assists in budgeting for research.

The Office of the Dean of Students, a newly created title, is held by Millard Kratochvil. This office is primarily concerned with the individual welfare of each student on campus and serves in counseling individuals and advising and supervising student activities and organizations.



## Administration

Arthur M. Gowan serves as Director of Admissions and Records. His office maintains the scholastic records of every student who has ever attended Iowa State as well as being responsible for enrolling students, issuing grades, and organizing graduation exercises.



Three main areas of training including business and industry, research, and management prepare graduates of the College of Agriculture for their future. Students from all the nation and many foreign countries come to study in either the graduate or the undergraduate schools. Presently about eighty per cent come from Iowa. The majority of foreign students return home upon graduation to bring new methods and techniques to the agriculture of their homelands. The Agriculture College is planning an expansion project which involves construction of three new buildings and moving all animals off campus to nearby farms.

## Engineering

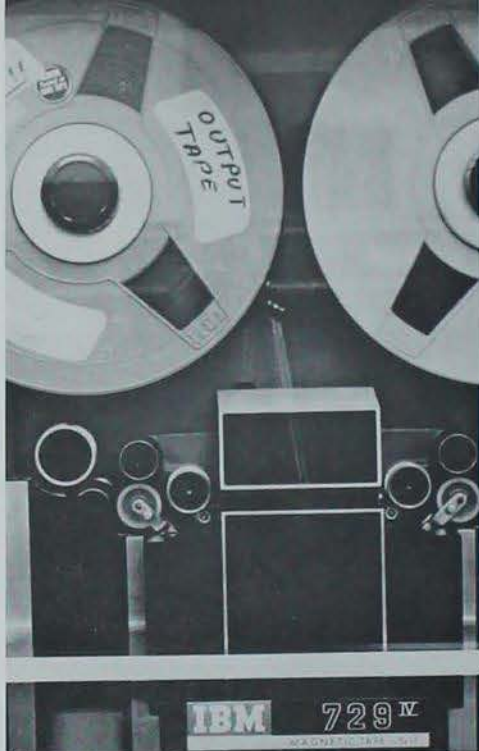
Begun in 1896, the College of Engineering has increased its departments from four to fourteen. Presently eleven major areas of study lead to a Bachelor of Science degree. Five year programs are Architecture and Architectural Engineering, Construction, Chemical Industries, Electronics, and Mechanical Technology, are administered by the Technical Institute and lead to an Associate in Applied Science certificate. All curricula in engineering are divided into two phases, a basic program and a professional program. The basic program consists of such essentials as chemistry, physics, engineering graphics, mathematics, and English. The professional phase of the curriculum contains intensive study in the particular branch of engineering a student chooses as his major, as well as a continuation of supporting work in mathematics, basic sciences, and humanities. The Engineering College offers cooperative programs to aid the student in gaining practical experience. It is also active in research and extension work through the Engineering Experiment Station and the Engineering Extension Service.

For many years several departments in the College of Engineering have cooperated with industry throughout the state to provide students for on-the-job training. In most of the departments, especially the ones just initiating the co-op program, interested students work with industry on an informal basis. That is, the student and a company representative meet in an interview. The company usually restricts the number and minimizes the requirements of the students participating. This year over 50 students in aerospace, agricultural, electrical, chemical, civil, industrial, and mechanical engineering are enrolled in the co-op program. The major change in the Home Economics College this past year has been revision of the core curriculum. The core is presently designed to emphasize the elements of home economics which every student essentially needs for use as a person and as a family member. It gives the student a better opportunity to select those courses which she is most interested in and which she feels will best meet her needs. Presently only six courses are required of every Home Economics student. The rest of the core consists of the student selection of a required number of hours in the areas of humanities, social sciences, physical sciences, biological sciences, and home economics. Many courses in the core curriculum must, however, still be taken in order that the student fulfill the prerequisites for future courses in her major area.

## College of Sciences and Humanities

Students in every program at Iowa State explore some part of the College of Sciences and Humanities, since all academic programs depend on the college for foundations in English, mathematics, history, and science. In the college are five general areas: mathematical sciences, physical sciences, life sciences, social sciences, and humanities. Special study programs are available to exceptional students. These special sections place emphasis upon the individual by creating a more flexible academic program. It is the primary purpose of the college to develop in the student the ability and desire to learn, so that learning will not stop with commencement; and the student may become educated in the highest respect.

The college has an enrollment of about 260 professional students and 70 graduate students, with 70 new students beginning each year. 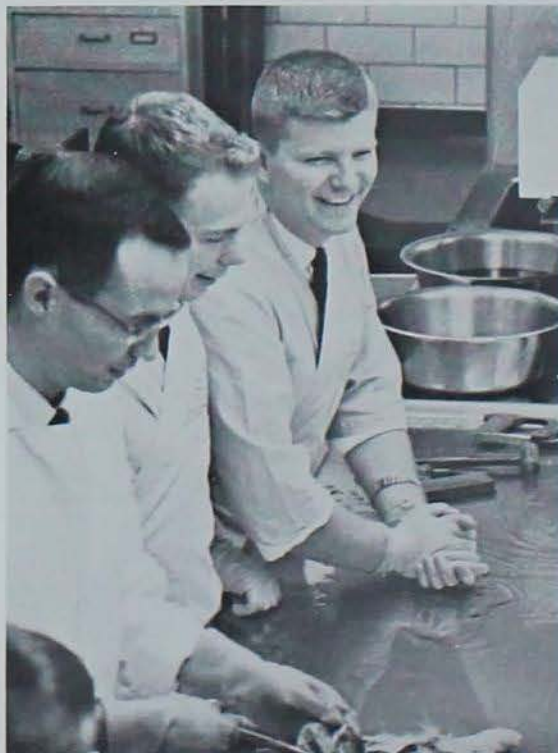

As the veterinary student enters the junior and senior years of the professional curriculum, he begins the second of two studies in the college—the Clinical Sciences. Until the junior year the student has been moved through a detailed study of the basic science—*anatomy, histology, physiology, pharmacology, pathology*. Now, while assisting the seniors and performing as seniors, he is ready to bring all of his basic studies into focus so that the diseases of animals written in books and experimented under special conditions can be diagnosed with real cases under actual clinical situations. Comparable to the internship of the medical doctor, the clinic work of the Veterinary student offers the solidification of his learning in the College. Animals are purchased by the College but can be actual patients. The student is taught to be a keen observer, to recognize abnormal symptoms of the animals. Through an objective exam of the patient, the student relates

the observations of cells, tissues, and organs to the conclusions reached in conversation with the owner of the animal. Treatment, if the owner accepts, is done as economically and as safely as possible, with the necessity of returning the patient to a completely recovered life. The students will conduct investigations, reach conclusions, and perform needed operations.

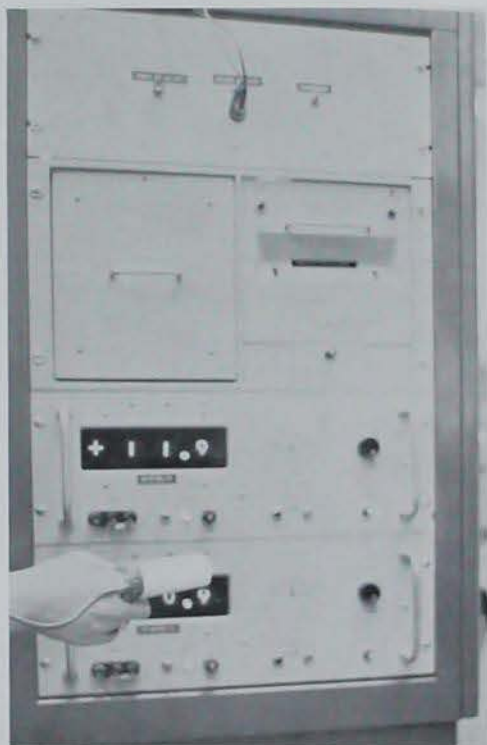

As has been true in previous years, the growth of the Graduate College has maintained a yearly increase of 14 per cent in enrollment. Figures alone cannot explain the total effect of a graduate program. Although every college maintains a program, there is no set curriculum as is true in the undergraduate levels of the University. Each year sees the addition of better facilities, the growth of the graduate faculty, and an increase in assistance aid. Graduates from throughout the United States and particularly from foreign countries converge upon Iowa State to receive a benefit they know is possible. Most of the graduate programs lead to Master of Science and Doctor of Philosophy degrees, plus advanced research study in particular fields of interest.

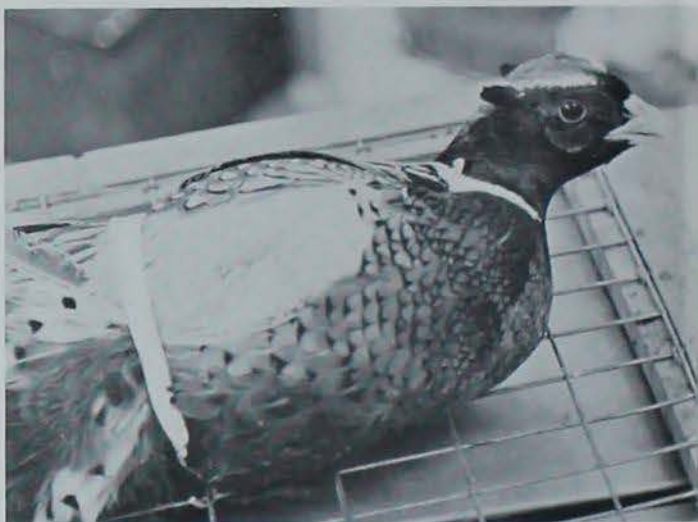

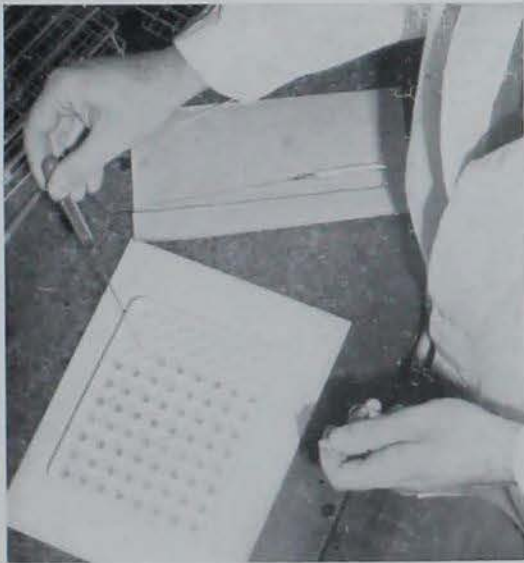

## Research

The Ames Laboratory Research Reactor, operated under the direction of the Institute of Atomic Research and Iowa State will serve as a neutron source to further extend the scope of research in the metallurgy fields. Construction begun in May 1961 on the \$4.6 million reactor will be completed in June 1964. Much of the facilities of the heterogeneous, thermal, and steady-state reactor are safety features that will protect the personnel and equipment of the lab and the people of the Ames community. The laboratory serves two major purposes: to obtain information regarding exotic metals and to train people for research and industry. The reactor itself will analyze materials in a radiation environment and aid in solution of problems in chemistry, engineering, and physics.

The Tech Institute began in the Fall of 1960 to solve two problems in Engineering: industry in Iowa was in need of technicians, and young men were becoming more interested in a curriculum similar to the present Institute. Its fall class enrolled 64 men, under the acting directorship of John Lagerstrom, the assistant dean of Engineering. Three programs were initiated—Construction Tech, Electronics Tech, and Mechanical Tech. The fall of 1963 saw an enrollment of about 225 men. The Institute found an able leader in Harold B. Ellis and has become a moving force on campus. This fall Chemical Industries Technology became the fourth two-year program, any of which leads to an Associate in Applied Science certificate.

The Agricultural and Home Economics extension services focus around the community, farm, and family through mutual assistance from county extension offices. 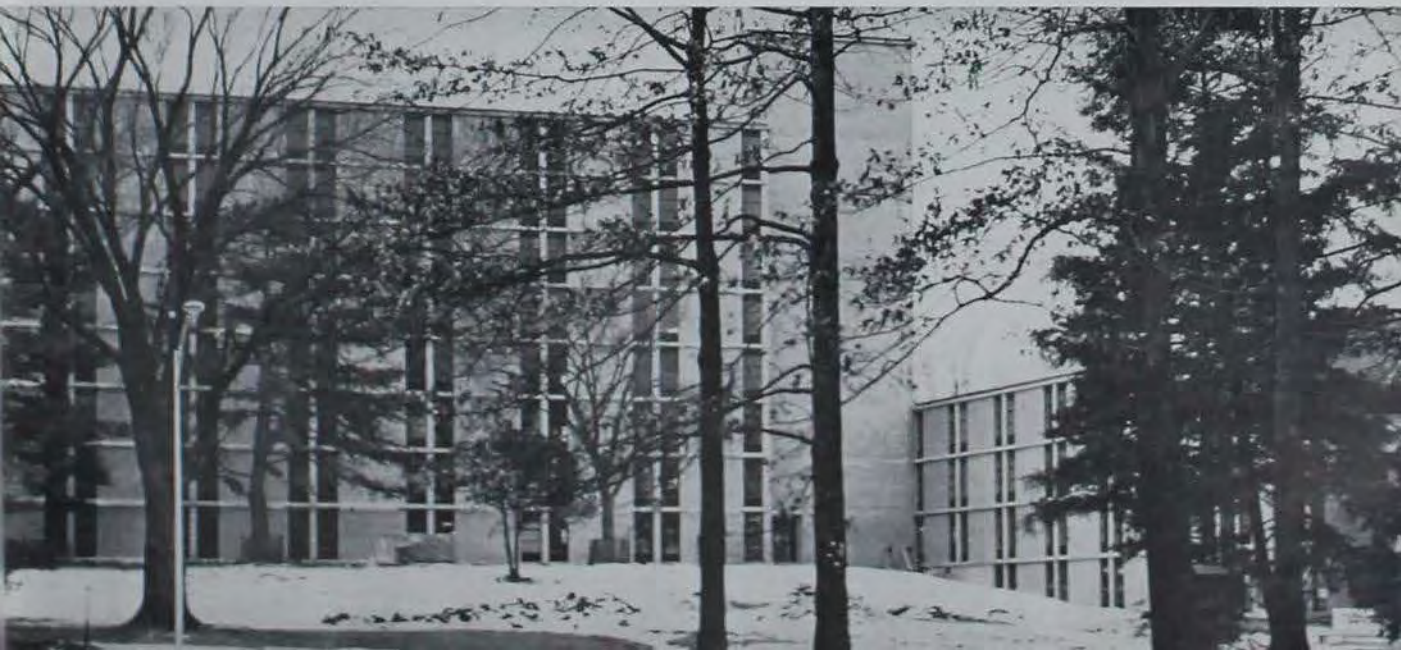

Iowa State football, 1963, opened the season with its new slot-T offense, completing a two-year transition from the old single wing and last year's single-wing T. With this season's four and five record, Coach Clay Stapleton's record at Iowa State stands at 32 wins and 27 losses. On opening day the Cyclone line averaged 206 pounds and the backs 190 for a team average of 200 pounds, one of the heaviest in Iowa State history. 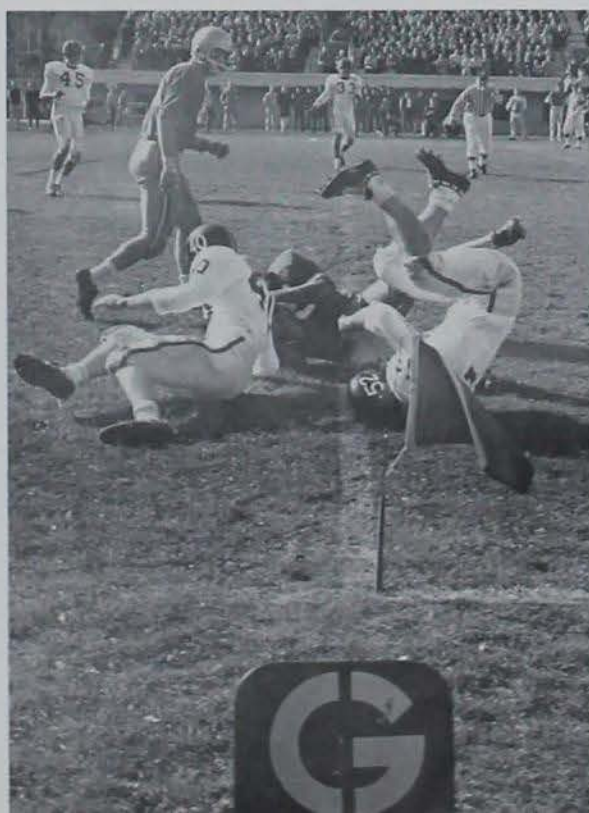

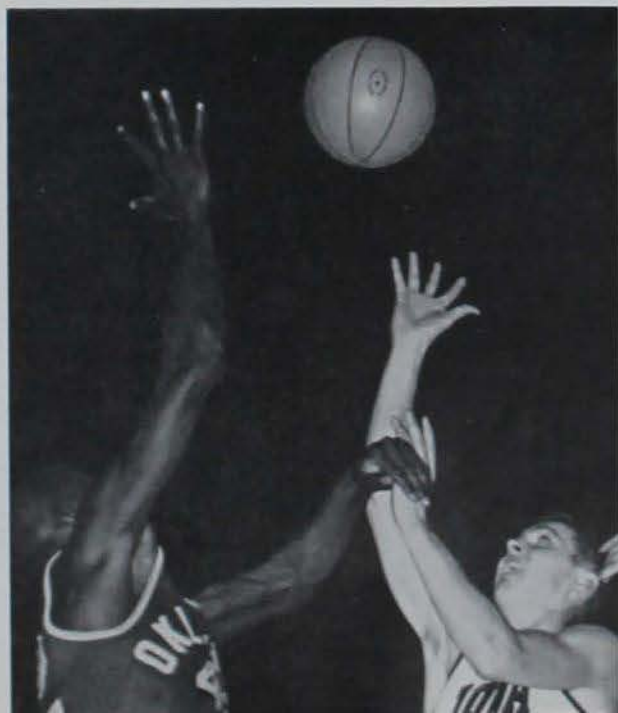

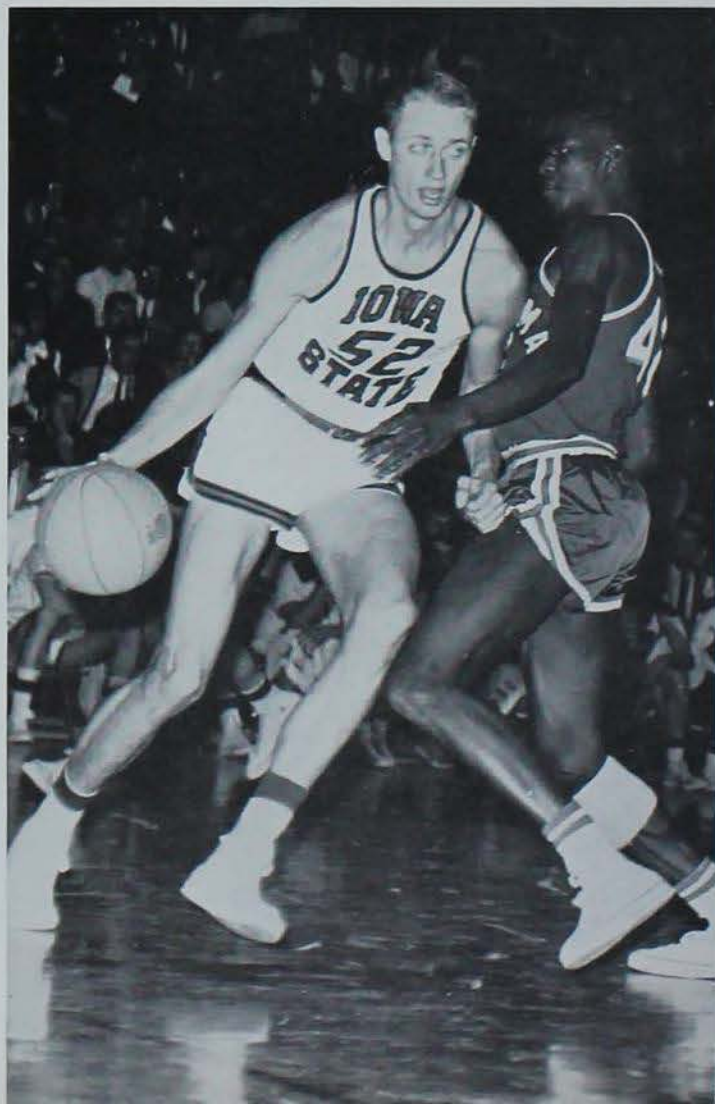

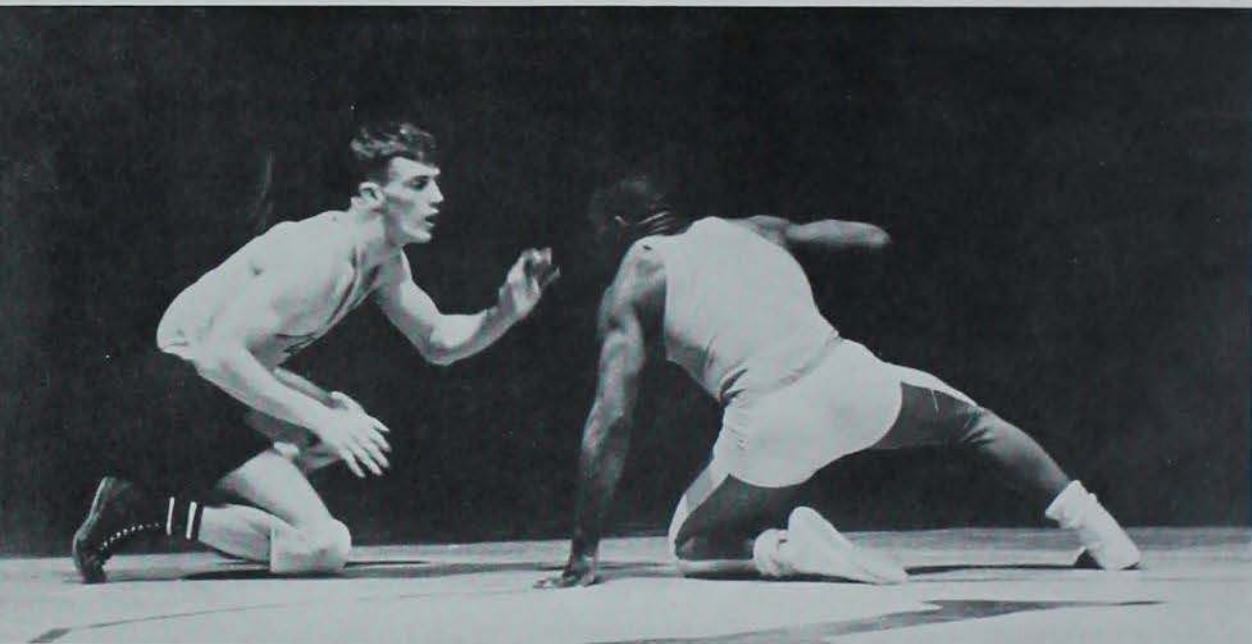

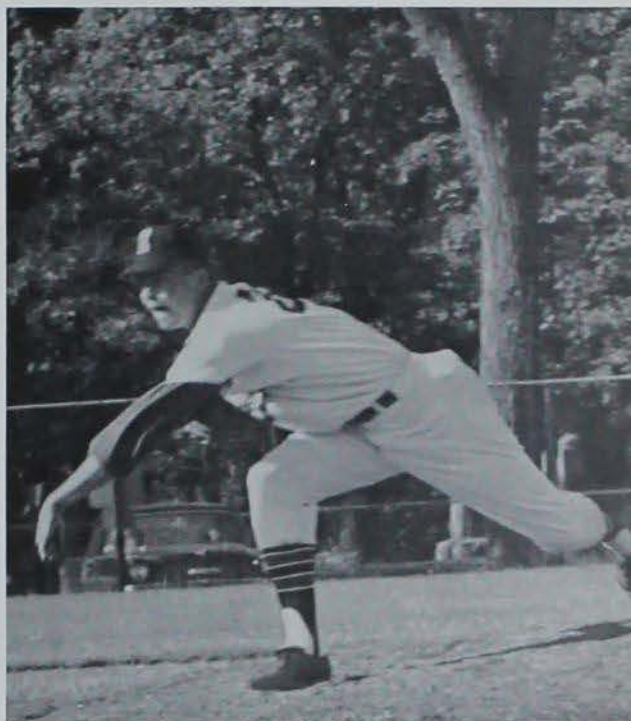
A pair of home runs, a two-run blast by Marv Straw and a grand slam by Dave Hoyt, helped Iowa State sweep its first two game series with the Air Force Academy. Two days later, however, Straw was playing in an all-star basketball game and Hoyt was sidelined with a broken jaw after being hit by a line drive during batting practice. The Cyclones lost all three games in the series with Colorado. Then Missouri, a team ranked high nationally all season, extended the Cyclones' losing streak to six games. Against Drake the Cyclones erupted for 19 runs, and continued to win three of their next five games. Then after being shut out by Nebraska, they lost five more in a row. In the last two games the baseball squad, playing the type of baseball they were capable of, escaped the cellar by beating second-place Oklahoma twice.

Iowa State's track team managed only a tie with State College of Iowa in its four dual or triangular meets. In the first meet with Wisconsin and Drake, Captain Carl Vanderwilt, Cal Parrott, and Larry Taylor were injured. This dropped the team out of contention in that meet and handicapped the Cyclone thinclads for the remainder of the season. Against Minnesota the team managed only five of fifteen first places. Two of these were by Steve Jacobson in the 100-yard dash and triple jump. Iowa State won ten of sixteen first place events against State College of Iowa, but managed only a third place in the javelin throw in the field events to account for the tie score. In this meet Jacobson won three events and Morgan Langston and Norm Johnson, two each. High jumper Larry Eilert, one of the brightest spots in the Iowa State track picture was a consistent winner in the dual meets. He cleared 6 feet 10 inches indoors in practice and set the Iowa State record of 6 feet 8 $\frac{1}{4}$  inches during the outdoor season. High point men for the Cyclones were Jacobson with 91 and Johnston with 88 $\frac{1}{2}$ .

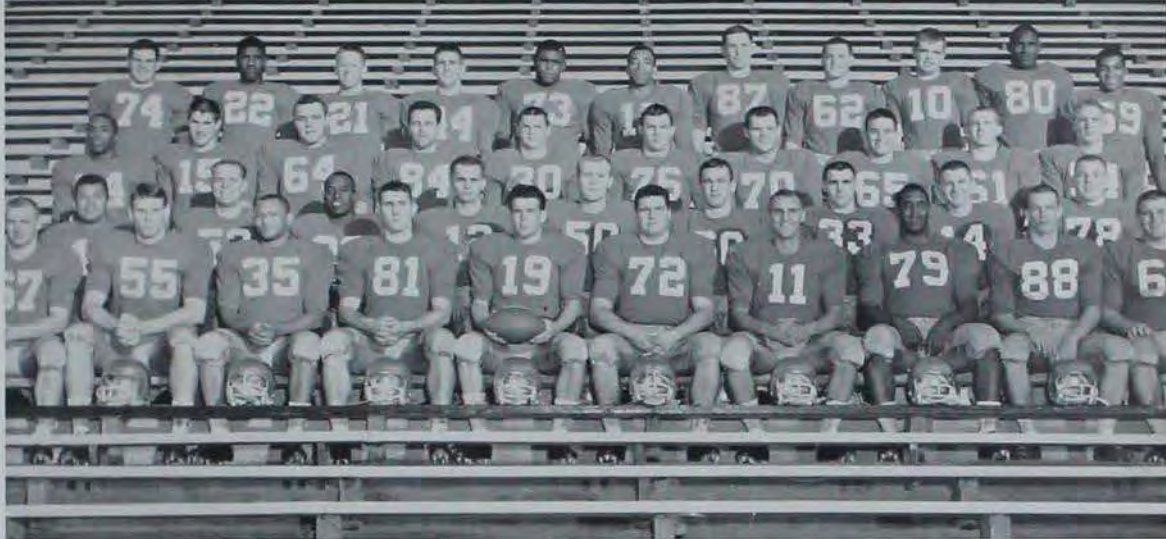

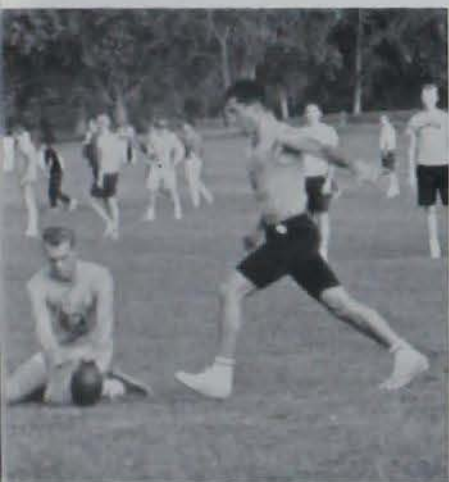

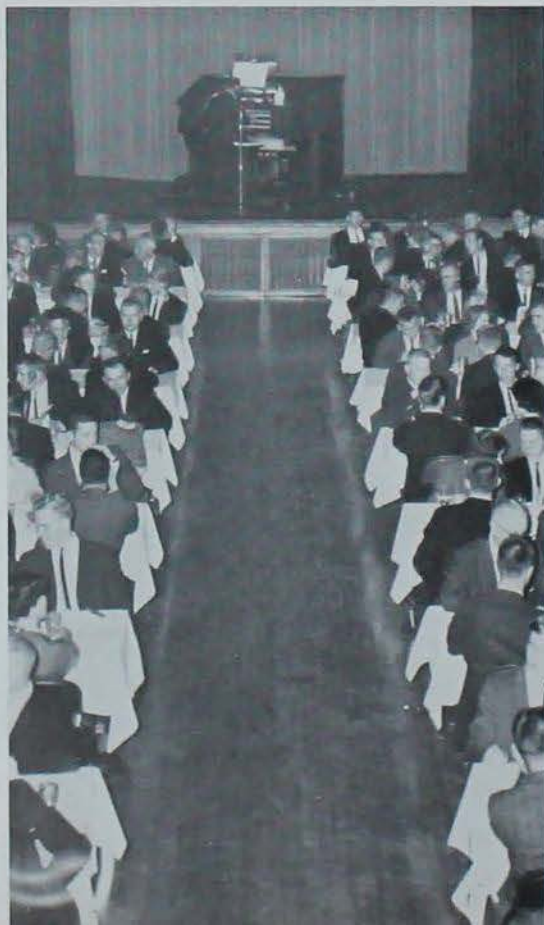

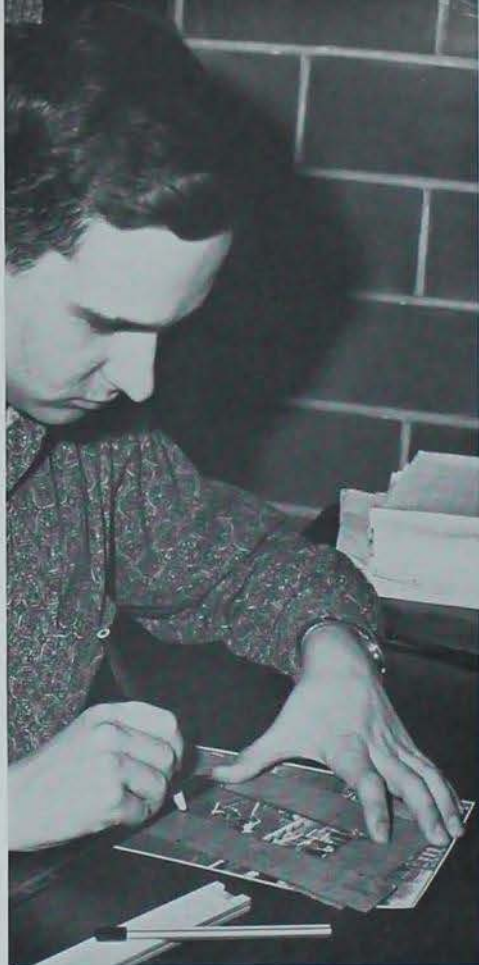

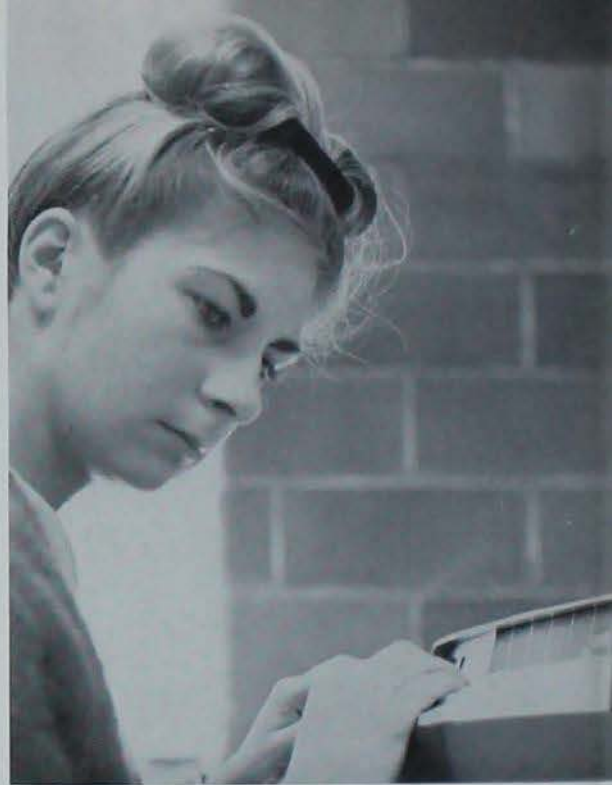

Five mornings a week—Tuesday through Saturday—the Iowa State Daily is distributed to the campus' 11,000 students. Starting with the managing editor's morning beat sheet and ending with the last turn of the press early the next morning, the Daily is an almost 24-hour operation. The editor oversees the entire news and comment operation, and he and his two associate editors are in charge of the editorial page. News is gathered by a reporting staff made up of students taking the second quarter reporting course or from other news tips.

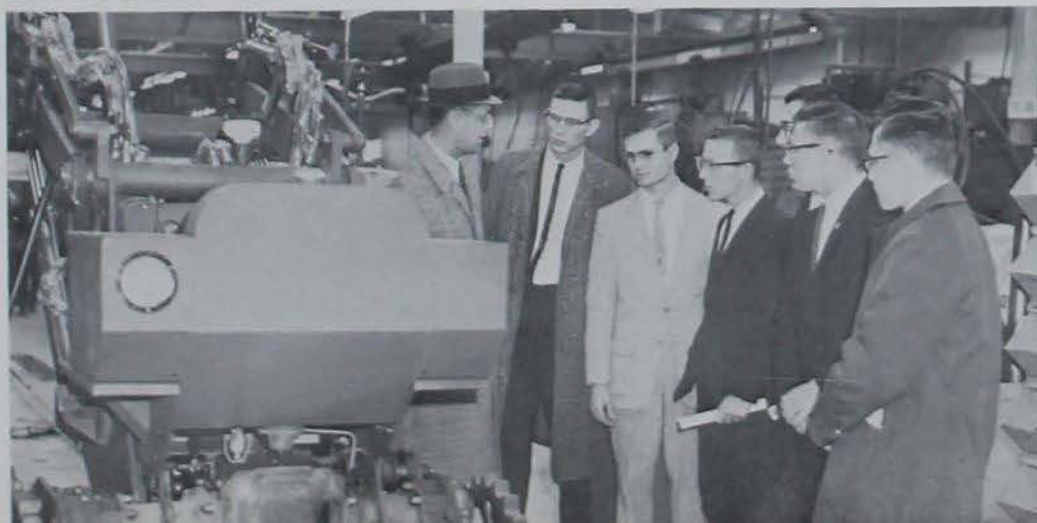

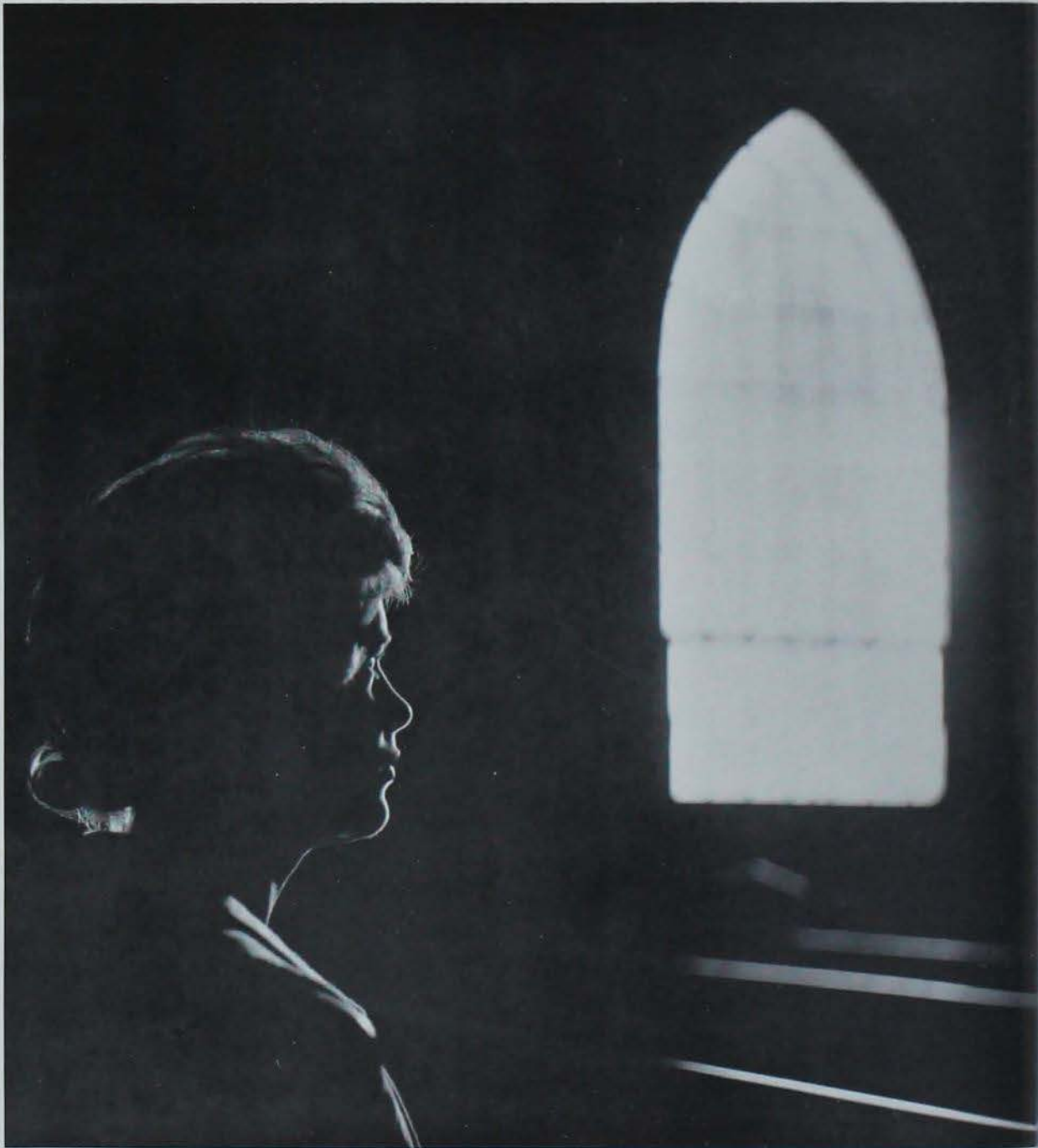

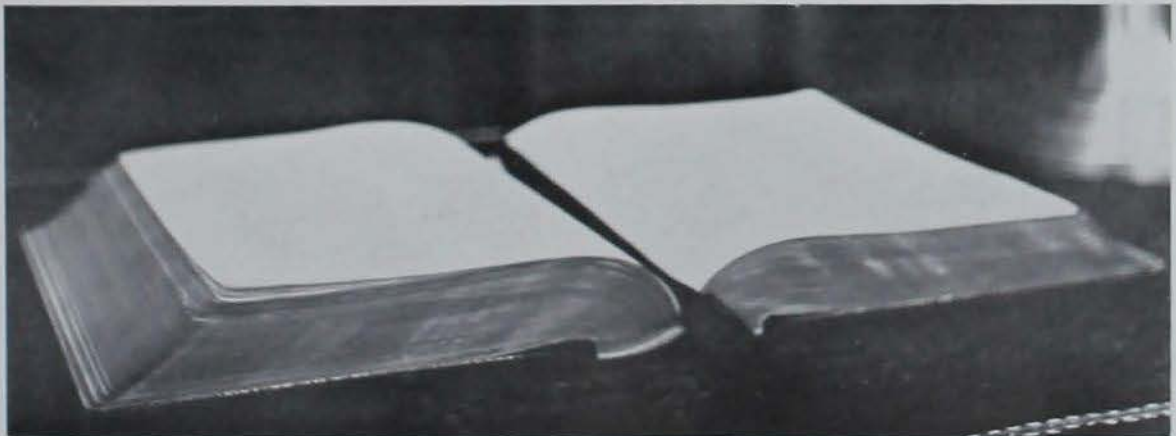
## Christian Science

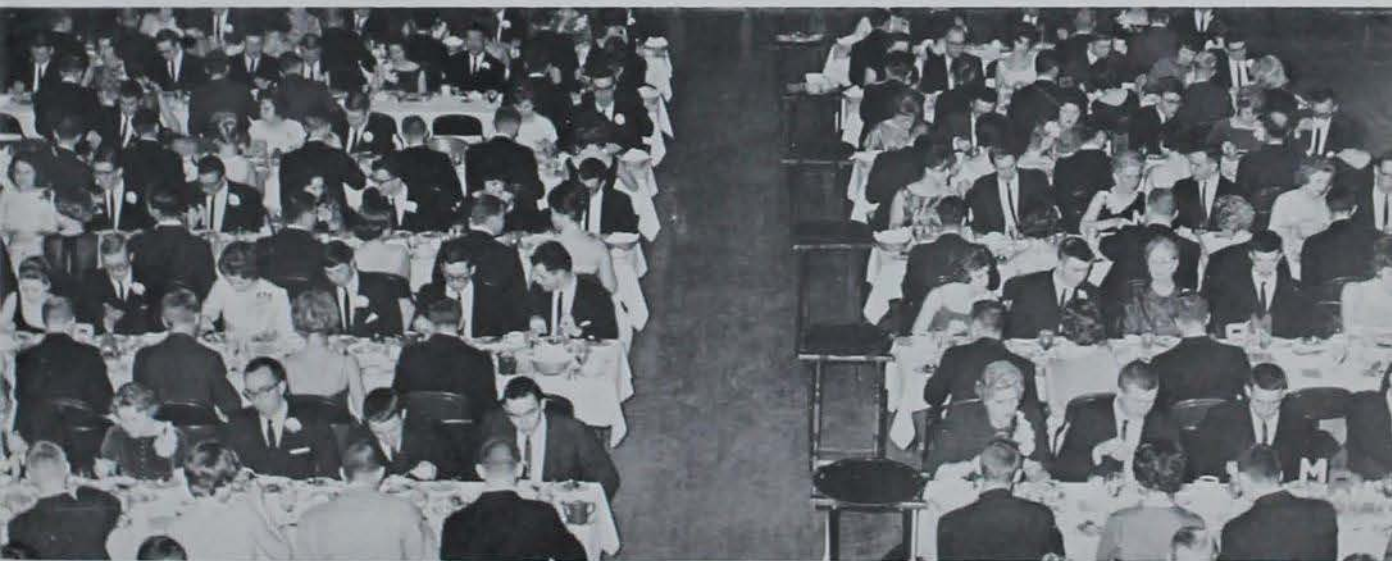

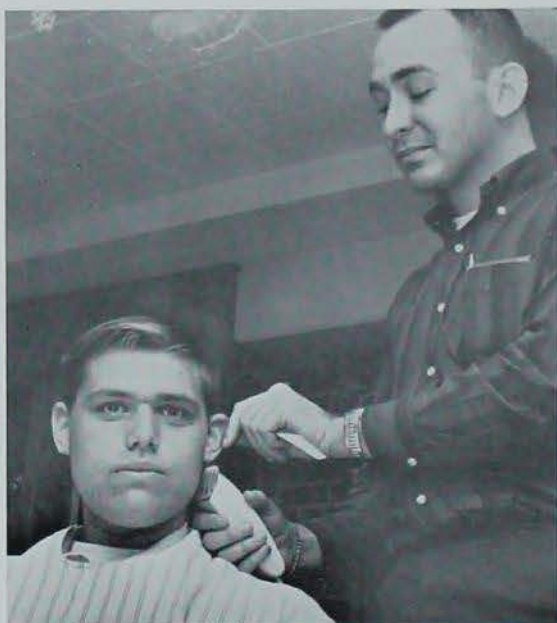
## Firkins House

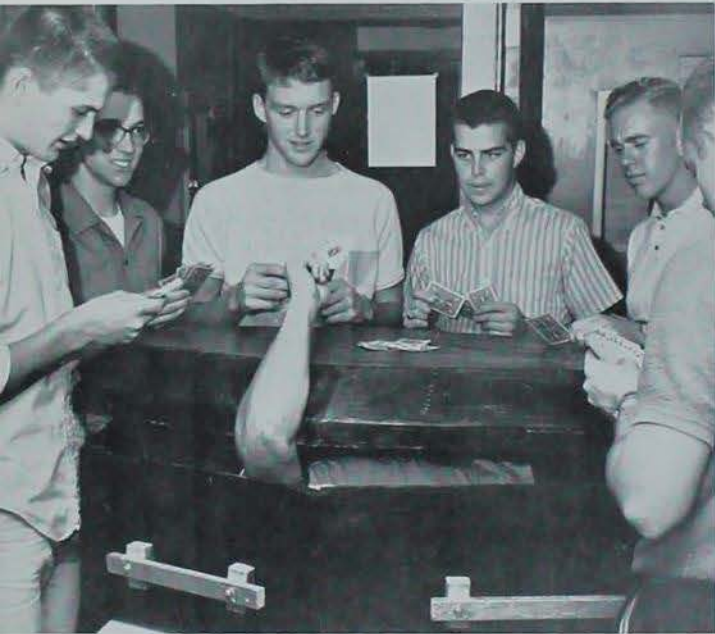

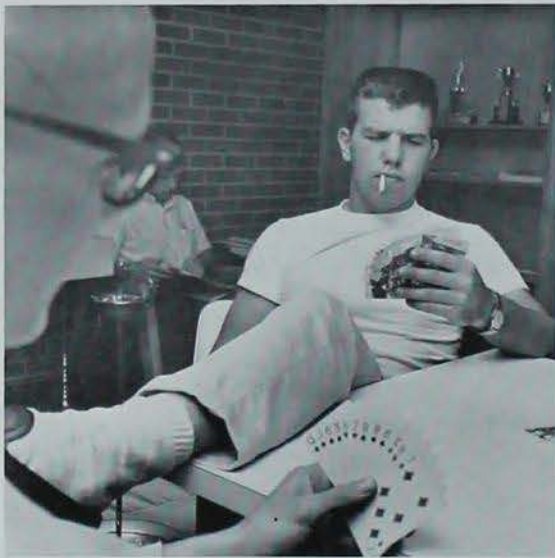

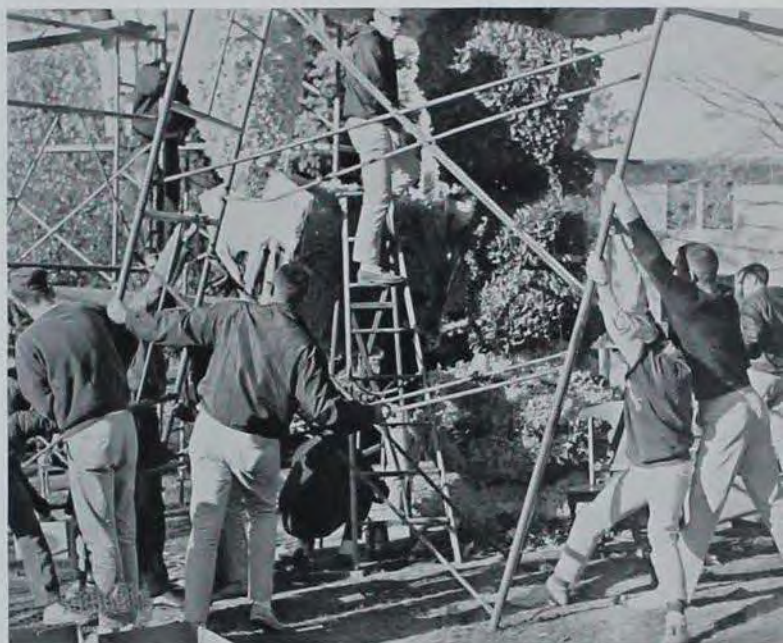

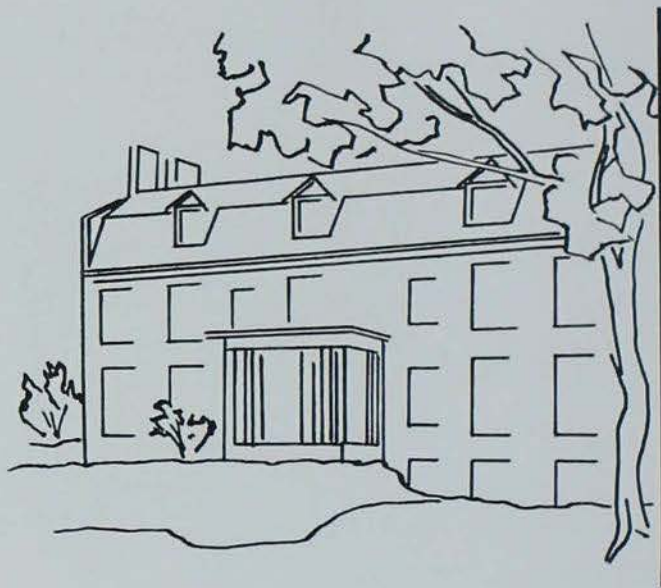
