Almost a community in itself, the huge dormitory is even equipped with its own newspaper and radio station. The "Reflector" contains exclusively Friley-Hughes news and is published weekly by MRA men. KMRI, the radio station is heard both in Friley-Hughes and Westgate Halls and may be expanded to the women's dormitories in fall of 1957.

Governing the MRA system is the Main Cabinet, composed of representatives from each of the 24 houses in Friley-Hughes plus members of the Executive Council.

Each January an impressive election campaign is conducted for election of new officers.

Executive Council

Initiating new ideas and policies for the men of MRA is the function of the MRA Executive Council.

The group, headed by President Charles Schwab carries out day to day administration for the men of MRA, and acts as a supervisory group. Executive Council paves the way for smooth functioning of MRA members, faculty and administration.

The ten councilmen are elected by MRA members.

This year marks the seventh year of operation for radio station KMRI, located in Friley-Hughes Hall. The station was set up in 1949 with equipment donated by station WOI. It began operation on a frequency of 640 kilocycles, but now broadcasts on dual frequencies of 550 and 880 kilocycles. Since 1950, the station has been located on the first floor of Friley-Hughes Hall. A board of control supervises the current staff of forty-five to fifty announcers and disc jockeys — students interested in radio and television broadcasting.

Programming is aimed mainly at the men who live in Friley-Hughes, but the station is also picked up in Westgate Hall and East Stadium. Disk jockey shows are featured from sign-on at four o'clock until six, when the news is re-broadcast from WOI-FM. Public service transcriptions follow the news at 6:15, and the hour from seven to eight is held open for women interested in disc jockey shows. At eight — Music for Easy Listening until eleven.

The station maintains a large record library including popular records, albums and public service transcriptions. About eighty-five per cent of the station's yearly budget from MRA is spent on records and engineering costs.

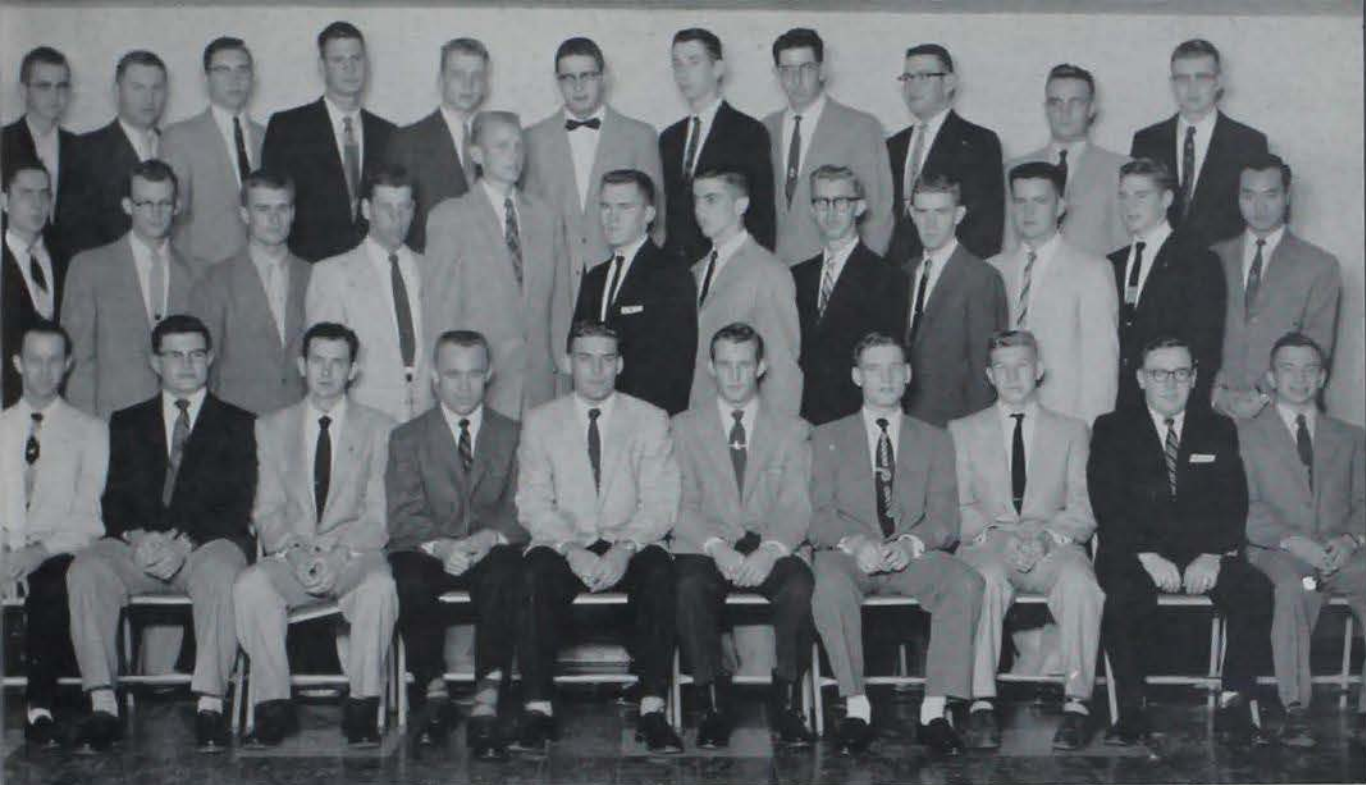

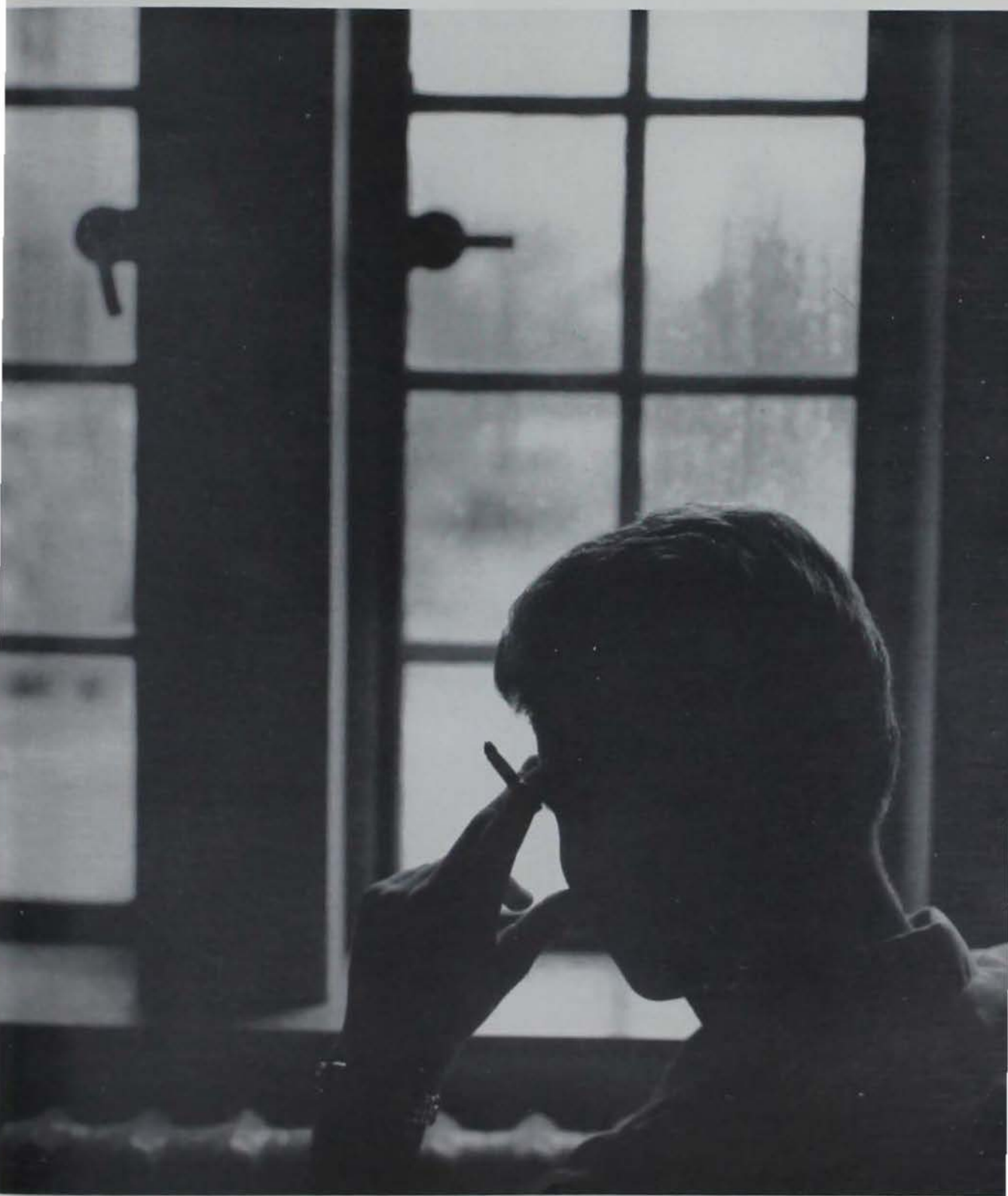

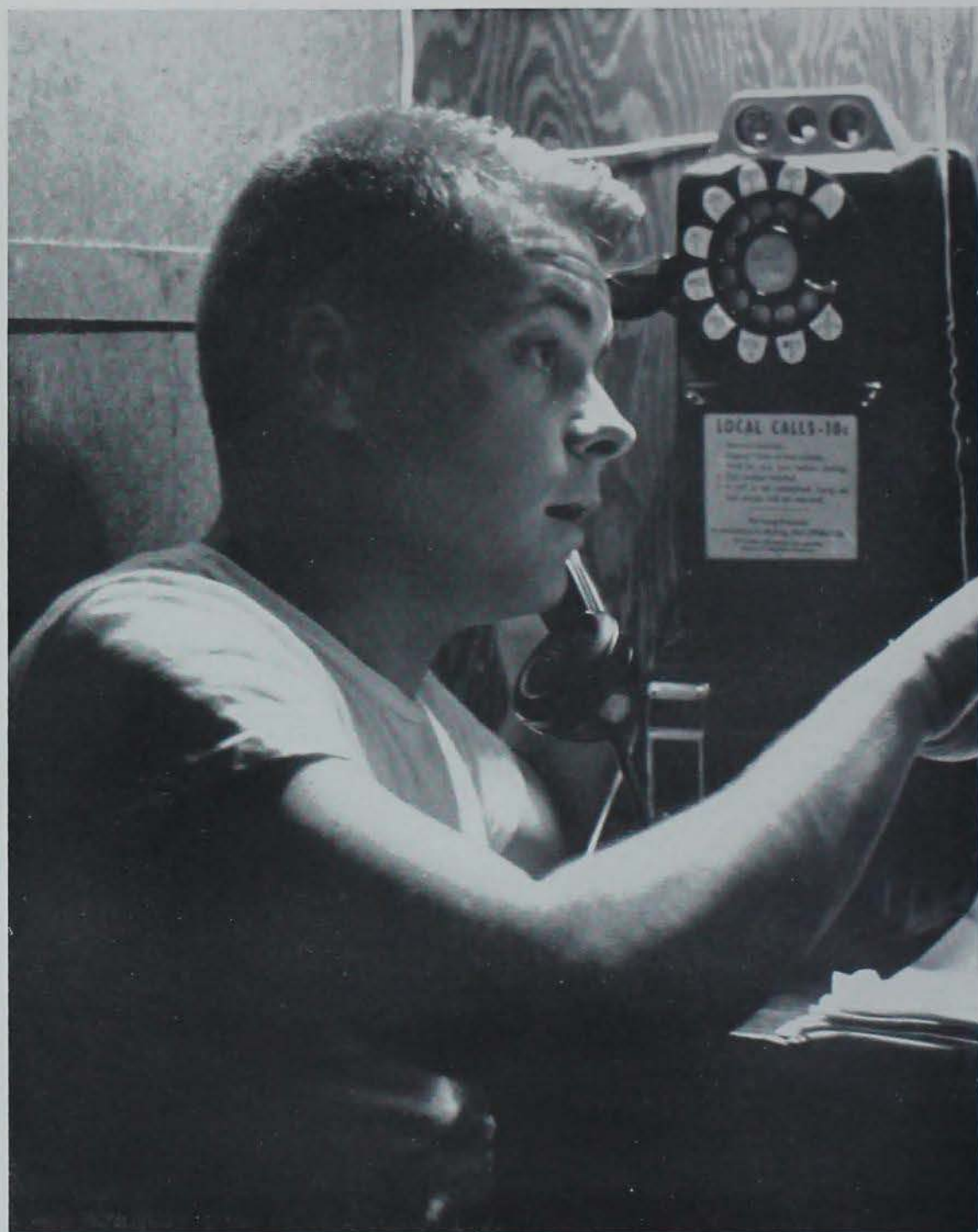

Coed Dining Hall

There are very few places in the world where men and women aren't thrown together — in the fields of education, occupation and living.

But for several years the little world of Iowa State College has gone as far as to keep students from eating together at mealtime. Part of this was due to the separate residence areas on the campus — women's dorms on the east and men's dorms on the west.

However when the time came to expand liv-

ing facilities for women, the college looked around and found that the only possible space would be at Westgate. Plans were made and the present concrete block dormitory, Westgate, was built. But when looking to the future, the college could see the necessity for more married students accommodations and made temporary plans to exclude dining facilities at Westgate.

Arrangements were made for more than 130 women to eat in the Friley-Hughes Hall dining room, the closest eating area. Men and women are finally back together after many years. With the coming of the women to the west side of the



campus the men of Friley-Hughes Hall have found themselves in a unique situation. And they're all for it.

The women eat breakfast, lunch and supper in the dining room—the only organized residence place on campus where men and women meet and eat together three times a day. There are 1,421 men in Friley-Hughes Hall and 131 women in Westgate Hall, resulting in a ratio of better than 10 men to every woman—over three times the all-campus average.

Women act as ticket punchers and “hash slingers” and, of course, add just the right touch

of atmosphere at meal time. There are no objections to the dining arrangement except from the women who say that if you had to trudge two long blocks in the cold winter wind to eat breakfast, you wouldn't. But what's a little cold when you can eat with 1,421 men!

Friley-Hughes Hall has other features that continue to astound many people. In the first place, it is the nation's largest dormitory and is one building housing over 1,400 men. With it comes a complete laundry, post office, snack bar and KMRI, the really student-owned and operated radio station.

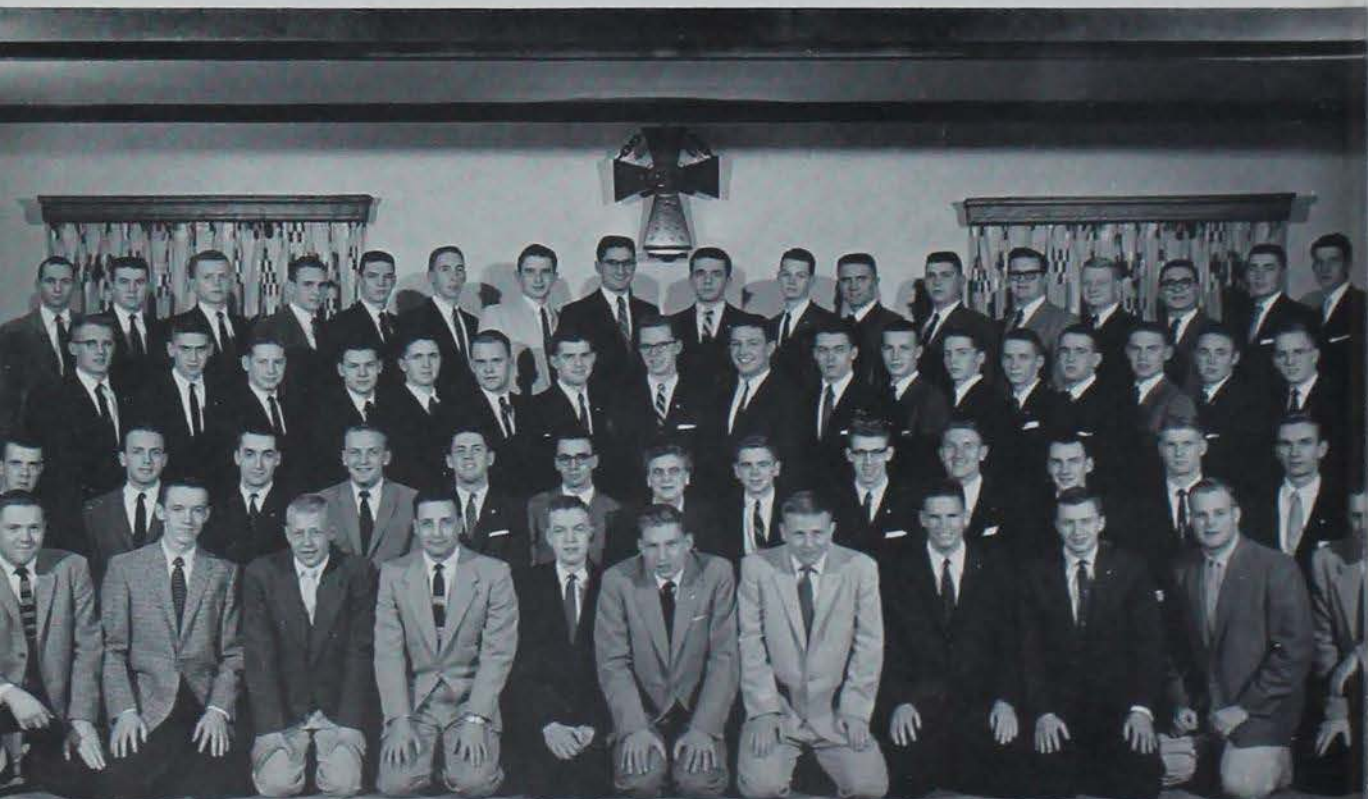

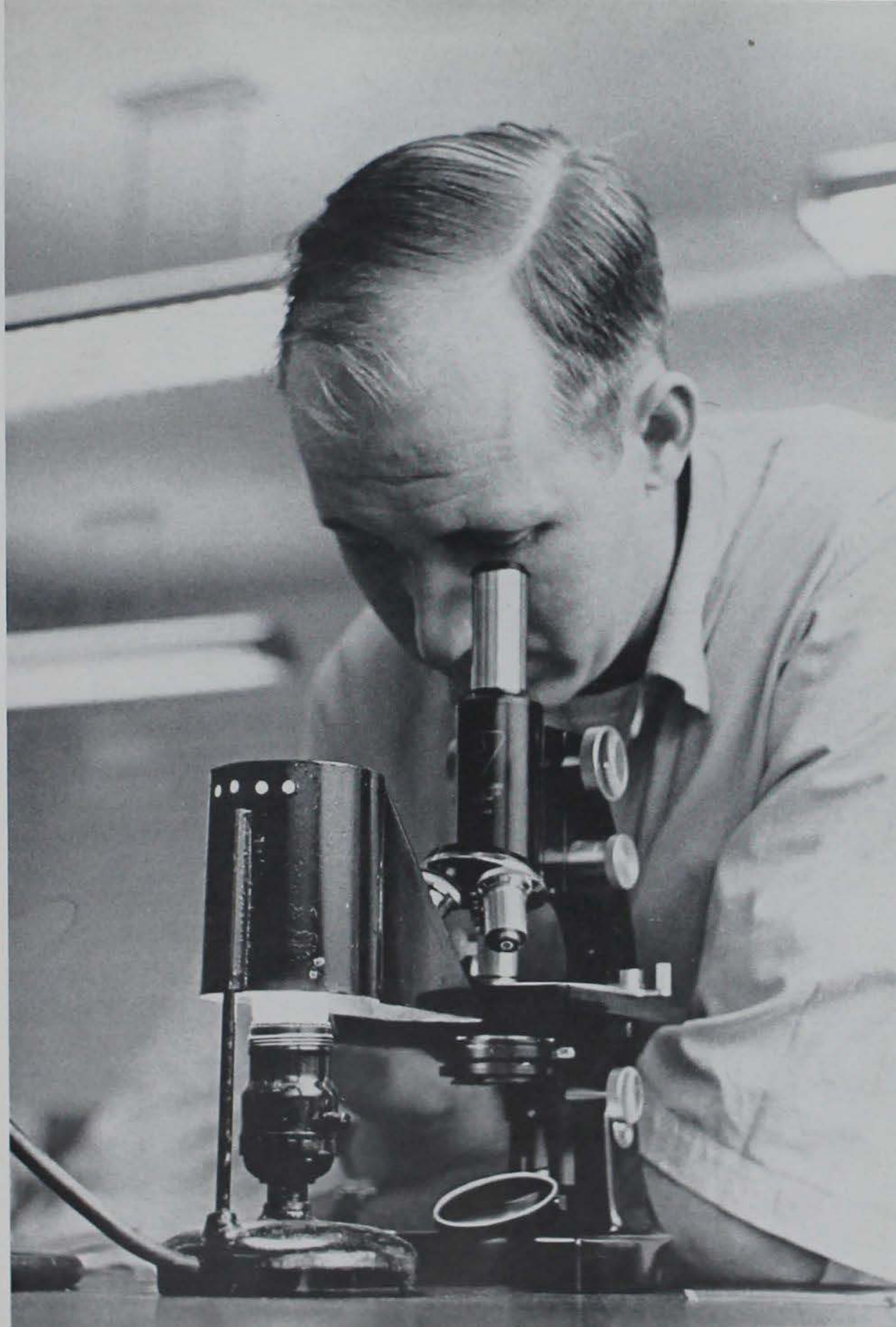

ISC Vet Med Division Oldest in Nation

The National Veterinary Medical Aptitude Test, plus an interview and scholarship consideration, face each pre-vet student at the end of his first two years of training. But once he is accepted, he becomes a member of the Iowa State Division of Veterinary Medicine, the oldest in the United States. Now a vet-med student, he will begin instruction in the six departments of the division. These are the Departments of Anatomy, Hygiene, Medicine and Surgery, Obstetrics and Radiology, Pathology and Physiology and Pharmacy. The students continue their studies, spending most of their time in the stately old Vet Quad or the spacious new clinic, completed only 2 years ago. Besides the instruction provided by undergraduate and graduate work, the division also provides clinical, diagnostic and extension services, all of which the student can observe and occasionally have an opportunity to participate in. The operations in the clinic and diagnostic lab are state maintained.

A large centerpiece of winter candles set in Christmas decorations and poinsettia carried out Alpha Delta Pi's "Centerpiece of Serenity" theme.

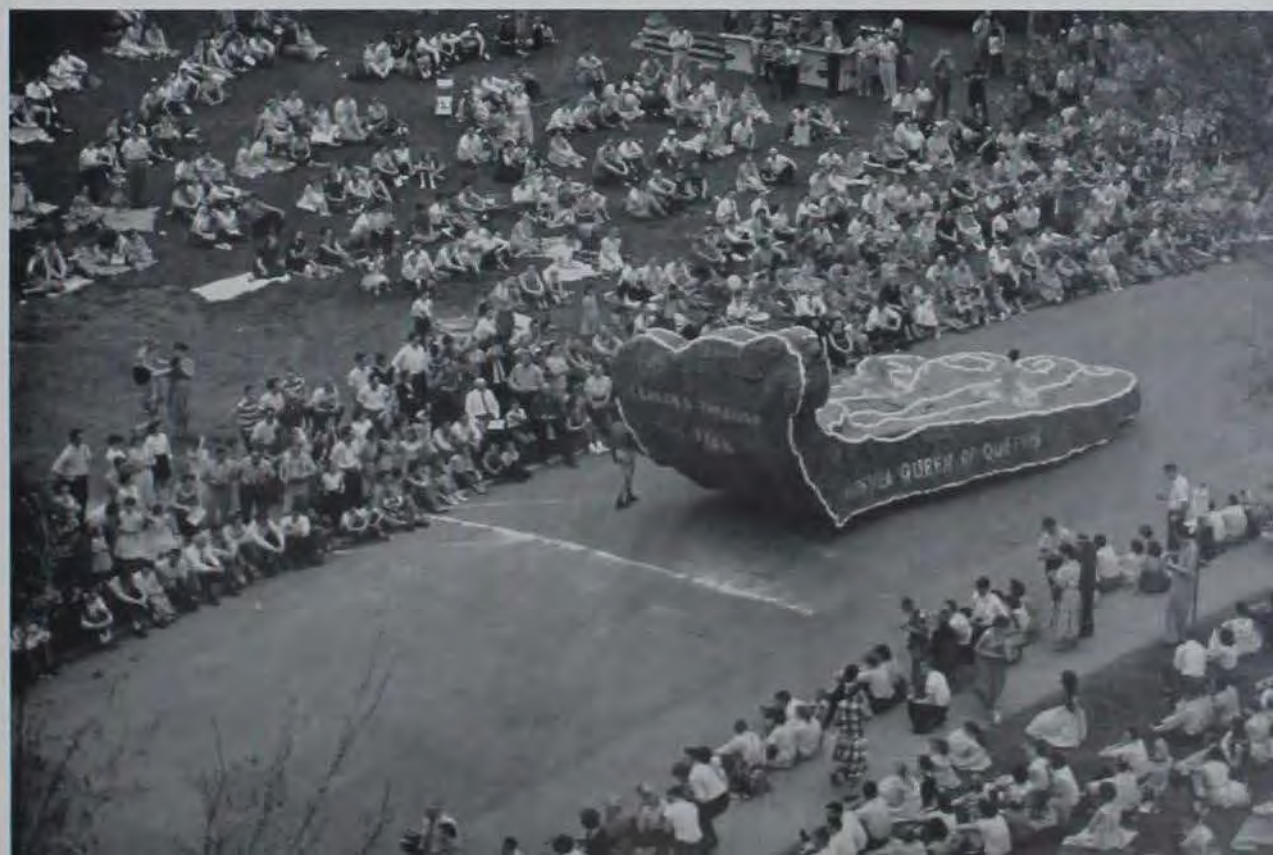

Concert Band

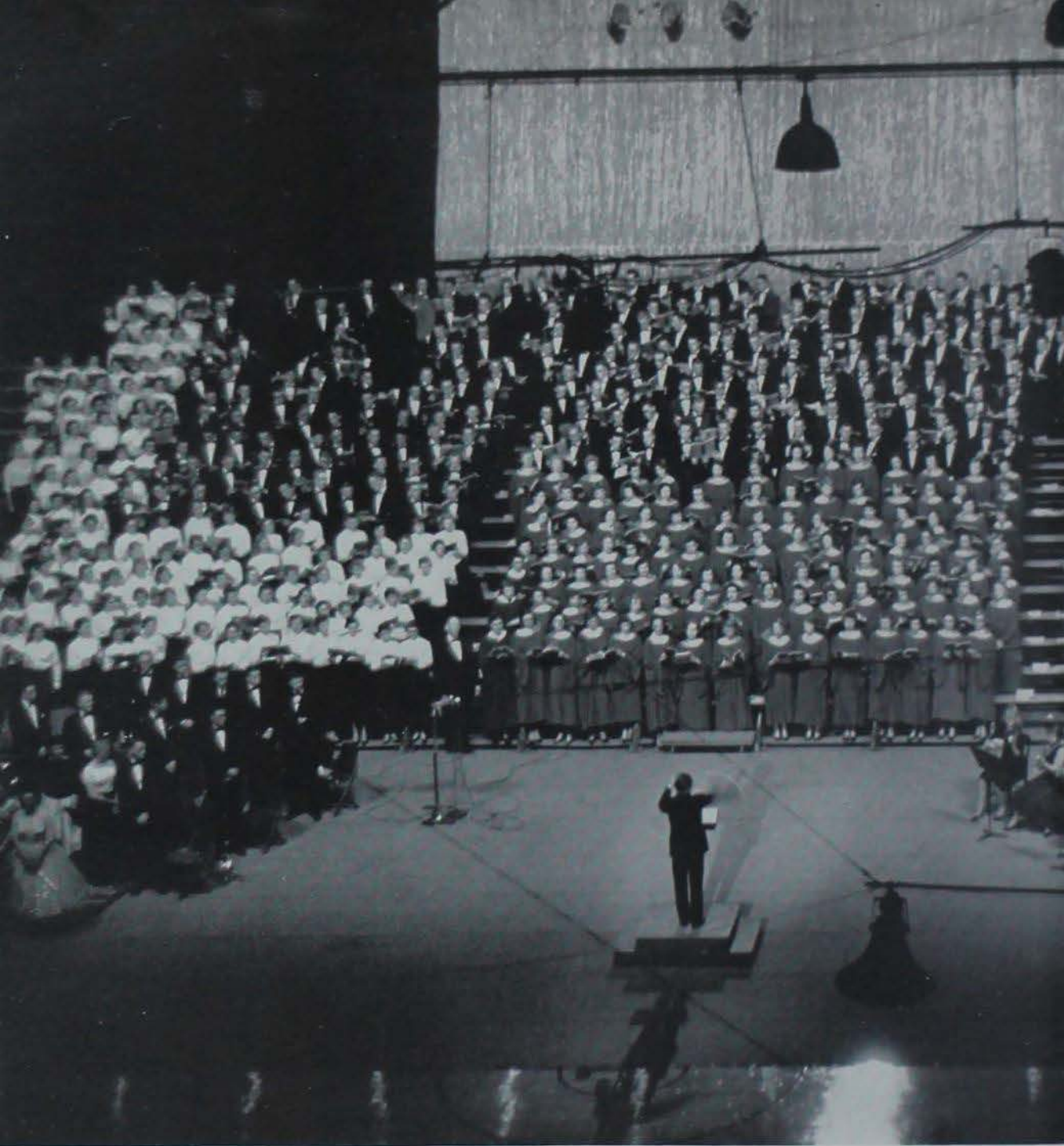

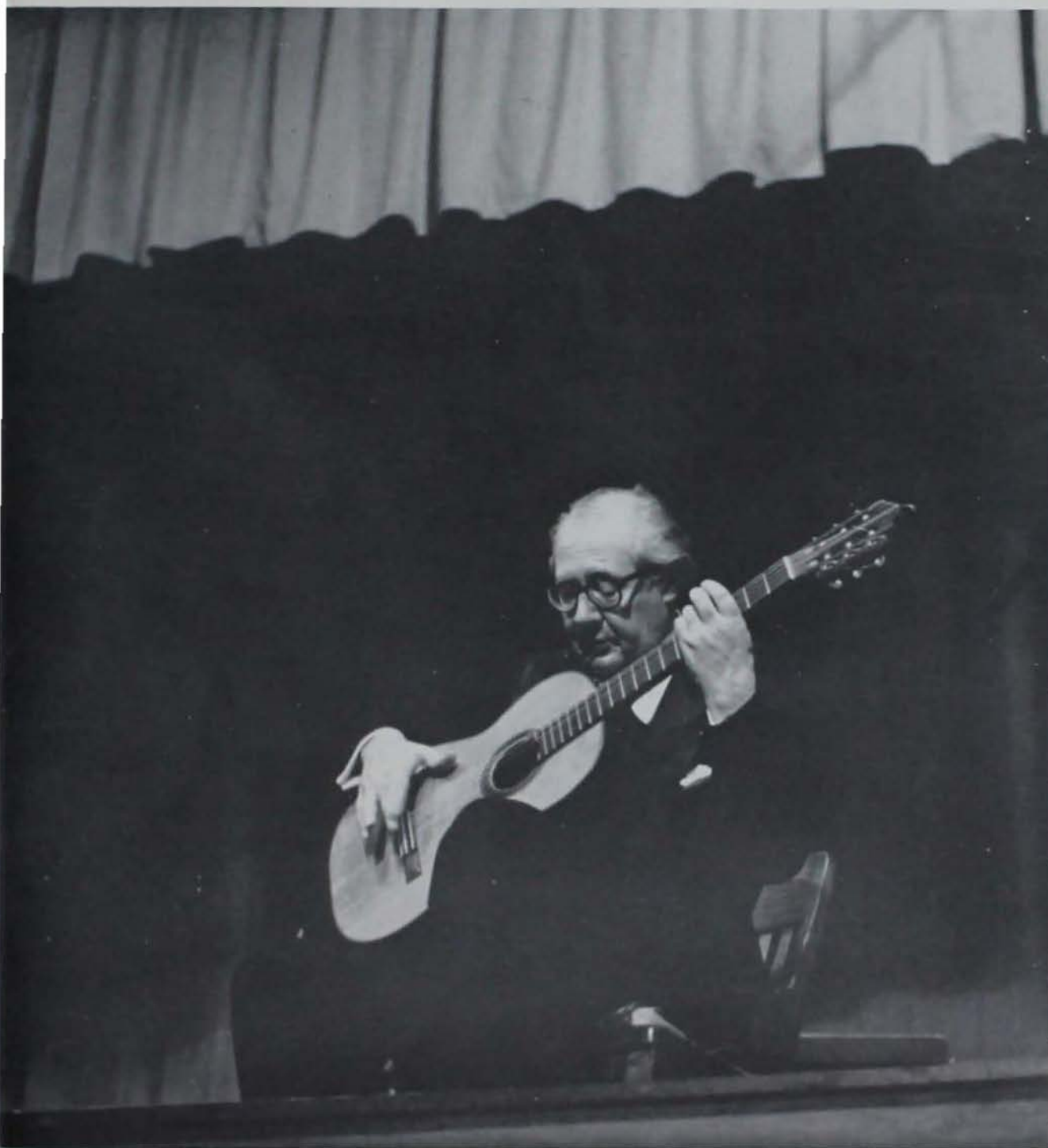

The Cyclone's Greatest Year

It was a year of moments for ISC's 1956-57 cagers. Moments such as that in the Kansas game when Don Medsker's last-second shot brought perhaps the sweetest single victory in Iowa State sports history . . .

. . . The moment when the gun brought victory over Kansas State in a fitting end to a storybook-type home schedule.

. . . And any one of a thousand thrilling moments when the great Gary Thompson made a classic move with the ball.

There was no conference championship and no tournament trophies in 1957 — just enough excitement to fill three ordinary years. On their way to a glittering 16-7 season mark, the Cyclones took part in some of the most hair-raising finishes imaginable. Yes, it was a year of moments — the year when Iowa State beyond a doubt passed the point of respectability in the cage sport.

Our First All-American

The part graduating Gary Thompson played in ISC's rise to basketball respectability can hardly be overstated. He was three-times all-conference, once most valuable player in the conference, owner of 32 school records, and named to four all-American first team berths. Writers used literally tens of thousands of words in describing Thompson's fantastic prep and collegiate career. But one not-so-cold statistic can tell as much — he scored in double figures in his last 55 college games!

From darling of Iowa high school basketball in 1950 to darling of Midwestern college basketball in 1957 — that's Gary Thompson, Iowa State's first all-American basketball player.

Honors came Bill Strannigan's way, too, in 1957. He upped his astounding won-lost success at Iowa State to 45-22 for three seasons, ran third in wire service voting for national coach of the year, and was selected to coach the West All-Stars in a post-season show at Kansas City.

It would appear that Bill Strannigan has done a good deal more than anyone expected of him here in three short seasons, but the resourceful Scotsman has other ideas. At season's end he ignored attractive job offers elsewhere in favor of facing up to another crack at the elusive Big Seven championship. Next year — minus all-American Gary Thompson and Chuck Vogt — he'll pursue his dream with the added obstacle of the toughest non-conference schedule in the school's history.

Michigan State

This most colorful of all Cyclone cage seasons opened in spectacular fashion—with a 60-53 triumph over Michigan State's Big Ten champions-to-be at East Lansing. Gary Thompson's 21 points made the difference in a good opening-game performance by the Cyclones.

Houston

Defending Missouri Valley Conference champion Houston fell next, as Thompson rang up 35 points to lead a 92-73 rout. It was the first game played in ISC's remodeled Armory.

Brigham Young

Always-tough Brigham Young yielded 57-48 in a close game at Ames next. The visitors led at half-time.

Texas Tech, Tulsa

A swing through the Southwest then brought victories over Texas Tech and Tulsa as young John Krocheski and steady Lyle Frahm came through to keep a sputtering ISC offense going. The Cyclones barely survived at Tech, 63-62, but swamped Tulsa, 72-52.

Wyoming

The Christmas vacation game in Ames was heartening as Bill Strannigan and crew prevailed over Strannigan's alma mater, 85-57. The Cyclones hit 52% and 12 men entered scoring in an impressive show of balance.

Conference Tournament

Off to Kansas City and the site of the previous season's surprising success Iowa State ran headlong into Kansas and the touted Wilt Chamberlain. Iowa State jolted the basketball world by limiting Chamberlain to 12 points, but Gene Elstun's last-second jump shot gave the national poll leaders a 58-57 win.

Iowa State turned in good performances in the consolation bracket of the holiday tournament, whipping Kansas State 74-64 and Nebraska, 89-69.

Missouri

Then the previous season's letdown pattern



took hold and mediocre Missouri fought hard to snatch the first of their two upset wins over the Cyclones, 77-59 at Columbia. For the second year in a row Iowa State was in an early hole in conference running.

Oklahoma

Iowa State came home then to post one of its best-played victories of the year, 74-54 over improved Oklahoma. Again it was Thompson leading the way, this time with 23 points.

But each good offensive show by the Cyclones was being offset by a bad one, and as the conference race thickened now, the team blew hot and cold against loop opposition.

Drake

Still feeling the sting of the Missouri upset, the Cardinal and Gold tore into Drake with a vengeance, 97-71, at Des Moines. Gary Thompson and John Crawford tallied 27 and 24 points, respectively, and the club's fast break had never been better.

Kansas

This second encounter between the Jayhawks and Cyclones sent 9,000 ISC fans away limp with excitement and happiness. Trailing by two points at halftime, the Cardinal and Gold used an air-tight defense and just plain persistence to win, 39-37.

Oklahoma

The Cyclones ignored a slow start and went on to one of their smoothest performances in topping Oklahoma, 74-54. Thompson's 23 points led the way to the eleventh win of the season.

Missouri

Then it was Missouri again and bitter disappointment again. Thompson's 27 points was not enough to prevent 69-66 defeat in an overtime.

Oklahoma

Their hopes jolted in the conference race now, the Cyclones relaxed for an unexpectedly easy 67-57 win over Oklahoma at Norman.

Kansas

The rubber game of the great Kansas series was a good deal tighter than the 75-64 score in favor of Kansas indicated. Loss of big men Don Medsker and John Krocheski by fouls spelled the difference — but for the third time in three games ISC held the fabulous Wilt Chamberlain to less than 20 points.

Colorado

Persistent Colorado came back from a 10-point halftime deficit, but the slightly-stale Cyclones held on for a 72-71 win. Balance scoring told the story with Lyle Frahm and Chuck Vogt each contributing 18.

Drake

Seniors Thompson and Vogt were on the mark in this game. Their combined total from the floor was 23 goals in 37 shots. Gary hit for 31 points and Chuck 24 to lead the 92-71 rout.

Colorado

Sheer hustle and fight brought Colorado an upset prize this time at Boulder, 59-53.

Nebraska

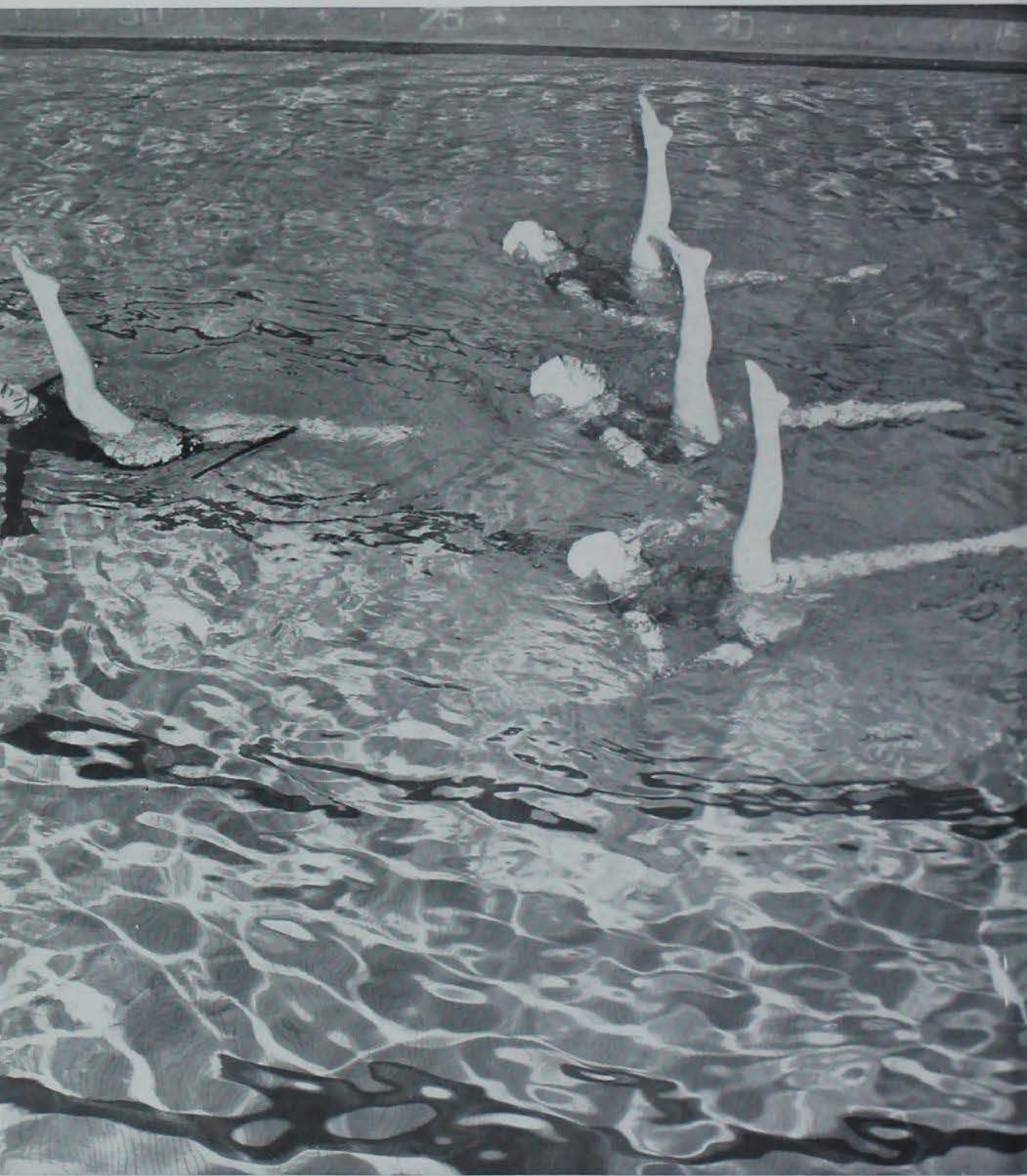
Five of the first six games went into the records as defeats for ISG, but the fast-learning Cyclones then came on to take eight of their next ten contests for a fifth-place conference finish.

The Cyclones fielded a young infield that came to be known as one of the best in the loop by season's end. Arnie Gaarde at third base was the only senior in that unit, with Gary Thompson at shortstop, Jack Taylor at second base and sophomore Jerry McNertney at first base. Behind the plate was junior Dick Bertell, named after the season to a second-team berth on the All-American. Bertell's .328 batting average was tops in a lineup of consistent hitters. Outfielders Dan Peters, Doc Brink and Jerry Steiert furnished much of the punch at the plate. Sophomore Gene Lafferty led pitchers with a 3-0 won-lost record, and along with Gary Black (4-5) carried the hurling load.

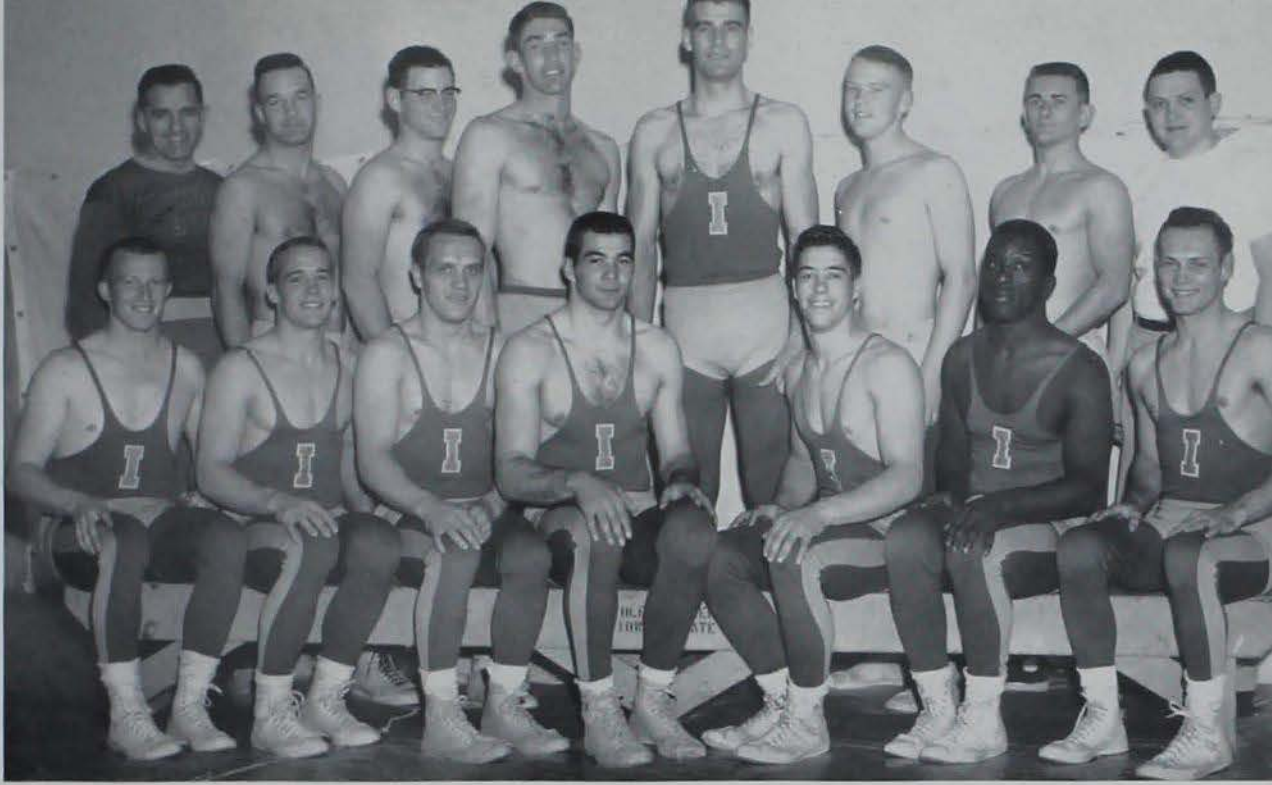

Cyclone Wrestlers Finish Third In National Meet at Pittsburgh

Iowa State's 1957 wrestling team waded through the toughest kind of competition to a 9-3-1 record — and a third-place finish in the national meet at Pittsburgh.

The regular season was highlighted by a 13-13 tie with Oklahoma A and M, year-in and year-out the biggest name in collegiate wrestling. This was the stage-setter for the NCAA competition, where the Cyclones edged out the Aggies once again, finishing behind Oklahoma and Pitt in the standings.

Coach Harold Nichols' crew was paced by unbeaten Frank Powell (14 wins) and sophomore Ron Gray (11). Gray went on to a second-place showing in the nationals. Gene Frank, Dean Corner and Dale Ketelson covered themselves with glory, too, by taking third places in their respective weights in the NCAA affair. Gray was the only conference champ.

Loaded down with sophomores and juniors, Coach Harold Nichols set his sights on the national championship in '58 or '59.

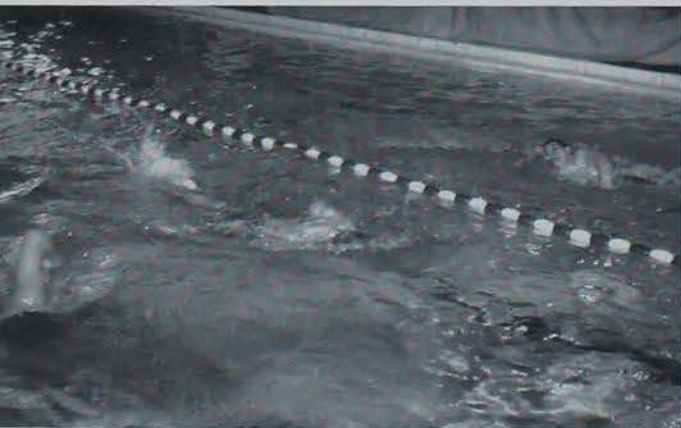

Still, the Cyclones came away from their usual tough schedule with four wins, three losses, and second place in the conference meet.

Fewer than a dozen men placed consistently in dual-meet competition. Ron Mlnarik was the standout, scoring 55½ points for his team and walking off with the Big Seven title in the 100-yard breast stroke. He took a first place in five of the seven meets.

Dale Wassmuth combined with Jim DeYoung to form the conference's best one-two punch in the diving event. Wassmuth was Big Seven one-meter champ, and in five of the seven dual meets, Wassmuth and DeYoung took first and second places.

Lack of numbers showed up in lopsided setbacks to Oklahoma and Michigan, two of the nation's top teams. The loss to Oklahoma was the first one to a loop Joe in the home pool in more than 20 years.

Cyclone Gridders Lose Eight Games and Coach in Rough 1956 Season

Iowa State lost eight football games and its coach in 1956, all true to the form of modern ISC football.

The story of this season is the story of the first three games — at Denver, at Nebraska and at Northwestern. A frantic rally brought victory at Denver, but dramatic one and two-point losses at Nebraska and Northwestern broke Cyclone spirit and set the stage for complete collapse.

Physically, this Iowa State team lacked in speed — and next to desire, there is probably nothing so important as speed in modern-day football. It was a lack which showed signs of being overcome by desire early in the season, but which eventually spelled failure for the Cardinal and Gold.

The home crowds didn't see the best efforts of their team because they were made in the above-mentioned road games. The Northwestern and Nebraska losses were by the narrowest of margins, and neither was decided until less than two minutes remained. The Cyclones were a touted defensive unit in the early stages of the campaign, but the early-season disappointments and failure of the offense seemed to take the starch out of Cyclone tackling, too.

While the struggle on the field wasn't overly-encouraging, the show of spirit in the east stands was a different story. Student attendance was good, and so was the pep generated.

Good breaks from the weatherman and outstanding performances by Dr. Frank Piersol's great marching band and the student card section made for perfect football afternoons, despite meager success by the team.

Jim Myers became the new Cyclone head late in the winter. He brought with him a UCLA-bred tan, a strong belief in the old single-wing attack, a young and reputable coaching staff, and a great love for winning.

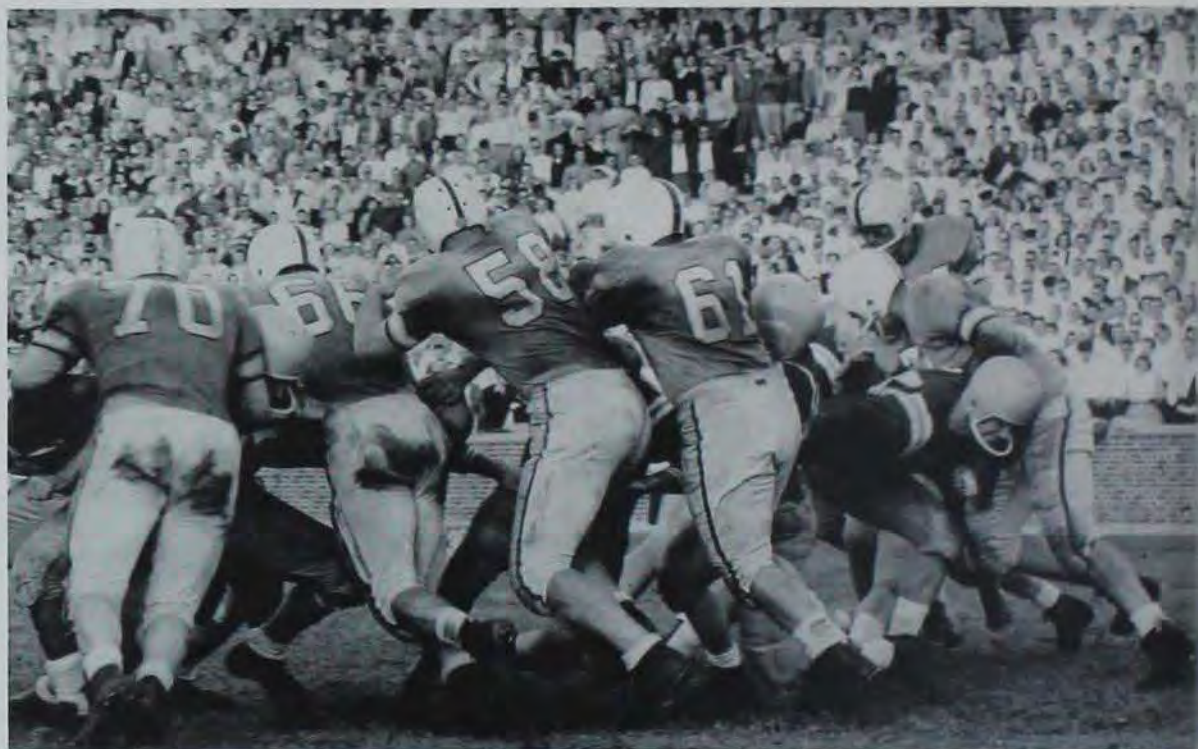


Head Coach Vince DiFrancesca looks glum as season progresses.

His legacy here is one ridiculous excuse for a football stadium, one respected freshman coach in Arch Steel, a hint of some backfield speed up from the 1956 freshman squad, and oh yes, one losing tradition — perhaps the biggest obstacle of all.

Denver

Perhaps one of the physically-toughest games of the season for Iowa State, this one gave hope of better things for the Cardinal and Gold. The Cyclones took Denver to the point of exhaustion with a grinding ground offense, then scored the winning points with only seconds to go in the game against the Pioneers' helpless defenses. The field goal, twice a cause for defeat the previous season, almost turned the trick again as Denver tallied on a three-pointer midway in the last quarter. But the Cyclones surged back with

a final slashing drive of some 60 yards to send Chuck Latting over for the winning touchdown with little more than a minute left. Sophomore Bob Harden scored first for Iowa State and the Cyclones had a 13-10 success to start off their season.

Northwestern

The fumble reared its ugly head to thwart Iowa State's effort for a major upset before 35,000 at Evanston, Ill. The Wildcats, destined to become the Big Ten's surprise team, carried a 14-0 lead into the fourth quarter, only to see it melt before the onslaught of the Cyclones. Chuck Latting carried to paydirt twice on twisting runs of 38 and 15 yards, but his fumble deep in Northwestern territory at the end of the game ended Cyclone hopes. Northwestern 14, ISC 13.

Nebraska

Nebraska used a field goal for the second straight year to maintain its jinx over the Cyclones. Iowa State scored in spectacular fashion in the opening minutes when fullback Marv Walter snatched a fumble from the air and rambled 56 yards to seven points. Don Brown's harrowing 76-yard run in the third period brought the Huskers within 7-6 and set the stage for a finish that thrilled 35,000 watchers — including Cyclone migration followers. Iowa State still owned that 7-6 lead — and the ball — when a stray pitchout was booted back to the ISC 15 and recovered by Nebraska with just four minutes left. The Huskers pushed to a first down on the two, but a tremendous ISC defensive effort shoved them back to the four or fourth down. Barely a minute remained when

George Harshman sent a place-kick sailing through the uprights.

Colorado

No less opportune time could have been picked for the Cyclones to make their home debut, as they made their poorest showing of the year. Homecomers who'd been encouraged by the team's fight in opening games saw the Cyclones in a complete collapse as Colorado rolled, 52-0. The future Orange Bowl champ Buffaloes unleashed tremendous single-wing power to score at will.

Kansas

A fourth-quarter cave-in gave Kansas a hard-earned 25-14 decision in this one. The Cyclones held a 14-13 lead going into the last period, but fell before a surprisingly-effective Jayhawk passing attack. The last KU tally came in the game's final seconds when ISC took a futile gamble deep in their own territory.

Missouri

The once-confident Cyclones were by this time riddled by injury, plagued by fumbles, and in a word beaten. Coach DiFrancesca was making wholesale lineup changes, working his squad late in practices. At Columbia, Iowa State flashed its old defensive prowess to hold MU scoreless for two quarters, then the Tigers ran roughshod for a 32-0 win.

Drake

Never quite ready to give in, Iowa State made its swan-song in spectacular fashion in winning from Drake, 39-14. Perked up by modest success in their building program, the Bulldogs came to Ames keyed for a great effort, but couldn't come near to coping with the fury of the Cyclones. Sophomore Bob Harden thrilled the home crowd with touchdown runs of 66 and 73 yards to highlight ISC's best offensive show.

Oklahoma

For all the failures of the 1956 season, Iowa

State could still say that they played mighty Oklahoma as close as did Notre Dame and Michigan State. The score was 44-0. Though the nation's top-ranked team used its name players for very nearly the complete game, the Sooners could do no better than two touchdowns in the second half against the dogged Cyclones.

Kansas State

Iowa State scored first on a Bob Harden run before Kansas State rambled, 32-6. This was not an outstanding K-State outfit, but Iowa State fumbles and Wildcat passing success proved the difference.

Villanova

A young Villanova team with great size and homecoming backing slapped down ISC in Philadelphia, 27-0. It was the last game for nine Cyclones. The easterners ground to their scores with long sustained drives and stopped several serious Cyclone thrusts. Fred Rippel was outstanding in his last game for the Cyclones.

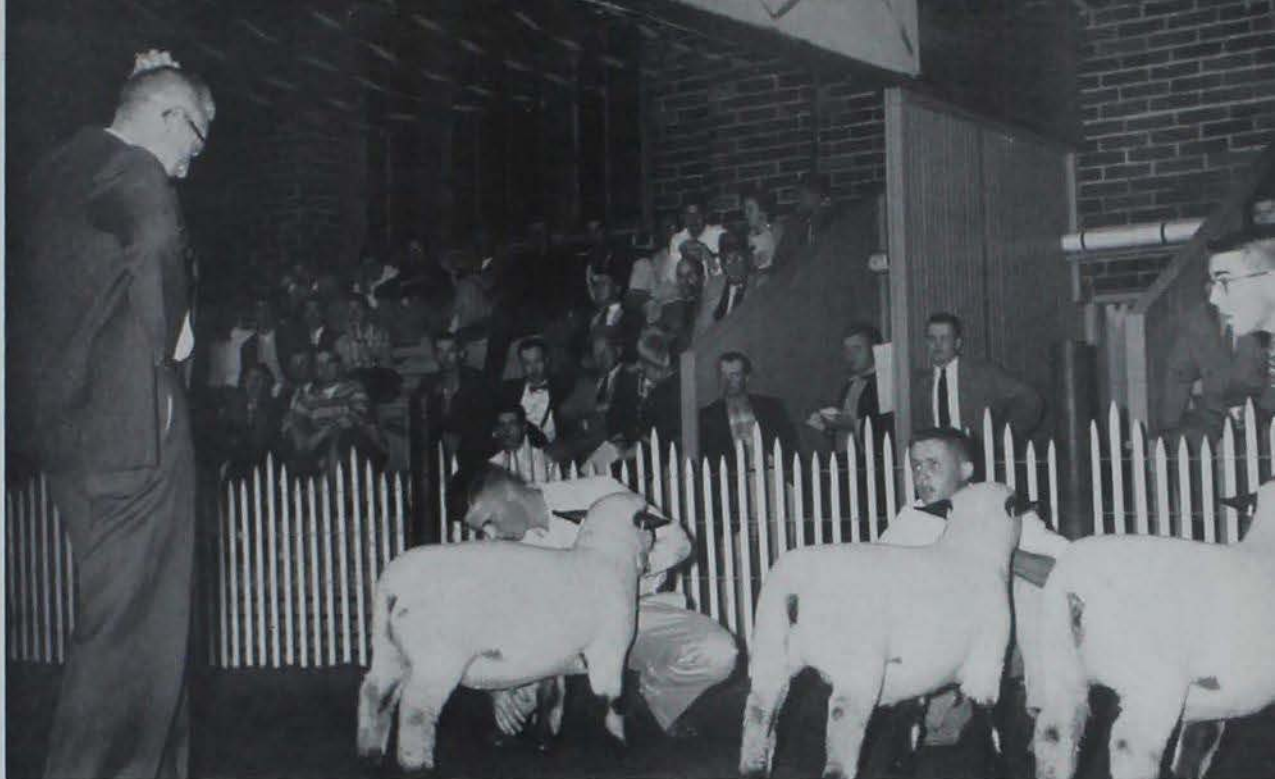




Block and Bridle

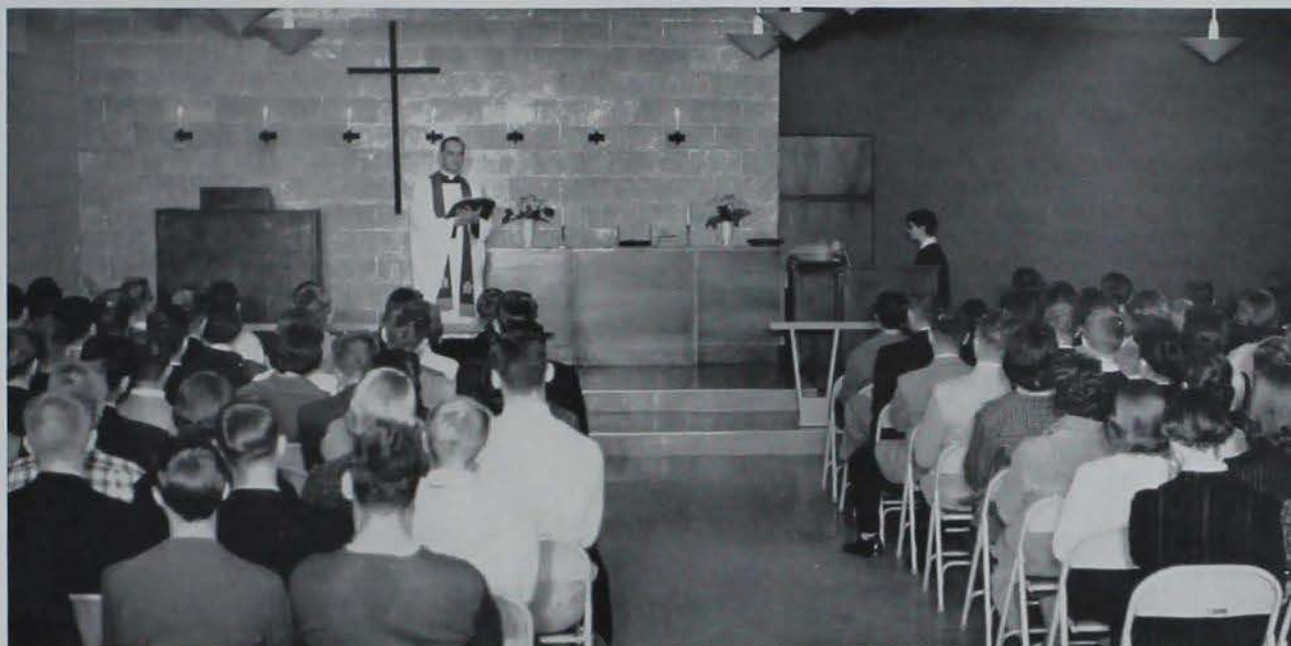

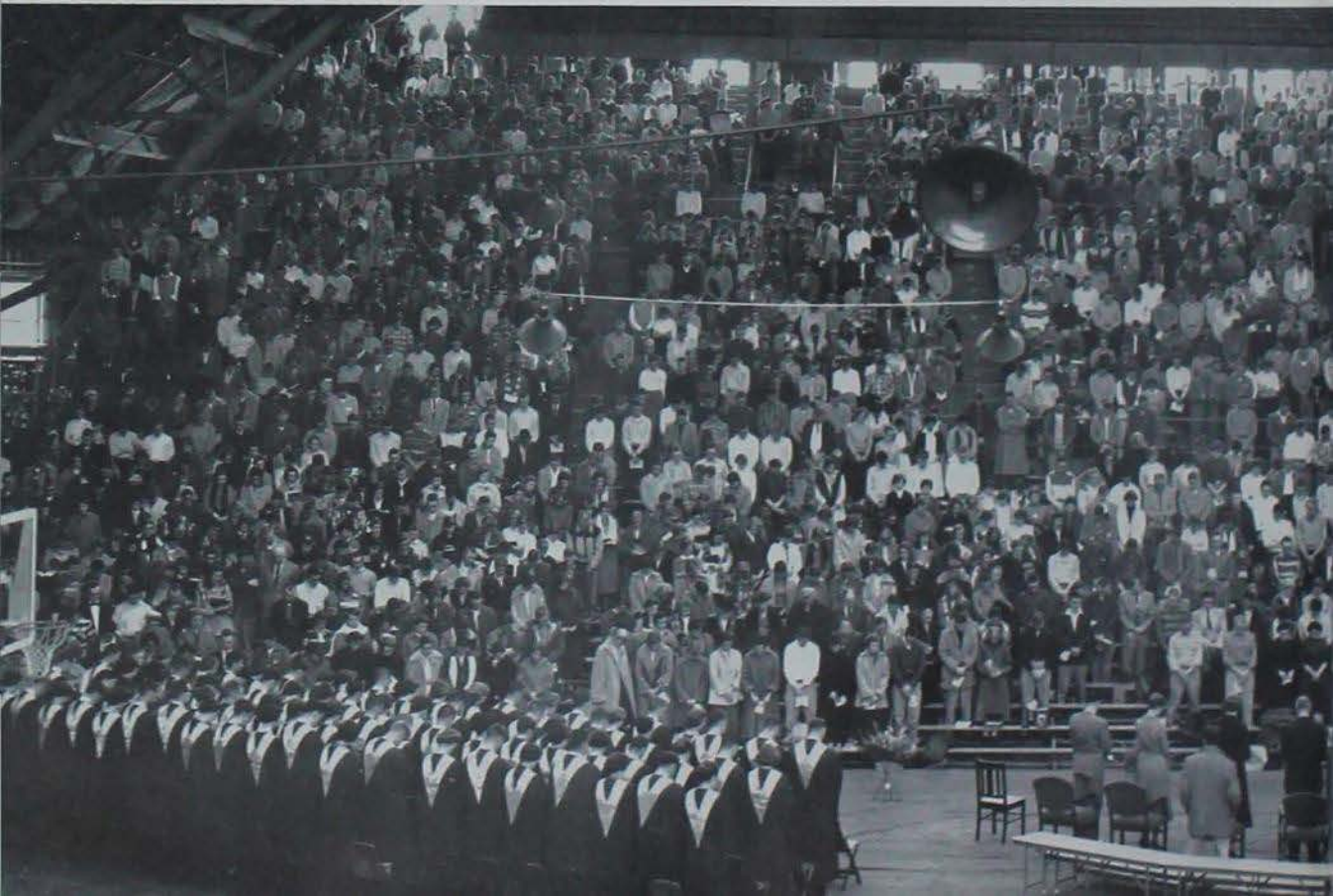

Frisbie Fellowship

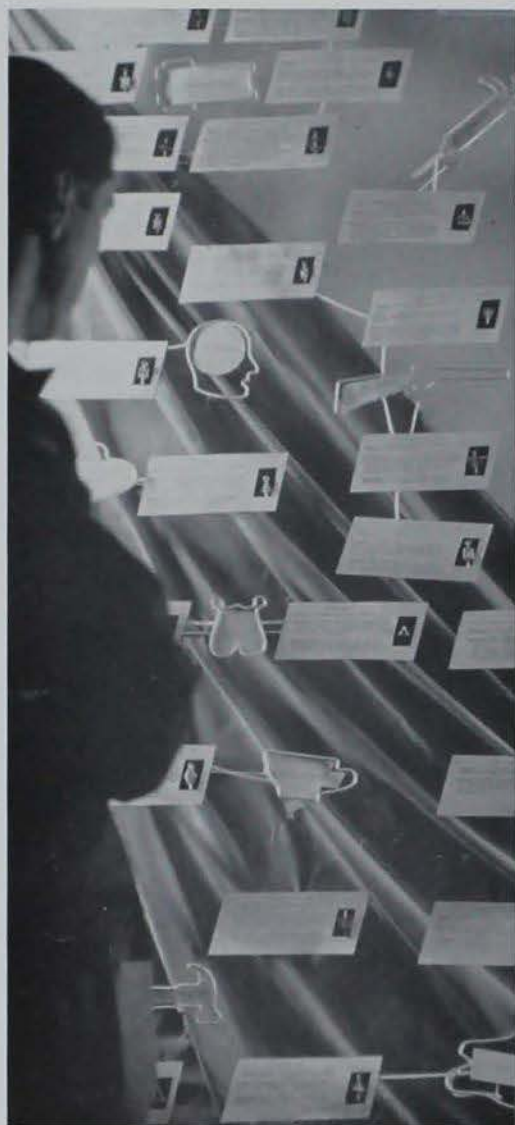

The size of the book is the same. The rich brown cover with its dark red shield is a futuristic old style — half new, half old. The inside has also taken on quite a different look. A much freer layout has been adapted by using modern typefaces and more white space. The use of line-for-line italic gives a more modern appearance and contrast to the traditional Garamond headlines. The uneven lines of copy makes it more a part of the page instead of just another block. Pictures dominate the book for they are more descriptive of what this book represents. Faces and scenes are remembered longer than words.

Approximately \$40,000 is needed each year to publish the Bomb and so the business staff has its work cut out before the book is actually created. For the 1957 Bomb, the staff started in Spring, 1956, to send out page contracts to every residence and organization on campus. From the return of these contracts, the size of the Bomb is determined. Book sales are another source of funds. Freshmen and sophomores pay for their book; juniors and seniors receive theirs free. In addition to sales, an allocation is given from the activity fees. The business staff is also responsible for Cardinal Cuts, 45 rpm records of events that take place on the campus during the year, and distribution, both on the campus and through the mail.

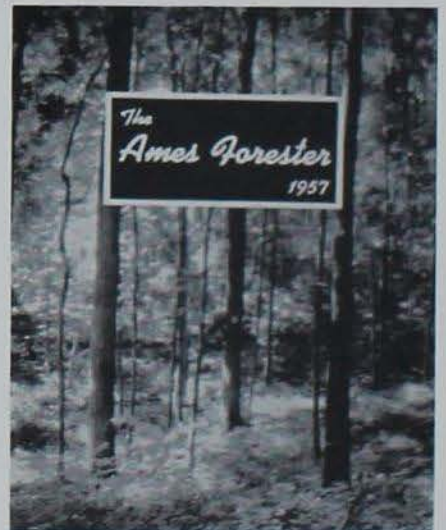

Ames Forester

A staff of approximately 20 forestry students, publish annually the Ames Forester, the only Iowa State departmental publication. The first publication was in 1913. Seven hundred fifty copies of the 1957 issue were distributed to forestry students, alumni of the department, forestry schools and regional libraries. Copies were also sent to 30 foreign countries. The Forester is considered both a technical digest and an annual. It contains articles dealing with forestry and related subjects, with each issue running about 84 pages. Some of the stories include department activities, summer camp information, and technical articles written by professors of the department. A large portion of the magazine is devoted to features concerning alumni activities, such as a map showing where the alumni live, describing their present businesses and an Alumni of the Year Award.

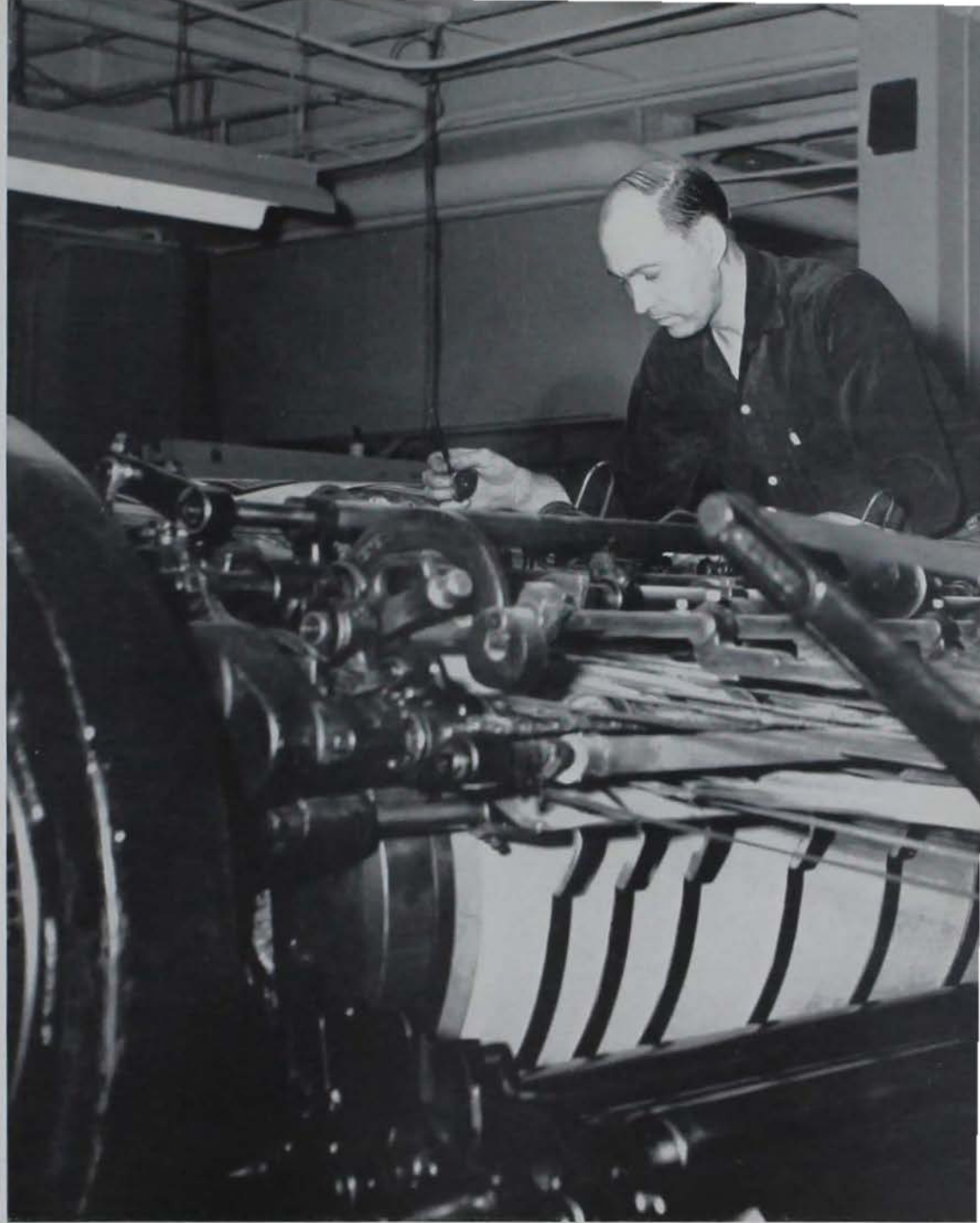
Veterinarian
