

2003 VEISHEA PARADE

Since the first VEISHEA celebration in1922, the VEISHEA Parade has been arguably the most beloved event of the VEISHEA weekend. For many ISU families it is a long-standing tradition to attend the parade that travels through the heart of campus. Each year the parade attracts an average crowd of more than 75,000 people from its beginning on Pammel Drive to its culmination in front of the Memorial Union. From balloons to floats and clowns, the parade can be quite the viewing experience for people of all ages.

There is much more to the VEISHEA Parade than meets the eye. VEISHEA's 81st parade truly lives up to the theme "lowa State on Display," as it represents and displays the dedication, commitment and teamwork of lowa State students. More than 40 students have devoted countless hours since last October ensuring that this year's parade will be a success. Additionally, hundreds of students worked an average of 3,000 hours in the planning and creation of each unit.

Preparations for the parade occur hours before the crowd starts to gather on campus. Staging takes place nearly ten hours prior to the scheduled step-off time. At 1 a.m. on Friday morning, Lincoln Way, as well as other streets around campus, are closed to make room for the giant floats to move into parade order.

The VEISHEA Parade would not be as diverse as it is without the help of a variety of local and campus organizations that display their talents through their entries. The 2003 VEISHEA Parade features five traditional floats, 13 non-traditional floats and five balloons. Balloons such as Curious George and Odie come to life under the control of members from sponsoring organizations. In addition to the work preparing for the parade, each animated float has ten to fifteen people underneath helping to bring the characters to life, while a non-traditional float is usually pulled behind a vehicle.


The Parade Committee is thrilled to welcome Iowa State University's 12th president, Dr. Gordon Eaton, as the 2003 Parade Grand Marshal.

Parade Grand Marshal



Dr. Gordon Eaton

VEISHEA is proud to welcome back Gordon P. Eaton, Iowa State's 12th president. Eaton served ISU as president from 1986 until 1990 when he accepted a position as the director of the Lamont-Doherty Geological Observatory of Columbia University.

Before coming to Iowa State, Eaton was the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at Texas A&M University from 1983-1986. From 1981-1983 he oversaw the departments of geology, geophysics,

meteorology, oceanography and geography as the dean of the College of Geosciences at Texas A&M.

Eaton spent much of his professional career establishing a distinguished background in the sciences, particularly in geology and geophysics, before taking on the presidency at lowa State. From 1967 to 1981, he was with the U.S. Geological Survey, serving in several administrative and scientific positions. While with the survey, Eaton studied mineral and ground water resources in Arizona, New Mexico and Colorado, and was scientist-in-charge of the Hawaiian Volcano Observatory.

Eaton has also taught at Wesleyan University, Middleton, Conn., and the University of California, Riverside.

He received the B.A. in geology from Wesleyan University in 1951. He received the M.S. in geology in 1953 and the Ph.D. in geology and geophysics in 1957 from the California Institute of Technology, Pasadena.

During Eaton's four years at lowa State, his administration saw greatly enhanced faculty salaries, significant increases in support for research, improvement in undergraduate education and establishment of ongoing strategic planning.

In addition to being Grand Marshal for the VEISHEA 2003, Eaton will be presented with the honor of a building on campus named after him. Eaton Hall is the new residence hall located in the Union Drive neighborhood.

Vance D. Coffman

Vance D. Coffman is Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer of Lockheed Martin Corporation. Dr. Coffman has served in a series of elected corporate leadership positions, including President and Chief Operating Officer and Executive Vice President. He previously was President and Chief Operating Officer of Lockheed Martin's Space and Strategic Missiles Sector. Born in Kinross, Iowa, Dr. Coffman earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Aerospace Engineering from Iowa State University and Master and Doctoral degrees in Aeronautics and Astronautics from Stanford University.

Pete Englin

Pete Englin is the ISU Dean of Students. Dr. Englin has worked at ISU since 1989, formerly with the Department of Residence and now in the Dean of Students Office. Originally from Minneapolis, Minn., he completed his B.S. and M.S. at North Dakota State University. The completion of his Ph.D. in hotel, restaurant and institution management/family and consumer sciences education at ISU is one of Dr. Englin's most recent accomplishments. He is married to Becky Englin and has a daughter, Kelsey, and a son, Matthew.

Gregory L. Geoffroy

Gregory L. Geoffroy is completing his second year as President of Iowa State University. Dr. Geoffroy is committed to strengthening the excellence of the University, to fulfilling ISU's strategic plan of learning, discovery, and engagement, and to having the university continue to help improve the quality of life and assist economic development efforts for all Iowans. Previously, Geoffroy served as chief academic officer at the University of Maryland, College Park, and as dean, department chair and chemistry professor at the Pennsylvania State University. A nationally acclaimed researcher in organometallic chemistry, Geoffroy has published widely and has received many prestigious fellowships andvisiting professorships. Geoffroy earned a B.S. with Honors from the University of Louisville in 1968 and his Ph.D. in 1974 from the California Institute of Technology.

Thomas L. Hill

Thomas Hill assumed the duties of Vice President for Student Affairs at ISU on Aug. 1, 1997. He came to ISU from the University of Florida, where he had been Dean for Student Services. Prior to Florida, Dr. Hill had served as assistant athletic director for student life at Tulane University and the University of Oklahoma. He earned his Ph.D. in counselor education from the University of Florida and has written articles on student-athlete development and minority identity development. Before pursuing a career in higher education, Dr. Hill excelled on athletic fields. He was twice named Arkansas Amateur Athlete of the Year and inducted into both the Arkansas Track and Field Hall of Fame and the Arkansas Sports Hall of Fame. He competed in the 110-meter high hurdles in the 1972 Olympics in Munich and won the bronze medal.

Jeff Johnson

Jeff Johnson was named president of the Iowa State Alumni Association in 1999. He oversees all Association programs, is secretary to the Stanton Memorial Carillon Foundation, publisher of all Association publications, an exofficio member and officer to the Alumni Association Board of Directors and the Association's liaison to the President's Cabinet, the university and its affiliate with organizations.

Ted Tedesco



During the wartime years of 1943-45, special war shows were presented as part of Stars Over VEISHEA. After the war, SOV returned to musicals and comedies and has remained a true highlight of the VEISHEA celebration. Recent productions have included *Anything Goes, The Music Man, Into the Woods, Oklahoma!* and *Grease!*


