Campus Services

Speakers Bureau:

The longest running LGBT-related program at ISU, the Speakers Bureau offers panel discussions and individual presentations organized by the LGBTSS staff. LGBT persons and allies share their own experiences, tell coming-out stories, and present on a vast array of LGBT issues.

Safe Zone Program:

The "Safe Zone" sticker, seen on hundreds of college campuses, sends an important message to lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) students, faculty, staff and their allies. This message is one of understanding, nonjudgment and knowledge of LGBT persons' needs and concerns. It is symbolic of a willingness and commitment to provide an atmosphere of unqualified acceptance and assistance. The Safe Zone Sticker Project at ISU is an initiative of the Dean of Students Office and administered by LGBTSS.

Forums:

Informational gatherings to discuss current issues such as the "Out to Lunch" forums which include presentations over the noon hour on areas of interest.

Special Events:

LGBTSS sponsors several special events during the year. The two largest events are Small Victories where several awards and a scholarship are presented and Lavender Graduation where we recognize our LGBT and ally graduates.
