My dear Dr. Foster:

To reserve a room in one of our women's residences for your daughter, Lorrie Anne, please have her fill out the enclosed information card and return it with a \$10 deposit. If you send a check, please add 5¢ for exchange. Later, if she finds she cannot come to Iowa State College and notifies us two weeks before the quarter opens, her deposit will be refunded.

We are now housing the majority of our women students in the fraternity houses adjacent to the campus because the Army and Navy have been occupying all of our dormitories; however, Elm and Oak Halls were released to us at the beginning of the spring quarter and are now occupied by upper-class girls. We will probably house our freshman girls on Ash Avenue next year. The Navy is occupying the freshman dormitories and probably will for the duration. The girls have been taken excellent care of though in the fraternities on Ash Avenue. The girls in no way miss college life living this way, in fact, I think they are very fond of the small groups and each one has a good housemother supervising the group. The room rent is \$35 a quarter and board will be \$6.50 per week.

Student rooms are furnished with single beds and mattresses, chest of drawers, study tables and chairs. The single beds are 56" x 76". Students are expected to furnish their own bedding, including mattress pad and pillow; also curtains, scarfs, towels, and study lamp.

We are glad that your daughter plans to come to Iowa State. If there is anything I can do to help you further, please let me know.

INFORMATION
 for
 DORMITORY RESIDENTS

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday evenings are set apart for study in all residence halls and houses. Quiet hours begin at 7:30 p.m. and last until 9:30 p.m. with no break at 10:30 p.m. Halls are to be quiet one-half hour after closing time on open nights.

During the day quiet hours are from 9:00 to 11:45 a.m., 1:00 to 4:00 p.m., to 12 noon Saturday, and to 9:30 p.m. on Sunday.

Freshmen women must be in their respective halls by 11:45 p.m. the first four school days of the week. In freshmen student rooms lights must be out by 10:30 p.m. unless by permission. All sophomore and junior women must be in their respective halls by 9:45 p.m. the first four evenings of the week.

Senior women must be in their respective halls and houses by 10:00 p.m. on the first four evenings of the week.

Women planning to be away for week ends must arrange to be in their halls by 10:30 p.m. if returning Sunday night.

Dances and other approved social functions may be attended on Friday evenings until 10:30 p.m. and on Saturday evenings until 11:30 p.m. Women must be in their houses one-half hour after the closing of social functions and 10:00 on Sunday evenings.

When a woman student is to be away from her hall any evening after 6:00 p.m. she must "Sign Out" designating the time and place.

Men callers may be entertained in the halls from 4:00 to 6:00 p.m. the first five school days of the week, and from 4:00 p.m. Friday, and from 12:00 noon Saturday.

REGISTRATION NOTICE

All students are required to have the amount payable for board registered at one of the Dining Hall lines in Great Hall during registration.

Adjustments:

Work Permit Line--For students working for all or part meals.

Scholarships Line---For students living in sororities & off campus.

Partial Payment---Where the total amount cannot be met in full or through the student loan fund, at least half of the amount should be paid at time of registration and students should have adjustments made for the remainder at the "Partial Payment" line. The entire amount deferred to be paid on or before February 10, 1945.

Please have the amount ready at the time of paying other registration fees.

Students who have their work permits approved and filed with Miss Guthrie prior to registration will have the refundable amount deducted from the Dining Hall charge. After registration, refunds will be paid at the end of each quarter.

Students working three hours or more per day are not required to pay for their meals in the Dining Halls.

Students working regular schedules for one or more meals will be refunded in full for those meals after making proper arrangements with the Food Director of Dining Halls.

RATION NOTICE

Ration books are being kept in the Halls where you live.

For the vacation period each girl may secure from her Hall Director 15 red tokens and 1 pound of sugar upon payment of 75. In case sugar was brought at the beginning of the quarter there will be no charge.

Girls not returning for the Winter Quarter may take their ration books and 2½ pounds of sugar. The charge will be 16c.


My dear Lorrie:

This letter is, first of all, to let you know from the residence side of the Iowa State College that we are happy you have chosen to come to our college. Please be free to come to our office at 104 Beardshear Hall whenever you feel we can help you.

You have been assigned to room 12 in the Sigma Alpha Epsilon house, 110 Lyon, which is one of four houses making up the Roberts Hall group where freshman girls and their upper-class advisors will live. Each house will have an experienced housemother in residence. The Roberts Hall director will coordinate and supervise the group. Your roommate will be Barbara Cummings, 350 Cottage Grove, Des Moines 11, Iowa. I know she would appreciate a letter from you.

Since the Navy V-12 men are occupying our halls for freshmen women, we have reserved the fraternity houses on Ash Avenue and on an adjacent street for Freshmen women. All dormitory women, including those living in the college controlled fraternity houses, will have their meals in our dormitory dining room near by. This will furnish them with the opportunity of becoming acquainted with those girls of their own class, and of the upper-class women as well.

The study rooms are furnished with chests of drawers, study tables and chairs. Slowing porches will make it possible for early-to-bed girls to retire at any time in the quiet and the dark. The single beds are approximately 36" x 76". Since study room space will be limited, please bring only the necessities. You will be expected to furnish your bedding, including mattress pad and pillow; also curtains, dresser scarfs and towels. I would suggest you wait until you arrive to select your study room curtains. You and your roommate will enjoy working this out together. An attractive blanket will make an acceptable spread for your bed. Please bring no electrical equipment with the exception of your study lamp and possibly a radio.

B. When you have been admitted to the registration room proceed as follows: If you are changing curriculum obtain a "Change" card signed by deans and department heads concerned. Then go to Station 1 and secure a new Matriculation Card.

Helser Announces New Hours to Start In Winter Quarter

Shattering all precedents, the college administration will yesterday day announced the new Friday nights for all Iowa State students.

According to Dean M. D. Helser of the junior college, the new late hours will take effect beginning next winter quarter.

"Cardinal Gold has asked for a later Friday night for several years," Dean Helser said, "but it was refused by the administrative board during the war because of prevailing anti-dilution."

Speaking of probable effects of the new late night, Charles Bimboch, Chairman of the All-College Board of Recreational, stated: "The great increase in approval of the new late night, it will mean a double-weekend for a bigger social program. Going more into the community." "It will now be possible to have house and organizational dances on Friday night, with regular activities including football games, on Saturday night. It will also give the students opportunity to incorporate a larger variety of activities in the over-all program."

Howard Butler, band director for Cardinal Gold's orchestra, advised, declared that the change will alleviate crowding of dances into the few Saturday nights that are open to the public, and give different groups a wider range for planning dances. He also emphasized that better orchestras could be obtained under the proposed plan, because world demand competition for bands.

ALPHA GAMMA DELTA PLEDGE RULES AND STANDARDS

1. All pledges will be required to keep library hours.
 - a. These hours will be established by the pledge mother and scholarship chairman.
 - b. The pledges will sit at the Alpha Gam table in the library and will have study slips signed by actives.
 - c. There is to be no sleeping and letter writing in the library.
 - d. In the event that a pledge cannot be present at the library during the designated hours, she should be excused by an active, preferably her pledge mother.
2. There will be no chewing gum or smoking on the campus, in the library, or in classes. Food or candy should not be brought to the library table.
3. There shall be no cutting across lawns or any campus property.
4. Pledge duties will be administered faithfully and cheerfully.
5. All sorority business is to be discussed with only those in the sorority or with pledges. Disatisfaction should be brought to your pledgemother or to the chapter council.
6. Learn as many names as possible of the actives one week after pledging, and all of the names two weeks after pledging. Call actives by given names.
7. Pledge ribbons will be worn for three days at which time formal pledging takes place. (Fall pledging is the only exception.)
8. Pledge pins are to be worn at all times--and should be placed a hand's length from the throat approximately over the heart. They should not be worn on pockets, or in any other form of decoration. They should not be worn on food uniforms.
9. All college and house rules will be observed at all times. These will be read to you at the first pledge meeting.
10. Pledges should treat the actives with respect at all times--opening and closing doors, answering telephones, emptying waste baskets, and other courtesies.
11. Personal appearance should be watched at all times. Remember that it is just as important to look at your best while in class as it is out of class.
12. All pledges will stay out of the grill every day until 5:00, and will again be out of the grill by 7:00. In the event that the average is over 2.5, this rule no longer applies.
13. No dates will be had during the week, and all girls will be required to be in their respective dormitories by 7:30 unless special permission is granted.
14. Pledges failing to comply with these study rules, will be asked to report at the chapter house on Friday evening from 7:30 - 10:30 to study.
15. Pledges are invited to spend ^{Saturday} nights at the Chapter House, but do not feel that you cannot drop over to the house at any other time, or to bring friends over, for we enjoy having them. Remember that this is your house too! We want you to help us to enjoy it and care for it.
16. These rules are planned for the benefit of the pledges and actives. Remember, we want you to be an active Alpha Gamma Delta!
